FOR CHILDREN

We offer Sunday School at both services, where the children attend class with an instructor to learn and grow in their faith. Children begin their time in worship and then come forward for the children's message, after which they proceed to Sunday School. Be sure to register your child from 4 years old through 5th grade. If your child prefers to stay with you during worship, activity baskets with crayons and activity sheets are located at the back of the Sanctuary. Nursery care is available for those attending services at 9:00 AM or 11:00 AM in the nursery room.

RESTROOMS

If you need to use the restroom, please exit the Sanctuary to the right of the altar area and go up the stairs to the bathrooms adjacent to the Community Room. There are also additional restrooms down the hallway past the Kids Ministry Rooms.

Holy God,

From the beginning, your family tree has had wide branches. You called Abraham and Sarah and promised blessings for all nations. You included Rahab, a foreigner, in your story. You welcomed Ruth, a widow and outsider, into your lineage. You have always cared for widows, orphans, and strangers.

Through all these generations, your family has been built not on privilege, but on your mercy, your invitation and your love that reaches beyond boundaries. And then, in Jesus Christ, your table grew even wider: you ate with tax collectors, sinners, and friends who had nothing to offer. You broke bread with strangers, fed thousands with loaves and fish, and showed us what it means to belong to a family that spans every nation, every tongue, every land.

We are honored to join our voices with Christians from every corner of the earth, saying:

Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might, Heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest. Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest.

As your Holy Spirit has been in this holy meal since it began, we ask, Lord, that you will pour out your Spirit on this bread and this cup, and on us, your scattered-yet-gathered people. Make this meal more than bread and wine; make it a foretaste of your kingdom, a sign of hope in a hungry world, a reminder that we belong to one another and to you. As we dine together at the banquet table of your kingdom, remind us that while all is not yet well, we can come before you boldly in prayer and in longing for your restoration for us and for this world. And so today we pray for...

And we stand united, praying the prayer that anchors us in your love, saying:

Our Father, Who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name Thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven, give us this day our daily bread and forgive us our debts as we forgive our debtors.
