The World's Most Important Sermon

When Jesus saw the crowds, he went up the mountain, and after he sat down, his disciples came to him. He began to speak and taught them, saying:

Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.

Blessed are those who mourn, for they will be comforted.

Blessed are the meek, for they will inherit the earth.

Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they will be filled.

Blessed are the merciful, for they will receive mercy.

Blessed are the pure in heart, for they will see God.

Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called children of God.

Blessed are those who are persecuted for the sake of righteousness, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.

Blessed are you when people revile you and persecute you and utter all kinds of evil against you Falsely on my account. Rejoice and be glad, for your reward is great in heaven, for in the same way they persecuted the prophets who were before you. Matthew 5:1-12

For the past six weeks the Wednesday Night Bible Study has been **The Message of Jesus** by Rev. Adam Hamilton. During week #2, our class studied the Sermon on the Mount. Adam Hamilton calls this "the world's most important sermon." This sermon serves as a road map for how followers of Jesus are to live out the kingdom of God, Jesus's driving vision. Some of Jesus's best-known and most influential teachings are found within the Sermon on the Mount.

Part of this beautiful sermon by Jesus includes the above verses known as **The Beatitudes**. The word "beatitude" comes from Latin words that signify happiness, good fortune, or blessedness. We spend a great deal of time in our lives chasing happiness. Many people picture blessedness or happiness as having wealth, beauty, popularity, or power. But, the fact is none of these actually make one happy.

In the Beatitudes, Jesus offers us a very different idea of who is blessed, who is happy, in the kingdom of God. Those who are blessed in the kingdom of God look different from what we expect. This is called the "great reversal" in the kingdom of God.

I usually begin the class with an activity or exercise that helps us focus our attention on the main topic for that session. So, for our week #2 session, I asked the class, "Using the letters in B.L.E.S.S.E.D. list ways you are blessed." After several minutes, each small group shared their thoughts. The responses I received were rich in meaning and depth, reflecting the spiritual maturity of the class. Phrases included: beauty of the earth, the Body of Christ, the Bible; the Lord, love of friends, laughter, life, light; Easter, everyone and everything, energy; our Savior, salvation, saints that came before us, sweet children and grandchildren, special friends, sun rises and sun sets, Spirit; Epiphany, our environment, education; Disciple, discernment, divinity, dear ones, devotion. What wonderful thoughts were expressed by our class members!

Friends, let us pour out ourselves to bless others who are struggling. In doing so, we become part of God's Kingdom now. The blessings we receive, we give to those in need. This is the character of life in the kingdom of God. Our task as Christians is to **close the gap** between the world as it is, and the world as it should be. We become full participants in the work of God and the ministry to which God has called each of us. May God show us ways to close the gap, and bring true happiness to a world in need.



New Class Beginning October 22!

"The God We Can Know: Exploring the "I AM" Sayings of Jesus" is a study designed to explore the "I am" sayings of Jesus found in the Gospel of John. This study is by Rob Fuquay. The DVD, filmed on location in the Holy Land, allows participants to travel with Rob Fuquay and actually see the places where Jesus stood while disclosing his true identity, and in what context he spoke each "I Am."

Getting to know God means getting to know ourselves. The more we know who God is the more we know who we are. The Gospel of John records several declarations of Jesus known as the "I Am" sayings. This study is designed to explore each of those sayings and will help participants find and form an answer to the most essential question in the Christian faith, "Who do you say I am?"

One by one, Jesus' statements grab our imagination, reveal more about his identity and purpose, and connect us to the God of Moses, who spoke the first "I Am." These significant yet ordinary images (bread, light, shepherd, vine, and more) give us insightful ways to experience Jesus and point us to a God who wants to be known. Books can be ordered on Amazon.

- ♦ Introduction to "I am" Knowing God
- ◆ I am the Bread of Life Knowing God's Satisfaction
- ◆ I am the Light of the World Knowing God's Guidance
- I am the Good Shepherd Knowing God's Care
- ◆ I am the True Vine Knowing God's Power
- I am the Way, the Truth, and the Life Knowing God's Way
- I am the Resurrection and the Life Knowing God's Possibilities




