June 15 - 20, 2025 Red Bird Mission Work Camp

It was just a month ago (June 15) that Saint Luke's 2025 Red Bird Team returned to the mountains of eastern Kentucky to begin our current home repair project. Red Bird Mission is tucked within tall peaks in rural Kentucky—a place that increasingly feels like a home away from home. We were excited to meet other teams who would be present that week and looked forward to reconnecting with the year-round staff—many who came there in response to the Spirit's call on their lives.

While we cannot claim to be one of the longest-serving teams that return to Work Camp year-after year, we are grateful that Saint Luke has provided a consistent and reliable presence for eight years. We are also grateful that two of our team members are returning once again to serve as volunteer crew leaders. As the Mission continues to address their neighbors' critical housing needs with extremely limited resources, highly skilled volunteers

have become a necessary component in enabling this century-old ministry to fulfil its objectives. Red Bird was birthed in prayer. As we partner with those who continue to serve the people of Appalachia, we become part of God's answer to those 100-year-old prayers.

The Mission has numerous challenges in seeking to meet the basic needs of rural neighbors—financial challenges in particular. Despite the many setbacks the Mission has weathered over their long history, it remains a vital resource for those who make their home in the remote hills and "hollers" of their three-county service area. It offers an array of vital services: food assistance, medical and dental care, access to clean water, education, meals on wheels, housing repairs, and a host of other programs. The work is rooted in love of God and neighbor, and a deep understanding of the people who live amid wild beauty and extreme poverty. While on site, our team joins the Mission's efforts to be the hands and feet of Christ, offering a respectful and nonjudgmental presence. In addition to being attuned to needs beyond the parameters of our project, we can leave one family's home safer than we found it, reminding them that God knows them by name and knows just where they are.

As I write these words, various faces filter through my mind: Imogen, Elsie, Jessie, Marilyn, Kathy.... Some were timeworn and marked by hardscrabble living. Yet most were defined by an abiding faith and love of family. As we learn their stories, we are humbled by their strength and resilience. This June our homeowner was Irene, a 78-year-old woman who has dialysis three times a week and who, like so many of her generation, still bears great responsibility for her family. In addition to her many losses, her son is dying of cancer, and she is a main caregiver to a young granddaughter who is autistic. While most mountain folks are reserved, Irene was not! Her joyful presence and deep faith call to mind the unfailing trust reflected in this Scripture that was shared during staff meeting this week:

Though the fig tree does not blossom and no fruit is on the vines; though the produce of the olive fails and the fields yield no food; though the flock is cut off from the fold and there is no herd in the stalls, yet I will rejoice in the LORD; I will exult in the God of my salvation" (Habakkuk 3:17-19).

Such profound faith is an inspiration to us all and an invitation to trust God in both our present and future circumstances. As we seek to respond to Christ's call to be in ministry to our neighbors near and far—whether it be through the ARK or CUOC or some other crucial ministry—may we receive the trust and blessing of those we serve with humility and grace. And while we have our own challenges and adversity to face, may we be reminded of God's faithfulness and good intentions toward us. As for me, I often return to the reassuring words of this Scripture song based on Lamentations 3:22-23: "The steadfast love of the Lord never ceases. His mercies they never come to an end. They are new every morning; new every morning. Great is thy faithfulness, O Lord; great is they faithfulness."

And so they are ... mercies new every morning. Thanks be to God!
