



FOCUS ON WORSHIP

Hidden with Christ, by Deborah Reiss

Any who do not carry their cross and follow me cannot be my disciple... In the same way, any of you who does not give up everything they have cannot be my disciple. (Luke 14:27, 33)



As we navigate through a time of transition in our church life, I have been thinking about all the ways that God forms us into the body of Christ. With inspiration from a devotional guide in my collection, this series will look at how we find our lives hidden with Christ.

September 14 is Holy Cross Day – an opportunity outside the usual confines of Lent to ponder what the cross represents. When Jesus talked about carrying crosses, people knew the reference meant having to haul the instrument of your own ignominious death. Though they could not conceive it at the time, Jesus would literally follow through on this commitment in order to complete the work that His heavenly Father had given Him to do on our behalf. Is Jesus really asking us to do the same?

Most of us are not asked to go on a death march, nor are we compelled to divest ourselves of all our worldly possessions. What we are confronted with is the need to freely “give up” what we have received in order to serve God by serving those around us. The task may be difficult, and the effort may prove painful, yet we cannot use that as an excuse to back away. At a rather simple level, I learned this lesson while attending my Confirmation week program at Camp Pioneer. One of the community guidelines was that you picked up any garbage you might find on the grounds, regardless of how it got there. I thought this seemed fairly absurd at first – why should I need to pick up someone else’s mess?!? But I came to appreciate how this one little activity was a beneficial way of being a disciple. There were not enough maintenance staff to pick up after a herd of heedless adolescents. Disposing of other people’s trash made you more mindful of not littering in the first place, and of cleaning up after yourself. Having to do something you would probably otherwise choose not to do was a good way to embrace servanthood. The fact that everyone was expected to participate made it less burdensome, even if there were some who did not jump at the chance. This “rule” has stayed with me.

Carrying the cross is not a martyr complex. It is a way of life that urges us to consider the cost and do it anyway. It means listening and watching for God’s direction, then following through to the best of your ability. It calls us to appreciate those who offer themselves for our benefit. It reflects the same prayer that Jesus spoke to His Father when facing the cross: “Yet not my will, but Yours be done.”

SUNDAY SCHOOL


RALLY DAY Weekend is 9/6-7.


