PLANNING STUDY RESULTS

WE'RE ON OUR WAY!



Thank you to the nearly 600 parishioners who shared their feedback during this summer's Parish 2030 planning study! Based on your responses, we were able to gauge parish support for building our new church and determine our overall fundraising potential. The Steier Group study found that our ability to build the church of our future is bright! With 92% of respondents aware of our parish project, a majority said they were in favor (with 68% of respondents indicating they would make a gift!)



Our Parish

Four campuses costs \$500,000 in operating expenses and \$265,000 in annual capital maintenance. With over 1,800 average weekly attendees (2,500 at holidays), and 21% growth since 2023, we must plan for a sustainable future.



Our Budget

The results of our feasibility study from Urbahn Architects indicates a budget of \$25 million will allow us to build a 1000-seat church to meet our parish's growing needs. Based on current projections, we will need to raise approximately \$10 million.



Our Objective

The Steier Group suggests that \$4 million of this goal is achievable through identified fundraising potential. The objective of the Capital Campaign is to raise the remaining funds through additional sources.



Future Vision

Our Parish's goal is to build a church environment which has **ample parking** for parishioners, as well as **single-level access for all parishioners regardless of mobility**. To this end, we have been working with the Town of Manchester to support this vision. We are now engaged with a church construction firm to begin preliminary design concepts for the building; the goal is to incorporate parishioner feedback to **tastefully integrate with the existing Saint James Campus**.



Projected Results

- One church, one community.
- \$200,000 savings in annual operating expenses.
- Nearly \$1.7 million in capital expense savings over 10 years.
- A comfortable church and community area with increased parking and accessibility.
- **Fiscally and logistically sustainable** model aligned with the Archdiocesan Transformation Initiative.
