Youth Adventures:

The youth group had an excellent mission trip to Nashville, TN. Three students attended along with three chaperones. We were able to serve a nonprofit called East Nashville Hope Exchange (ENHE) which focuses on helping children with their literacy.

This summer, ENHE had 103 kids from grades Pre-K through 5th. Our students helped the staff clean up after the kids and then assisted the teachers throughout their day. From 11:30 AM-1:00 PM each day, our students lead "reading buddies" which is time set aside for 1:1 reading and literacy games. During our lunch breaks, our group would have devotional time where we were able to refocus on our theme "EQUIP," as problem solving acronym that is directly applied to Christian living. In the afternoons, the kids would have play time outside and our students would help facilitate that.

On Tuesday evening, we had a free night to explore Nashville and our group chose to go to Centennial Park to see the Parthenon. Overall, our students grew in their self confidence and spiritual journeys.

Looking Ahead:


The youth group will resume its regular gathering beginning September 14, 2025.



On Sunday, November 2, 2025, we will rededicate our church. A church rededication is a ceremony where a church building is reconsecrated or blessed after a restoration. Rededication signifies a renewed commitment to God and His work, both for the church building and for the individuals within the congregation. Our District Superintendent, Dr James C. Wilson II, will preach.

Here's a little excerpt from a history of churches in Madison County: The Methodist Episcopal church of London was established shortly after the town was laid out. in either 1813 or 1814. The society worshipped in private residences, and belonged to a large circuit, which in 1819 had twenty-four preaching places. Its first church was erected on a lot at the corner of Walnut and Fifth streets, purchased from Patrick McLeue for eleven dollars. Its officials were William Erwin, Jonathan Min-shall, John McDonald, William Warner, Sr., William G. Pritchard, Robert Warner, David Watson, James Greenley and Amos G. Thompson. This was a log meetinghouse with puncheon floors and seats of split rails and was the first church structure in London. For twenty years this humble building served the congregation. Then two lots were secured on the southwest corner of Second and Oak streets, where they built a new church about the year 1840 — a framed structure some sixty feet square, with a gallery and two upstairs classrooms. A small brick parsonage stood on the west side of the church. The congregation worshipped there another twenty years, when this building was removed to make way for a brick building, forty feet wide, In the fall of 1S90, Rev. W. L. Slutz became pastor, coming from Bigelow, Portsmouth, and staying five years, during which time the old church and parsonage were sold, and the present edifice erected, costing about forty-five thousand dollars. It was dedicated on November 18, 1894. by Bishop Joyce.
