#### ASPARAGUS APPETIZER

from the kitchen of Dorothy Gardner

This recipe is a favorite at our spring family gatherings.

12 slices white bread 8 slices bacon, fried, drained and crumbled

2 packages(8 ounces each) cream cheese, softened

12 asparagus spears, cooked and cooled Melted hutter

Trim the crusts from the bread and roll with a rolling pin to flatten slightly. Blend bacon bits with cream cheese and spread the mixture on the bread slices. Lay a cold, cooked asparagus spear on each slice of bread and roll up. Place on a baking sheet, seam side down. Brush with the melted butter and toast in a broiler or oven until lightly browned. Serves 12.



# ABW Bible Book of the Month Malachi

Malachi is the last book of the Old Testament and one of the twelve minor prophets. It is a short prophetic book consisting of four chapters, written around the 5th century BC.

#### Synopsis:

The Book of Malachi is a series of prophetic messages delivered by the prophet Malachi, addressing the spiritual and moral decline of Israel after the return from Babylonian exile. The book is structured as a dialogue between God and the people, featuring a series of disputes where God makes a statement, the people question it, and God responds with evidence.

#### Key Themes:

- God's Love and Israel's Ingratitude: The book opens with God declaring His love for Israel, contrasting it with the rejection of Edom.
- Corrupt Priesthood: Malachi criticizes the priests for offering blemished sacrifices and for not honoring God properly, calling for reform and faithfulness.
- Faithlessness of the People: The people are accused of social injustice, infidelity (especially in marriage), and withholding tithes and offerings.
- Coming Day of the Lord: The book ends with a
  promise of judgment and purification. It foretells the
  coming of a messenger (seen by Christians as a
  prophecy of John the Baptist) who will prepare the
  way for the Lord.

#### Closing Prophecy:

Malachi concludes with a warning about the "great and dreadful day of the Lord" and a promise that the prophet Elijah will return to turn hearts and bring reconciliation.
