Local Scholarships

United States Senate Youth Program

Deadline: December 1

Amount: \$10,000

GPA Requirement: N/A

Description: Juniors and seniors who currently hold a student leadership position and possess a strong interest in government, public service, and history are encouraged to apply for the USSYP. This program includes an opportunity to experience national government in action as well as be awarded a \$10,000 college scholarship.

DC-CAP University Partnership Scholarship

Deadline: November 10

Amount: Full tuition (amount varies)

GPA Requirement: 2.7

Description: The DC-CAP University Partnership Scholarship provides a full-tuition scholarship that covers tuition, fees, room, and board costs. Applicants must be a graduating senior at a DC public or public charter high school where DC-CAP provides services and be US citizens or permanent residents who are eligible for DCTAG. Applicants must complete the online DC-CAP Registration Form and Student Authorization Form. Additionally, students must be admitted by and enroll at the selected partner institution for the 2024-25 academic year.

DC-CAP Scholarship*

Deadline: November 10

Amount: Up to \$20,000 (over 5 years)

GPA Requirement: 2.5

Description: The DC-CAP Scholarship is available to DC public and public charter high school students who attend a high school where DC-CAP provides services. Applicants must complete the online DC-CAP Registration Form

and Student Authorization Form. Students must plan to enroll at a four-year college or university for the 2024-25

academic year.

Louis Goaziou Lodge #1953 Scholarship Program*

Deadline: March 31

Amount: \$500

GPA Requirement: 2.5

Description: The Louis Goaziou Lodge #1953 Scholarship Program is open to all high school seniors currently enrolled in a Washington, DC, or surrounding metro area high school in the 2023-24 school year who are planning to attend an accredited U.S. college or other educational program starting in the 2024-25 school year. pursue a career in technology or as an entrepreneur, and discuss the challenges, benefits, and opportunities for

women in technology."

Elks National Foundation Most Valuable Student Scholarship

Deadline: November 13

Amount: Up to \$30,000 (over four years)

GPA Requirement: N/A

Description: The Elks National Foundation aims to help outstanding, service-minded high school seniors realize

their academic dreams. Applicants must be high school seniors and US citizens who will pursue a four-year degree

at a US college or university.

Frito-Lay Community Builders Scholarship*

Deadline: November 20

Amount: \$25,000

GPA Requirement: 2.5

Description: The scholarship aims to honor students from all backgrounds who improve their communities and

provide them with additional financial assistance to alleviate the burden of higher education costs. Applicants must be high school seniors (or current higher education students) who will enroll in a higher education program for the

2024-25 academic year.

Hispanic Heritage Youth Awards*

Deadline: November 13

Amount: Up to \$4,000

GPA Requirement: 3.0

Description: The Youth Awards honors Latinx high school seniors who excel in the classroom and community and for their excellence in various categories including Business & Entrepreneurship, Community Service, Education, Engineering, Green Sustainability, Healthcare & Science, Media & Entertainment, Public Service & Social Justice, and Technology. Eligible applicants include high school seniors graduating in Spring 2024 who are of Hispanic heritage (including Spain, Brazil, and Philippines) and plan to enroll at an accredited higher education institution in 2024-25.

Jack Kent Cooke Foundation College Scholarship Program*

Deadline: November 16

Amount: Up to \$220,000 (over four years)

GPA Requirement: 3.5 (unweighted)

Description: High school seniors graduating in spring 2024 who have financial need and intend to enroll full time in an accredited four-year college for fall 2024 are eligible to apply for this scholarship. The program covers up to \$55,000 per year for four years of undergraduate study to complete a bachelor's degree. Students apply for the scholarship via the Common App.

Prudential Emerging Visionaries Program*

Deadline: November 2

Amount: Up to \$15,000

GPA Requirement: N/A

Description: Students between the ages of 14 to 18 who are legal residents of the US (including Puerto Rico) are eligible to apply for the Prudential Emerging Visionaries Program with a project they have already started. The program celebrates young people for their innovative solutions to financial and societal challenges in their communities.

Regeneron Science Talent Search*

Deadline: November 8

Amount: Up to \$250,000

GPA Requirement: N/A

Description: Students performing individual research projects can enter the Regeneron Science Talent Search to

be awarded one of several scholarships. Eligible applicants must be current high school seniors who have

undertaken independent science research projects.

Rollins Scholarship*

Deadline: November 15

Amount: \$5,000

GPA Requirement: N/A

Description: Scholarships will be awarded to high school seniors based on their compelling stories about their lives,

their intended field of study/career and how they will make an impact on the world. Applicants must submit an essay

of at least 500 words.

SchoolHouse Connection Youth Leadership and Scholarship Program*

Deadline: November 24

Amount: \$2,500

GPA Requirement: N/A

Description: This program serves youth ages 20 and under who have experienced homelessness in the last six

years and who will begin their higher education in 2024. The goal of the program is to provide financial assistance and staff and peer support to ensure that these youth are successful in getting to and through higher education and

into the workforce. Undocumented applicants are eligible. Applicants must write a 1,000-word essay.

Unigo Education Matters Scholarship

Deadline: November 30

Amount: \$5.000

GPA Requirement: N/A

Description: Scholarship open to students who are at least 14 years old and legal U.S. residents. Applicants must submit an essay about why education and college matter.
