To finish our VBS with a "splash," we hosted a BBQ and swim party at the Louisburg pool. The event was well attended and the families and children were in high spirits as they were treated to the new and updated facilities at the pool!

GRADUATION AND MOTHER'S DAY - The Board of Christian Education provided on Sunday, May 11th, a Pastries & Yogurt Parfait Bar to honor both our 2025 graduates as well as the ladies in our church in honor of Mother's Day. At the request of the Board of Christian Education, the Board of Deacons agreed to sponsor funding gift baskets to our high school graduates, Layne Vest and Lacy Burton, in recognition of their graduation achievement and in benevolence to starting the new chapters in their lives.

VACATION BIBLE SCHOOL - Held the week of June 9-13 - with a theme of True North. It was a great week with over 100 children attending.

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BOARD OF TRUSTEES by Mike Stegeman, secretary—

Board of Trustees Quarterly Report - 2nd quarter An annual Trustee maintenance item in the 2nd quarter includes the resumption of the mowing schedule for the Rockville property perimeter. We are considering the installation of permanent in-ground sign post sockets for VBS signs to limit the possibility of severing the numerous underground utility lines at the corner of Rockville and 68 highway. The Flologic water control system has been turned on and is monitoring possible water leaks in the system. A number of church repairs were made including: re-attaching the trim above the double door near the office, a fixed latch in the ladies restroom, repair of the coffee station door, and the addition of a 90" shelf in the Deaconess's closet. There has been discussion of placing a door activator switch in the ladies restroom to allow easier exiting for those in wheelchairs. The sanctuary handrails are now in use and can be easily removed if needed. The church has obtained Out of Service tags to alert anyone of an appliance or situation that is dangerous and should not be used until it has been serviced. The Board is continuing to research the church van situation and there are a number of financial and physical barriers that still need to be addressed to make it a viable option. The replacement of the convection oven and freezer in the kitchen is being researched and new options were just mentioned recently that might help us in this quest. A new Trustee monthly maintenance list will soon be posted across from the pastors' offices to remind us of scheduled maintenance items that need to be addressed.
