Get To Know You Question:

If you were a sheep, what would be the most likely thing to make you wander off? Food, noise, or something shiny?

Let's Dig Deeper

Someone read **Luke 15:1-7**. Spend some time and share some key words that spoke out to you while reading. What is it about those words that spoke to you?

Remember The Heart Of The Shepherd (Luke 15:1-7)

1. Someone read Luke 15:1-7. What does it reveal about the kind of people Jesus attracts compared to the kind of people the Pharisees prefer?
2. Jesus receives and eats with sinners. How should that shape the way you think about the people in your life who do not act, look, or talk like church people?
3. In the sermon we said people wander because they want. What are some wants that pull people away from God without them realizing it?
4. Jesus described us as sheep more than four hundred times in Scripture. Which part of the sheep metaphor feels most true in your life right now?
5. Jesus said He came to seek and save the lost. How does knowing His mission shape your mission with the people you see every week?

Let God Redefine Your Value And Satisfaction (Psalm 23)

6. Someone read Psalm 23. What does this passage reveal about God's nature when you feel prone to wander?
7. Sheep wander because they have not found what they are looking for. What are some places people in our culture look for satisfaction that never truly satisfy?
8. "He makes me lie down in green pastures" describes soul-level satisfaction. What has God used in your life to help you stop searching in the wrong places?

9. David says God restores the soul. What parts of your soul need restoration right now, and how can the group pray for you in that?
10. The sermon described the endless pattern of sheep: eat, move, eat, move. Where do you see that restless pattern showing up in your own life?

Share In The Joy Of Heaven (Luke 15:7)

11. Jesus said there is more joy in heaven over one sinner who repents. What does that teach you about the joy of God?
12. When you think about your life, where does your joy usually come from, and how does Heaven's joy challenge that?
13. Think of one person in your world who is wandering. What practical steps can you take this week to pursue them the way the shepherd did?
14. Revelation 5 describes Heaven celebrating the recovery of the lost. How does that scene inspire you to join God's mission with greater joy?
15. What would change in our church if every believer saw themselves as someone who gets to participate in the joy of God by seeking out the wandering?
