

"I am about to do a new thing; now it springs forth, do you not perceive it? I will make a way in the wilderness and rivers in the desert." \sim Isaiah 43:19

Every year we spend a lot of time with the prophet Isaiah during the season of Advent. The prophet brings word of the coming of the Messiah and how God will bring about a change for good throughout God's creation. Although the verse cited above is not included in this year's annual Advent lectionary passages, I love the thought of God making a way where there seems to be no way ... of God doing a new thing.

Since this will be the last pastor's letter for 2025, I want to share some of the ways that God is doing new things here at Saint Luke. The past year saw 29 new members welcomed into our church family, along with the baptisms of 12 infants and children. We are scheduled to close out the year with at least one more family taking the official step into membership on December 28. God has indeed done a new thing in the lives and spiritual journeys of these new Saint Luke family members.

Along with those who made Saint Luke their official church home, we have been blessed with new faces at each of our three services. There is an excitement in the air and we are experiencing the very best kind of evangelism—individuals telling others about the good things going on at Saint Luke and personally inviting them to come and see. With a very promising 2026 Confirmation Journey scheduled to take place in the spring, I am convinced that our church will continue to see positive numerical growth (we have averaged 30 – actually 29.75 to be exact—new members annually for the past four years).

In the coming year, we expect two new physical additions to our church campus. The Trustees have approved the building of a memorial area behind the Casey Chapel. This sacred space will be used for the scattering of loved ones' ashes (often referred to as a Scatter Garden at other churches). Also, we hope to have a new quarter-mile walking trail in place before Easter. The "Walk Way" will be on the other side of our church pond. The trail will provide space for memorial trees to be planted, as well as placing benches in honor of individuals. Our preschool students and various age groups will be able to experience planting flower boxes and enjoying other outside activities. Just as our incredible playground has served as a welcoming beacon in our neighborhood, this new trail will be an additional and unique way of saying that all are welcome at our church.

These are just a few of the many scenarios in which God has been doing new things at Saint Luke. God has blessed this church abundantly. Our church family has responded faithfully by making a difference in so many ways and places. I look forward to seeing what lies ahead. As we draw to a close one year and prepare to enter the next, I do so with the confidence that God will continue to make a way. I am convinced that we will be blessed to see and experience the new things for which God is making a way.

Merry Christmas and Happy New Year to the good people of Saint Luke! Thank you again for being a difference-making church. It is truly a joy to walk alongside you.





Foundation Moment The Giff That Keeps on Giving!!


