E-GIVING

In order to set up e-giving, please use the QR code to the left or visit our website at www.redlionzion.com and follow the link on the homepage to sign into your ChurchTrac account with your email. Please note, you must be set up in our system, with an email listed, in order to sign in. If you are in our directory, or have given to us before, you are most likely already in our system and are able to follow the link to set up your giving from there. If not, please contact Shawn Stine at .

Under Red Lion Zion, on the left of the screen, you will find three small lines. These bring up a menu. Click online giving. ** Please use a ACH/Debit option (routing/checking # only) as we are not accepting credit cards at this time. This includes debit cards and credits, even f they are linked to your checking, as they cost us much more to process. We can't eliminate

the option to sign up that way, but ask that you do not use it. It is very important to make sure you sign up using your routing/checking info and not card info. To sign out, click only right side of the screen.

Stewardship Corner

The Stewardship Corner, from time-to-time, will provide ways to support our church. This note is to suggest the qualified charitable distribution or QCD. Do you have an IRA? Are you 70 1/2 years old or older? Did you know you can transfer from your IRA to a qualified charity, such as the church, tax-free? Normally, distributions from a traditional IRA are taxable when received. With a QCD, however, these contributions become tax-free as long as they are paid directly from the IRA to an eligible charity. Transferred amounts are not taxable, and no deduction is available for the transfer. The transfer may be considered part of your required minimum distribution (RMD). Should you be interested in learning more please call the church office or check with the holder of your IRA.


The Zion Lion: December/January 25-26 CHRISTMAS GREETINGS FOR RED LION ZION CHURCH The Who, What, When, Where, and Why of Christmas "Joy to the world, the Lord has come"! This is why we celebrate! I think you'd all agree that television show themes go through phases. A number of years ago, medical shows were top rated shows. Then there are those about the law. Forensic Crime scene investigators, or CSIs are kept busy everywhere, looking for answers. We're going to look for answers about an event that happened over 2000 years ago. The first questions is WHAT? What exactly did happen over 2000 years ago that changed my life and yours, and in fac still has an impact on our world today? It was the birth of a baby boy! The prophet, Isaiah, foretold of the birth of a Savior, Emmanuel, God with us. An Angel made the announcement to Mary in Luke 1:28-31. "The Angel came to her and said, Peace be with you! The Lord is with you and has greatly blessed you". Mary was deeply troubled by the angel's message, and she wondered what these words meant. Susan's Music Notes



"As long as I am in the world, I am the light of the world." John 9:5

Christmas Eve services were set for 1818 in Oberndorf, Austria. The song the world has come to know as "Silent Night" was going to be played and sung for the first time by two men who composed its lyrics and melody—-



Joseph Mohr and Franz Xaver Gruber.

Gruber, a schoolteacher, was also the parish church organist in Oberndorf and Mohr was the church's assistant priest. On Christmas Eve day, Mohr gave Gruber a poem he had written and asked Gruber to set it to music.

Amazingly, he put the melody to the poem that same day and the two sang it

Christmas Eve as they stood beside the church's Nativity scene.

As Mohr's and Gruber's careers took them to many other towns across Austria, the song went with them. The song spread as people carried it on European trips, even performing it before Austria's emperor and Russia's czar. A singing family known as the Rainers took the song to the US and

in 1839 performed it for the first time in New York!

"Silent Night" was first published for congregational singing in 1838 in a German hymnbook. It was used in America by German-speaking congregations and then appeared in its English form in a book of

Sunday School songs in 1863. How blessed we are to have

this beautiful melody to share each Christmas season.
