Music and readings in honor of the birth of our Savior

Sunday, December 7, 2025 10:45 a.m.

Notes on the Service:

In medieval England it was customary for the Lord of the Manor to give a Christmas dinner for all of his servants and serfs. After the dinner, the local priest, the knights, and all of the assembly joined to worship the Christ Child by the singing of Christmas carols.

With this tradition in mind, the VLC's Round-the-Table Carol Sing was initiated in 1950 under the leadership of Doris Voester, who served as organist and Minister of Music for many years. The Carol Sing has continued as a special tradition in our church's Christmas-tide worship.

Our theme for this year reflects on the rose as a symbol for Jesus, the promised Messiah. In many cultures the rose is connected to Mary, but German Lutherans developed the idea of a rose (the word *Ros*' in German) from the prophetic image of a shoot (the word *Reis* in German) growing out of the stump of Jesse. This word play is part of our opening hymn "Lo, How a Rose" and is further represented in our altar trees. The tree of darkness has red apples, symbolizing the sin of Adam and Eve which has infected all people. The tree of light has red roses, symbolizing Jesus' incarnation as the promised Messiah, the beautiful bloom born without sin, who would overcome sin and death, and restore us to life.

In our readings and music today, we hear once again God's great promise to provide a Savior and the wonder of how it was all fulfilled in Jesus. May the hope, peace, joy and love of Christ dwell in your hearts this season and always.
