Let's Dig Deeper

Someone read **Matthew 28:16-20**. Spend some time and share some key words that spoke out to you while reading. What is it about those words that spoke to you?

The Great Commission and Our Assumptions *(Matthew 28:16-20)*

1. When you hear the phrase "the Great Commission," what emotions surface first: excitement, pressure, guilt, or confusion, and why?
2. In what ways have you assumed the Great Commission was mainly for pastors, missionaries, or especially gifted Christians rather than for every believer?
3. Jesus begins the Great Commission by declaring His authority, not by listing our responsibilities. How does that change the way you hear His command to go and make disciples?

When Faith Becomes Shallow

4. Have you ever felt like something was missing in your faith even though you were active in church? What did that season feel like?
5. When did your faith feel most alive and daring, and what do you think slowly diminished that sense of joy or purpose?
6. In what ways can church activity unintentionally replace a lived-out, on-mission faith?

Church, Kingdom, and the Home Team Mentality

7. How have you personally defined "the church" in the past: a people or a place? And how has that definition shaped your faith?

8. In what ways have you seen churches, or yourself, focus more on church programs and participation than on living out the Kingdom of God in everyday life?
9. How might judging the health of the Kingdom of God by our Sunday services limit what we believe God is doing the rest of the week?

The Kingdom Reimagined (*Mark 1:15; Luke 17:20–21; Matthew 13:31–33*)

10. Someone read **Mark 1:15**. What stands out to you about how Jesus describes the nearness of the Kingdom?
11. Someone read **Luke 17:20–21**. Why do you think we are still tempted to look for visible markers of God’s work instead of recognizing His presence?
12. The mustard seed and leaven parables describe slow, quiet growth. How does that challenge our expectations of spiritual success?

Kingdom in Ordinary Life

13. Which part of everyday life do you struggle most to see as God’s Kingdom: work, school, home, relationships, or recreation?
14. Many of us delay living out our faith because we feel unqualified, unapproved, or unsupported. Which of these has most often kept you from stepping out in faith, and what fears might be underneath it?
15. If someone were to encounter the love, truth, and presence of Jesus through your life this week, what might that actually look like in one specific relationship or situation?
