TALK OF THE VILLAGE

We have been blessed with strong leadership and loving pastoral care from Pastor Rob Hartwell for 27 years. As we look forward to a special service and dinner on October 4 to celebrate his ministry and Sue Hartwell's partnership, it is natural to feel anxious about what comes next. God assures us that His loving presence accompanies us in all things: "Fear not, for I have redeemed you; I have summoned you by name; you are mine. When you pass through the waters, I will be with you." (Isaiah 43:1-2)

Many are inquiring about arrangements during this vacancy and the process for calling our next Senior Pastor. As a congregation, we have been blessed with strong lay leadership. Congregational President Jim Bunn, Principal Michael Schultz, the Trustees, Staff, Deacons, and many members are actively working with Associate Pastor Mark Budenholzer to ensure we maintain our momentum until we find a new Senior Pastor.

- After careful analysis and following the guidance of our Atlantic District President/Bishop, The Rev. Dr. Dien Taylor, the Trustees have identified key areas of focus that require our immediate and ongoing attention, forming six committees.
- The six areas are the Call Committee, the Farewell Celebration, the Capital Campaign, TCS/Admissions, Pastoral Care, and Finance/Operations.
- Led by the Trustees, Pastor Budenholzer, and Principal Schultz, these committees have reallocated the duties of Pastor Hartwell and are already working diligently.
- Additionally, the Trustees have secured a commitment from the Atlantic District to enlist a consulting group to help increase enrollment in The Chapel School.



Regarding the Call Process, the LCMS provides a protocol to assist congregations in identifying strengths and challenges, finding potential candidates, and discerning God's will in extending a call. Here is a general outline of the steps to be taken:

- A Call Committee has been formed and has already met several times. They have developed a plan to ensure that the voices of our congregation are heard.
- A congregational survey was conducted on September 20-21 to determine what our members value most in a Senior Pastor. The committee is grateful to all who participated, as the congregation has the ultimate say in who is called.
- The survey results will be made public, and a Ministry Description will be created based on these results with input from the Trustees.

- Bishop Taylor is in direct contact with VLC leadership. He personally met with the congregation between services on September 14 to explain the Call Process, provide guidance, and answer questions.
- Candidates will be identified by the Atlantic District and interviewed by the Call Committee. The Committee will make recommendations, after which the congregation will have an opportunity to meet the candidates and provide input.
- A final Call will be determined by Voting Members at a Voter's Meeting.
- To be a Voting Member according to our constitution and bylaws, congregants must attend at least two Voter's Meetings. The Trustees are looking to add additional Voter's Meetings to the schedule to facilitate meeting this requirement.

All of these steps will take time to come to fruition, and updates will be provided along the way. We pray for God's guidance throughout this journey, lean on Him for wisdom in carrying out the Call Process, and give thanks for all who are dedicating their time, experience, knowledge, and hearts as we discern God's gracious will for VLC.


WORSHIP/ BIBLE STUDY/PRAYER OPPORTUNITIES

FOCUS ON WORSHIP

Hidden with Christ, by Deborah Reiss

This righteousness from God comes through faith in Jesus Christ to all who believe. There is no difference, for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God, and are justified freely by His grace through the redemption that came by Christ Jesus.

(Romans 3:22-24)



We hear this familiar passage every year on Reformation Sunday, but it can still be hard to go beyond abstract legal arguments and grasp what this means for our lives. One idea that set off a lightbulb for me was to look at the way we try to make ourselves acceptable to both God and one another.

I read a New Yorker article over the summer that explained how dangerous it can be when people are perfectionists. The trouble comes from the compulsion to avoid mistakes at all costs and the anxiety that irreparable rejection will proceed when mistakes do occur. A person feels that being perfect is the only way to stay socially safe and acceptable. Ironically, the tremendous effort to be perfect often leads to less achievement; and whatever success does occur will not alleviate the fear.

Fear of failure comes in many forms. My mother says that when I was three or so, if we were listening to a record and I did not know the song, I would pick up the needle and go on to the next song rather than deal with not being able to sing the unfamiliar one. Musicians obviously try to avoid making mistakes in performance, but there are many kinds of activities and interactions that provoke anxiety about failing to live up to a perfect standard. What Paul talks about in Romans is that people try to convince themselves that they can skip over their own imperfections and find a way to make up for any mistakes that are inevitably made. The "good" will outweigh the "bad" and God will then be satisfied. The hard truth for a perfectionist is that "all have sinned and fall short." No one is perfect, and there is nothing that any one of us can do to offset the sins (mistakes) we have committed.

The Good News is that we are in fact declared by God to be acceptable (or legally "justified") because of what Jesus did for us. Jesus was the only perfect human, and His death and resurrection do make up for our failures. God does not love me because I am perfect; God makes me perfect through Christ because He already loves me. God will help me try to master temptation and overcome weakness, but when I do something that is sinful or imperfect, God asks me to recognize it, seek forgiveness, work through the consequences, and let it go.

This grace is something we can extend to one another. We all want to be accepted and loved. The psychological answer to perfectionism is that a person matters to someone else. We all matter to God, and we have the opportunity to help others be loved and accepted.



The Chancel Choir got off to a great start in September, and we look forward to adding our other ensembles to our worship life. Musical highlights for this month include the Celebration of Ministry for the Hartwell's on Saturday 10/4, our children's choirs at the Family Service on Sunday 10/19 and Reformation Sunday 10/26. MORE Exciting TECH Upgrades! Welcome to TCS Team, Ms. Lorelei Heath!




