### **Vision & Origin Story**

Founded in 2018, Civil Righteousness, Inc. (CRI) is a movement of holy activism, governed as a 501(c)3 not-for-profit charitable organization. The vision of the organization is to witness the restoration of all persons, places, and things through the pursuit of moral excellence and wholeness according to the biblical pattern.

Born out of the civil unrest in Ferguson, Missouri, Civil Righteousness is a grassroots response by the Christian community to address the historical racial divide in America. Inequity demands a Civil Rights movement, but iniquity demands a Civil Righteousness movement. CRI believes that the collective efforts of justice and righteousness represent the emergence of a multi-ethnic movement which may define a new era of cultural transformation, led once again by the Christian Church.

# Letter from the President

2022 was another momentous year for Civil Righteousness. For a number of years, this movement has consisted of individuals who have boldly responded to our invitations at a grassroots level. With desire to be peacemaking witnesses, we've seen a tremendously diverse range of people engage with our events and teaching in the past. However, this year was more about effective multiplication of our message through discipleship, rather than mass mobilization in the streets. To that end, it was a year of trying new things. From hosting Peacemaker, our first 21-day leadership intensive, to launching Spark Tank, a nine month long business accelerator program, we began to focus on building deeply with a small group of folks who can spawn massive change when fully equipped and empowered.

Among all of the new developments, I am most encouraged and excited about our partnerships with the local church. We've been blessed to establish our corporate offices and house a large majority of our activities within the historic First Baptist Church - Ferguson. This location has not only been a blessing to us, but has facilitated a way for us to be a blessing to the nations while finding ways to make an impact at home alongside them and a host of other ministries.



In Portland, Oregon, we seized the opportunity to consult with a rapidly growing local church called Bridgetown. Through this partnership, which we refer to as a "holy experiment," we've been able to see some of the concepts and values of Civil Righteousness worked out within the life of a local congregation. It has been amazing to witness God at work as this community becomes a truly reconciled, multi-ethnic, people of justice and mercy. We (as an organization) are no replacement for congregational life, yet we believe that the ministry of reconciliation should be an inextricable part of the local church's Gospel mission. We are excited about the model of Civil Righteousness that God is raising up in Portland, and in the days ahead, we look forward to partnering in much greater ways with what God is doing through the local church across the nation.

Most of all, we are honored to share this journey with you. Thank you for your support in this crucial work. We pray that you will be encouraged as you review this annual report!

### **Civil Righteousness University**

Civil Righteousness University is a Biblically-based, online educational platform dedicated to the training and equipping of believers of all ethnicities, cultures, and generations in the pursuit of reconciliation and restorative justice. Through December 2022, CR-U had 150 people register. In April of 2022, we also filmed brand new, engaging, on-location videos for our CR-U curriculum, with professional videography and graphics by Mecoclub. Those videos were released through CR-U in early November.

### **Peacemaker Leadership Intensive**

From June 5 - 25, 2022, we invited young adults (and the young at heart) to meet us in Ferguson, MO to be trained and equipped as holy activists. Holy Activists pursue lifestyles of righteousness and justice through public actions, strategies, and initiatives driven by Biblical patterns for social change in their spheres of influence as peacemakers, reconcilers, reformers, and revivalists. Students gleaned from local and national leaders through daily prophetic worship and prayer, Biblically-based, revelatory teaching, and powerful, hands-on ministry experiences.

We had eight individuals participate in the intensive (students and staff combined), who were all ministry leaders, hailing from across the U.S. and even overseas. We also included a 3-day racial trauma healing seminar conducted by racial trauma expert Apostle Valarie Cunningham (The Synergy Center, Kalamazoo, MI). We opened up one of the evening racial trauma healing sessions for the Ferguson community. Handson ministry experiences included The Wall, prayer walking and compassion ministry with Pray for the Lou, tour and Q & A with Love the Lou, planning and leading a Juneteenth community leader prayer brunch, designing and implementing an Imago Dei Prayer Space, and celebrating a Shabbat Dinner.

## **Engage Injustice**







### **Imago Dei Prayer Space**

Imago Dei Prayer Space is an interactive, racial reconciliation prayer space. This self-guided prayer room is a creative and holy synergy of scripture, history, current events, artwork, interactive prayer stations, and (local) testimonies. In 2022, an Imago Dei prayer space was led by our Peacemakers and hosted by The House (Church) in Ferguson during the last two weeks of June. (Pictured left top)

### **Pray on MLK**

On Sunday, August 28, hundreds from around the U.S. converged on local Martin Luther King, Jr. boulevards, streets, and parks to participate in a silent prayer protest called The Wall. Most groups concluded their time together by partaking in communion elements and worshiping with song. (Pictured left middle)

### Tears for St. Louis: A 21 Day Pray for the Lou Devotional

In early 2022, Civil Righteousness partnered with Pray for the Lou, a St. Louis - based prayer walking movement, to create a 21 day devotional. This devotional explores 21 specific instances of injustice from St. Louis's history through scripture, confession, prophetic declaration, and a promise. # Engage Injustice (cont'd)

### **Consultancy: Bridgetown Church**

In 2022, Bridgetown Church created the role of Justice & Mercy Fellow for our CEO in a consultant arrangement. Through this collaboration, he has traveled to Portland for 5-7 days of every month in order to fulfill the following:

- Create a prayer fueled, missional culture of Reconciliation, Justice, and Mercy within Bridgetown Church
- Architect the development and use of the Bridgetown Justice Center.
- Solidify and establish key justice and mercy partnerships that represent the intersection between the city's needs and Bridgetown's heart and resources.
- Develop a team of leaders that can carry out the work of Justice, Reconciliation, and Mercy on the ground and among the congregation.
- Identify and mentor a person that could become the Pastor of Justice & Mercy at Bridgetown Church.
- Lay a solid foundation for the expressions of Justice, Reconciliation, and Mercy that Bridgetown Church can continue to build on for years to come.
- Lead, plan, and execute various collaborative events at and through Bridgetown with local and global partners, as well as other local churches.
- Develop and oversee Justice & Mercy deacons including management of finances and vision, empowering a healthy team to champion these values in their various expressions throughout our church.




- Pastorally care for and coach Justice & Mercy
  Deacons, so that they flourish personally through
  leadership and service and so that they steadily
  grow in leadership capacity.
- Oversee and direct strong relationships with our community partners through deacons, volunteers, financial generosity, presence, celebration, and shared mission.
- Build and Sustain strong partnerships with national and global partners, creating healthy communication in expectations of engagement, reporting, needs and opportunities, and financial giving.
- Work with Bridgetown staff, leaders, and individuals to educate and equip them to step towards various areas of injustice.
- Coordinate, lead, and execute collaborative justice-focused events and initiatives.

# Engage Injustice (cont'd)

After a robust three month process of reconnaissance, assessing the needs of the city and the callings of the church community, JT began a six month innovation process. The end result was a clear departmental structure for Bridgetown's Justice ministry which is expressed on the following "Wheels of Justice". Each "spoke" on the wheel represents an area of mercy within which Bridgetown is committed to "take action" with prayer as the hub that makes the wheels turn.

### Build Bridges



#### Tabernacle as One

From October 9 - 17, Civil Righteousness partnered with Return Ministries, Altar of Prayer, Jesus Meetings, and M1 Bank to host a weeklong Feast of Tabernacles Celebration in historic Forest Park, St. Louis. Intercessors from all over the world convened in person and online for this powerful expression of unity. Just a few of the highlights include the beautiful Friday evening Shabbat dinner, daily Torah reading, traditional Jewish dances, and hours of anointed worship, prayer, and powerful teaching.

Just a few days before on October 5th, these same ministries partnered together to host a 24 hour worship and prayer tent in historic Kinloch for Yom Kippur (Day of Atonement). Kinloch, a once prosperous African American city, has become collateral damage from airport expansions and is now used as a literal, illegal garbage dump, with less than 300 residents remaining. Since the Body of Christ has begun to regularly prayer walk through that city since March of 2022, God has been moving on behalf of the city in stunning ways!

# Mobilize Missions



#### The Send

On May 14, Civil RIghteousness hosted an info table at The Send - KC, which was a massive stadium gathering to mobilize for missions. JT led a powerful segment on reconciliation and global missions during the gathering. Holy activists from around the nation served at the CR table and shared about our movement with the hundreds of individuals who stopped by for more information.

- A platform enabling entrepreneurs to pitch business ideas to potential investors and team members.
- Start-up resources to help get business ventures off the ground.


