

"While they were still talking about this, Jesus himself stood among them and said to them, 'Peace be with you.' They were startled and frightened, thinking they saw a ghost. He said to them, 'Why are you troubled, and why do doubts rise in your minds? Look at my hands and my feet. It is I myself! Touch me and see; a ghost does not have flesh and bones, as you see I have.'"

Luke 24:36-39

While we are in the midst of Advent, I'd like us to consider the resurrected Jesus for a moment. The passage of Luke 24:36-49 describes Jesus' appearance to the disciples after Jesus' resurrection. This passage is informative not just of Jesus' resurrected body, but of all of humanity's future resurrected bodies, as Jesus is the standard for the image of God on all humans. When I say that Jesus is the standard for the image of God, I am saying that because Jesus was the perfect human, Jesus and His life show how God made us to be too. Because all humans are made in the image of God, which would include Jesus. Therefore, Jesus is our template, our standard, our measuring stick, to see what being made in the image of God should look like and what it means for us in our thoughts, actions, emotions, and spiritual life. Immediately in this passage, the reader can see that Jesus' resurrected body is not the same as it was pre-resurrection. Jesus seems to simply appear among the disciples, without entering through a door or a window. Rightfully scared, Jesus' disciples think Jesus is a ghost!

However, the text shows that Jesus appeared to the disciples in a physical body. Because Jesus is the standard for the image of God, Jesus having a physical body post-resurrection is strong evidence for all humans having a physical body post-resurrection, and not just a spiritual essence. However, why does Jesus focus specifically on his "hands and feet" in showing the disciples his body? While the Lukan narrative doesn't include the details of wounds or scars on Jesus' hands and feet, it is implied that the wounds from the nails of the cross are what Jesus is showing his disciples. This means that Jesus still had some mark of the nails in his post-resurrection body, disabling his hands and feet. What is the significance of Jesus having marks on his perfected, post-resurrection body? If Jesus Christ's body is the standard for the image of God, Jesus Christ having wounds in his perfect body could indicate that humans will retain some aspects of their disability in their perfect, resurrected bodies. How might this change our idea of "perfect"? If Jesus' perfect body included disabilities, then perhaps we need to shift our idea of "perfect" and what a "perfect body" is. What if a disabled body is already perfect? What if some disabilities will remain when we are resurrected with Christ? And how should that change how we think about our bodies, disabilities, and people with disabilities today? Jesus is not recognized by his appearance, his words, or his presence, but by his disability. Overall, Luke 24:36-49, shows that Jesus has a physical body post-resurrection, and that his body had wounds from the cross. As the perfect image of God, Jesus' example leads us to believe that we will have a physical body in the resurrection, and it will bear some scars from our time on earth. In the context of advent, it is also important to note that it was through wounds that Christ was born in the labor of Mary. Jesus entered this world through wounds and Jesus left this world with wounds. What might that mean for our wounds?
















## Thurch-wide Christmas Celebration






