Team players who are **smart** work well with others, read the room, and build strong relationships. Embracing these three traits can transform any team, build trust, and increase fruitfulness. Let's take a closer look at each trait.

**HUMBLE**. Team players who are humble are open to seeking help and learning from others. They are quick to point out and appreciate the contributions of others, and slow to seek attention for themselves. They share credit, emphasize team over self, and define success collectively rather than individually.

**HUNGRY**. Team players who are hungry are always looking for more: more things to do; more to learn; more responsibility to take on. Hungry people almost never have to be pushed to work harder because they are self-motivated and dedicated. They are constantly thinking about the next step and new opportunities to grow.

**SMART.** Team players who are smart have common sense about people, dealing with others in the most effective way, and picking up on the needs and feelings of others. They have good judgment and intuition with group dynamics, and are aware of the impact of their own words and actions on others.

God has blessed Saint Luke UMC with an abundance of great team players! Team players who are humble, hungry, and smart are in every leadership position, program, and ministry at this church.






**Upper Room Weekly Devotion (Room #221/223)**


