It's more than a meal...it's a tangible way to share Jesus' love!

Step One—Each meal costs 31 cents, so we needed to raise \$4,650 to cover the cost of the food. \$2,500 came from the Pastor's Discretionary Fund. We raised the additional funds with a free-will offering on Sunday March 23rd at a Carry-in-Dinner after church.

Step Two—Recruit 50 volunteers to pack meals, with 3-5 volunteers needed early to unload the food and supplies.

Step Three—We held our packing day on Saturday, June 7 from 9-Noon. Volunteers from Lifeline Christian Mission were on hand to help us set up and we watched an instructional video on the process. Pastor Dave blessed our mission in prayer. Then, we donned hair nets and gloves, and manned our stations! Rice, beans, dried vegies and protein powder were added to each bag. Each of the six teams had someone to weigh each bag and add or subtract rice as needed. Each team had a bag sealer, who sealed the bags and put a label on each one. Once 36 bags were filled, the packer on each team filled a case and labeled it. When prepared, each bag would provide six meals. Our teams were so efficient we were done packing—15,120 meals by 11am—Pastor Dave provided ice cream as we finished up.

Step Four—Load the cases of meals into the Lifeline Christian Mission truck. Clean up. The meals will be sent all over the world to feed those in need! It is so meaningful to know that our church in London is having a global impact!!!

Food Truck Party VBS is based on Matthew 6:11 (NRSV): "Give us this day our daily bread." This verse reminds us that <u>everything we have</u> comes from God—but it also calls us to <u>turn to God in prayer for our daily</u> needs. Here, students learn important lessons about God's ability to provide. Students are guided each day by the food truck's Chef Kate and DJ Cupcake to learn about the Daily Special—a familiar prayer that teaches us to turn to God to meet our needs. Chef Kate, DJ Cupcake, and students set out to learn how we can depend on God to take care of us. Because God loves and cares for us, we, in turn, can love and care for the rest of the world. In this way the Church becomes the hands of God, ensuring that everyone's needs are met. Each session focuses on different ways God has met the needs of God's people and reminds us that <u>God is still doing this today through us</u>!

Madison County Food Pantry News: Each month one of the Panty's sponsoring churches is asked to provide volunteers to assist with food distribution. May was FUMC's designated month and the Church really delivered! There were volunteers for almost every time the Pantry was open, and the help was MUCH appreciated!

As expected, demand for assistance from the Pantry has not stopped as reflected below for the period January through May 2025.

Pantry customers can be provided food once per month and some customers do come every month. The figures do include those multiple visits but reflect total families served throughout the period.
