- 5. What helps you stay faithful when discipleship feels inconvenient or uncomfortable?

Luke 9:59-60 — The Cost of Possessions and Priorities

"Follow Me." But he said, "Lord, let me first go and bury my father."

- 6. How do you see this man's hesitation reflected in believers today?
- 7. What modern examples mirror the idea of waiting for "the inheritance" before following Jesus?
- 8. What does this exchange teach us about divided priorities between the Kingdom and the world?
- 9. How can we recognize when our pursuit of security or success has become an idol?
- 10. What would it look like for you personally to "go and proclaim the Kingdom of God" right now?

Luke 9:61-62 — The Cost of Loyalty

"No one who puts his hand to the plow and looks back is fit for the kingdom of God."

- 11. Why do you think Jesus spoke so strongly about looking back?
- 12. What are some ways believers today "look back" while claiming to move forward?
- 13. How do relationships or attachments sometimes keep us from full devotion to Christ?
- 14. What does it mean for you to make following Jesus a lifestyle, not a season?
- 15. How can our church become known as a community of lifelong learners who keep their eyes forward?
