LOVING JESUS, LOVING PEOPLE, PLOWING A COUNTER-CULTURE

TEXT: Genesis 8:20–9:28

MAIN IDEA: God provides us with peace and stability so that we can accomplish our mission.

For this year's Christmas series, we are exploring the major covenants of the Old Testament:

- The Noahic Covenant
- The Abrahamic
- The Sinai Covenant
- The David Covenant
- The New Covenant
- At the beginning of the sermon, Ryan began with a challenge to set apart our Tuesdays leading up to Christmas Eve Eve for prayer and fasting. We even invite you to meet up with everyone on Tuesdays at 7 am at the church to pray with one another, especially for the people we plan on inviting out. What encourages or intimidates you about this?
- The story of Genesis I-II is that sin breaks God's good world, and we can't fix this. Where do you see this truth manifested in the world today?
- The flood narrative is often treated as a children's story, even though it's deeply sobering. How does understanding the flood as an act of both divine judgment and mercy shape the way you read it?

Never Again

Read Genesis 8:20-22.

Read what Genesis 6:5 says about what God observed about the world before he sent the flood, and compare it with what God says here in 8:21: "The intention of man's heart is evil from his youth." What has changed about mankind, and what does this tell us about the covenant God is about to establish with all creation?

Read 2 Peter 3:5–7 and 10. How does this jive with God's promise to never again destroy the earth in verses 21–22 (and also 9:11)?

Getting Our Part Right

Read Genesis 9:1-7.

Every biblical covenant places some kind of obligation on those who participate in it. What are our obligations under the Noahic covenant?

© God gave Noah the same mission he gave to humanity at our creation (1:28): "Be fruitful and multiply"—and he says it twice (9:1, 7)! In what ways are children and family a part of God's blessing and mission, even for those who do not have children?

What does this passage teach us about the value of human life?

How does verse 6 inform our thinking about the death penalty?

With All Living Flesh

Read Genesis 9:8-17.

© God establishes this covenant, not just with mankind, but with all creation. Why do you think that is, and how can we be imitators of God in how we treat the non-human creation?

Each covenant between God and man has a sign (except the Davidic covenant—we don't know what the sign for that one was!). What is the significance of the bow hung in the sky as the sign of the Noahic covenant?

Don't Be a Ham

Read Genesis 9:18-28.

© What was Ham's error, and what do we learn from this about how to deal with other people's sin?

This passage reminds us that even the best men and women still struggle with humiliating sin. In the Community Extras, Ryan explained that people sometimes allow their fallenness to prevent them from sharing the gospel. Has this ever been true for you? If so, please explain.
