Hold us who wait ...

We all have favorite hymns that inspire and comfort us. Clergy often learn which songs and hymns have been instrumental in congregants' spiritual lives as we assist families in planning celebrations for those who have lived and died in Christ. Certain hymn titles are mentioned frequently, beloved by many whatever their denominational backgrounds. Music is a universal language that inspires, motivates, energizes, soothes, comforts, and disturbs (I mean that in a good way). Lyrics proclaim God's goodness and faithfulness as well as our profound gratitude for the self-giving love of Christ—a love which opened the way for us to acknowledge and to receive God's grace and mercy. Songs of faith remind us that the one who claimed us in life will also receive us in death.

Big musical productions with strong, upbeat, and commanding scores make our spirits leap in recognition of God's majesty and power. Simple pieces that gently brush across our inner beings invite us into that quiet, interior space where we may commune with God—Spirit to spirit. As I anticipate our All Saints Day celebration on November 2, the lyrics of a favorite childhood hymn filter through my mind: *Near to the Heart of God*.

We believe that the Saints who have entered the Church Triumphant have found their final rest in Christ. We rejoice in that truth and will celebrate it in worship this Sunday as we remember those who have joined their number in the past year. At the same time, the hymn invites we who are yet alive to *rest*—to burrow into God's promises and love, whatever our circumstances or pain. Whenever I sense turmoil or anxiety encroaching on my peace—as it often tries to do these days—I find myself turning to the words of this hymn, seeking that safe space the words promise.

There is a place of quiet rest, near to the heart of God; a place where sin cannot molest, near to the heart of God.

Refrain:

O Jesus, blest Redeemer, sent from the heart of God, hold us, who wait before Thee, near to the heart of God.

There is a place of comfort sweet, near to the heart of God; a place where we our Savior meet, near to the heart of God.

There is a place of full release, near to the heart of God; a place where all is joy and peace, near to the heart of God. (UMH 472)

We are grateful for all the Saints—past and present—who have shown us the face and heart of God in their words and actions. We give thanks for those who have shared our burdens, prayed for us, fed us, comforted us, believed in us and proclaimed to us the Good News that God so loved the world—God so loved us—that God gave the Son.

And so, we pray: God of all grace, *hold us*—we who wait and labor in the land of the living—near to your heart. Grant us the rest, peace, and comfort we need to love as you would have us love and to serve as you would have us serve ... generously and gracefully. Amen.




Meetings are held on the 2nd Monday of each month at 10:30 am.
