Romans 7: Wrestling with Sin, the Law, and Deliverance

Key Terms & Concepts:

- Law: God's perfect standard of righteousness. It reveals sin but cannot save.
- Sin: A power that corrupts and enslaves. It deceives and leads to death.
- Flesh: Our fallen nature—hostile to God and powerless to obey.
- Inner Man: The regenerate heart that delights in God's law.
- Condemnation: The just judgment we deserve for sin.

Section 3: Romans 7:14-20 – The Ongoing Battle Within Believers

Key Concepts:

- Paul describes the inner war: delighting in God's law, yet doing what he hates.

- Only Christ can deliver us from this conflict.

Application Reflection:

- What lies does sin whisper when you fail?
- How can you train yourself to cry out to Christ in your struggle?

Section 4: Romans 7:21-25 – The Cry for Deliverance

Key Concepts:

- Paul confesses that evil is close even when he wants to do good.
- He cries out for deliverance—not from effort, but from despair.
- Christ alone can deliver from this war—we walk forward in dependence, not defeat.

Application Reflection:

- Where do you need to cry out for God's help instead of pretending you're fine?
- How does this passage prepare you to receive grace daily?
