When we talk about God's "attributes" what are we referring to?

- His qualities or characteristics
- Who God is in His essence
- Also known as the "perfections" of God.

God is not defined *by* His attributes. Rather, God is the definition *of* His attributes.

God's attributes are not the result of His actions. Rather, God's actions are the result of His attributes.

God is always all of His attributes all at once.

None of God's attributes ever conflict with one another.

All the members of the Trinity share all the attributes of the Godhead equally.

What are the benefits of studying the attributes of God?

If we don't stand in awe and amazement of God, if we are not captivated by Him, enthralled by Him, if we do not fear Him as we should, love Him as we should, or trust Him as we should, it can only be because we do not know Him as we should.

God is not who you *think* He is. God is who He <u>says</u> He is.

"The foundation of all true knowledge of God must be a clear and mental apprehension of His perfections as revealed in Holy Scripture. <u>An unknown God can neither be trusted, served nor worshiped.</u>" (Pink, pg. 7)

"Something more than theoretical knowledge of God is needed by us. God is only truly known in the soul as we yield ourselves to Him, submit to His authority, and regulate all the details of our lives by His holy precepts and commandments." (Pink, pg. 7-8)

Three Essential Elements of Faith

Notitia: to know information about something.

Assensus: to agree that the information we have is true.

Fiducia: faith that changes us from the inside out.

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"The Holy Spirit has to shine in our hearts (not intellects) in order to give us the 'knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ' (2 Cor. 4:6). And even that spiritual knowledge is but fragmentary. The regenerated soul has to grow in grace and in the knowledge of the Lord Jesus (2 Pet. 3:18)." [Pink, pg. 13]
