

ADMINISTRATOR'S / TREASURER'S 2025 REPORT

"Many are the plans in the mind of a man, but it is the purpose of the Lord that will stand."
- Proverbs 19:21 (ESV)

In 2025, weekly giving to the General Fund became somewhat more stable than in 2024. Nonetheless, General Fund offerings dropped to **\$265,834.38** from **\$615,499.26** in 2024 despite our average Sunday morning attendance being only 9 people fewer than the previous year.

I would very much like to thank our ministry heads for every sacrifice they made to keep their expenditures down in 2025, with total budgeted expenses amounting to only 77.50% of what was budgeted for 2025 at the November 2024 Annual Meeting. After having proactively reduced the budget by over 10% at that meeting, the subsequent reduction in 2025 General Fund offerings noted above led to another reduction of **over 21%** in the 2026 church budget. This included 20% reductions in ministry budgets, elimination of some paid positions within the church, and pay reductions for every remaining staff member from the pastors on down. Limited to man's strength alone, the entirety of Promise Lane Church is impacted from ministries to members. But praise God that nothing we do can impede the will and movements of the Lord!

Tax season in 2025 allowed us to close the financial books on First Alliance Church and operate exclusively as Promise Lane Church. All prior FAC online financial data was archived.

Weekly and monthly administrative tasks are too numerous to mention, but noteworthy has been our efforts to coordinate Sunday morning slides and bulletin board announcements with our website and mobile app to provide multiple sources to obtain information on upcoming events. We will also (hopefully) try again in 2026 to generate membership interest in cooperatively populating our Church Community Builder (CCB) platform so it can be utilized more widely for a church directory, to monitor individual giving to the church, to communicate with groups and committees, and other one-stop church tools.

As always, I am incredibly thankful for the invaluable, kingdom-oriented dedication of Joanne Stewart (our Bookkeeper), Mandy Ramaswami (our Assistant Treasurer), Mandy's team of weekly counters, Scott Zuiderveen (Finance Committee member-at-large), and Sarah Bennett (our Church Secretary).

Promise Lane Church Missions Committee Annual Report

This year, Promise Lane Church has been blessed to partner with various Kingdom-growth opportunities both locally and internationally.

Below is a summary of the missionaries and ministries PLC supported in 2025. Although God does not need us, He has allowed us to participate in the amazing things He's doing all over the world.

Global Impact

Tanzania (Scott and Cassie Bostick, Rose Savaiko & Pastor Emmanuel (Emma) Mwankosole)

- Supported Bible translation efforts into the following language communities: **Mbugwe** (Training, Gospel of John, 1-2 Peter,) **Sandawe** (Training and 1 Timothy), **Hadza** (Training), **Wanda** (Gospel of Luke), and **Bende** (1-2 Peter, Final New Testament publication checks).
- Supplied over 1,500 pouches for audio Bibles (Dorcas Daughters).
- Provided over 200 Bibles for youth in a discipleship program.
- Provided hats, blankets, and baby clothes (Dorcas Daughters).
- Contributed toward 80 youth to attend a 5-day Bible Camp (resulting in 35 new decisions for Christ!)
- Supplied about 300 Audio Bible players (through VBS, Acts 1:8 Fund, and Ladies Ministry Fund Raiser)
- Partnered with the Bosticks' monthly, as they train local pastors, evangelists to share the good news in the unreached places in East Africa
- Supplied the funds for a pastor to move to an unreached village in Tanzania and start a church

Papua, Indonesia (Buzz and Myrna Maxey)

- Supported Bible training, discipleship, and evangelism.
- Supported sports and medical ministries to serve the community.
- We, as a church, welcomed them here and enjoyed fellowship as they shared in person at Promise Lane the weekend of August 3rd, 2025.

El Salvador (Envision El Salvador/La Fuente)

- Supported La Fuente in El Salvador in their Christian education ministry

Burkina Faso (Engage Burkina/John and Betty Arnold)

- Supported food distribution, evangelism, discipleship, church planting, and medical ministry efforts.
- We welcomed them to our church and enjoyed fellowship as they joined us in person at Promise Lane the weekend of September 7, 2025.

Horn of Africa (Ben Savaiko)

- Support Bible translation projects for 25 language communities (in Ethiopia, South Sudan, Somalia, Eritrea), expanding access to Scripture where there is none.

Jordan (Munther Shahatit)

- Supporting his ministry, which focuses on evangelism, discipleship, and trauma counseling, to bring hope and healing.

LOCAL IMPACT

Smoky Mountain Pregnancy Care Center (SMPCC)

- Provided outreach and support for expectant mothers.

Foster Care Ministries

- Partnered with **Magnolia Missions** by supplying monthly support, as they serve foster families across Macon County.

Missionary Student Housing (Paradise Mountain Ministries)

- Supported Paradise Mountain Ministries as they provide housing and community to students based in the states while their families serve abroad.

Men's Challenge in the Smokies

- Increased our Monthly support of Men's Challenge in the Smokies and prayed for them monthly

Trimont

- Increased our monthly support to them financially and continued to support them in prayer

CareNet

- Continued to support them financially and in prayer
- Holiday food drive (continuing into 2026)

Gospel-Centered ESL Ministry (Nancy Thomas/American Missions Board)

- Provided a place for English as a Second Language (ESL) instruction and training to take place.

As a Missions Committee, we met on average once a month to share updates on each ministry and pray for them.

Board of Ministries Annual Report: Youth Ministry (2025/2026)

2025 was a year of transition For Renew Youth. The youth ministry was initially led by Nathaniel Smith and Pastor Brad Bennett until June 2025 when Pastor David Smith accepted the position of Associate Pastor with the assigned duties of Youth Ministry. Renew Youth currently has 9 members serving in leadership positions, with a majority of the youth demographic ranging from 9th -12th grade. This has allowed for a greater depth of biblical study with our youth and a focus on cultural/worldview issues at the forefront of lesson planning.

The biblical focus for youth ministry in 2025 was centered on understanding the key tenants of the Gospel message, with a focus on Evangelism. While the youth have spent time studying multiple books of the Bible such as Genesis, Romans, and Matthew, the overall theme of the year has been learning the overarching narrative of the biblical story and how it all points to Jesus and the expansion of His Kingdom. With the current older youth demographic, this has allowed for a greater depth of biblical study with and an increased focus on cultural and worldview issues. Both Sunday School and Wednesday Night's studies will continue this trajectory with greater concentration on learning the foundations of proper hermeneutics and how to live out your faith in an increasing hostile culture.

Over the course of 2025, the youth attended multiple events including Fields of Faith, Winter Jam, and Rock the Smokies. The youth also attended Student Life Rec Camp at Lee University in Cleveland, Tennessee, and will be returning in 2026 to participate in a mission-centered camp experience. The youth also engaged in several acts of service in the community with those in need and with organizations such as the Pregnancy Care Center. I would like to personally see an increase in service projects in the spring and summer months and create more outreach events to reach students at MMS, FHS and MEC.

Children's Ministry 2025 Annual Report

During 2025, we hosted several outreach events such as: family roller skating with the youth group, AARC read to the animals day, and family swim night at the golf course pool. We also hosted 3 Pancakes in the Park events but determined they were not a fruitful event and canceled the 4th one. Fall Harvest Festival was a great success, we had many visitors and past members who attended the carnival-like event and sponsored a Chili cookoff contest.

Family Fun Nights at the church were held bimonthly, and we rotated themes for each event. Lego Night, Crafts, Movies, and Escape Rooms. Attendance varies due to sports, school, and holiday commitments. Our average attendance is 6 – 18 people, plus 2-3 volunteers. We still struggled to get adult church members to attend, even though it is advertised for all ages.

VBS was changed to four days and then postponed due to the Director's family emergencies, but with the excellent help of Amanda Maxwell and all of the dedicated volunteers, it was a great success with approximately 60 kids attending. The format worked great, Pastor taught the lesson from the stage, the youth performed the skits and contests. We did not dismiss to classrooms this year. Everyone transitioned from station to station at the same time; it flowed perfectly. Most of the food was donated by church members, prepared in the church kitchen, and then served at Trimont.

Challenges in 2025 were maintaining a steady attendance, several families left the church, and we have several who attend on occasion. Our average attendance went from 16 kids to 6 – 8 for Children's Church and 2-5 for Sunday School. New family recruitment or retention has not been successful.

Curriculum- We began using the Grow curriculum in January for both Sunday School and Children's Church but Grow changed its format, and it became difficult to use and costly. We ended the curriculum in September and began a basic Bible plan using Scribbles and Scriptures in conjunction with True Way Kids, which is free, minus the expense to print and prepare each lesson. Families said that they like the program and that the kids remember the conversations we have. With low attendance for Sunday School, we now play Bible games with the kids, which they enjoy.

Volunteers- we have 10 regular volunteers for the elementary class and we lost several who left the church or had to drop out for health reasons. The nursery and toddler rooms have 0-2 kids on a given Sunday. We had 2 people attend the annual 4-day KidzMatter conference in Indiana. It was an enriching time of renewal, fellowship, and education.

Kids Hope USA continues into 2026. We had 9 mentors and 8 students in 2025. Several students moved away from the district in August, so we dropped down to 6 mentors and 6 students. The school appreciates the time we spend with our mentees. The annual renewal is \$500, and we plan to continue that program in 2026.
