The apostle Paul says in 1 Corinthians 8:

If someone knows God, then he is loved by God. So, eating meat that was offered to idols doesn't matter, because those idols aren't real gods.



But, on this issue some people have a weak conscience and others have a strong one.

The strong conscience says: "This isn't sinful. I don't believe in fake gods, so it's okay."

The weak conscience says: "This is sinful, because it's connected to pagan (false god) practices."

The strong are strong because they know the one true God and understand what is really sin. The weak are weak because they don't see that false-god practices have no real power over God's people (as long as nothing clearly sinful is involved).

Some people have asked me what I think about Halloween. Is it wrong for children to dress up and get candy, since Halloween has roots in pagan practices?

My answer is not my own, but what Paul teaches.

Those with a strong conscience know that kids dressing up, pretending, and getting candy are not sinful just because it happens on October 31. They know the one true God, and they understand these things are neutral—not good or bad by themselves.

Those with a weak conscience, though, may feel it's sinful because they connect it to false gods and their practices.

And that's okay.

Paul says that whatever you choose, you should do it with a clear conscience.

If you think it's wrong, then you should avoid it—because doing something you believe is sinful will make it sin for you.

But if you know it's not sinful, then do it in a way that honors God and keeps peace with others in the church (see 1 Cor. 8).

What are you afraid of? That question becomes more relevant as we get closer to Halloween. This season is full of opportunities for those who enjoy being scared. Haunted houses, scary movies, terrifying costumes, and so much more await those who seek an adrenaline rush.



But what are we as Jesus followers REALLY supposed to be afraid of?

There are a host of things in today's world that can cause fear: we hear of burglaries, kidnappings, shootings, disease, economic collapse, and natural disasters happening every day. Not to mention the unwelcome news of wars, political unrest, and tragedies happening all over the globe.

So, what if we are afraid because of all these things?

As Jesus was sending out His disciples, He warned them it would be a difficult (scary) assignment. He sent them out as "sheep among wolves." They went without money, a change of clothes, or even a walking stick. But Jesus did not send them without hope.

"Don't be afraid of those who want to kill your body; they cannot touch your soul. Fear only God, who can destroy both soul and body in hell. What is the price of two sparrows—one copper coin? But not a single sparrow can fall to the ground without your Father knowing it. So don't be afraid; you are more valuable to God than a whole flock of sparrows. Matthew 10:28-29,31

Here Jesus is reminding them (and us) that God's perfect love NEVER leaves or forsakes us, even when something terrifying strikes. We can trust Him to be in control even when things seem at their most chaotic. Even if we can't see His hand in it, we can always trust His heart.

So again, I ask you, what are you afraid of?

APPLE CRISP

from the kitchen of Marsha Phillips 8 cups sliced apples 1 cup sugar

Mix together, put in a 9x13 pan.

Topping:

1 cup flour

11/2 cups brown sugar

3 teaspoons cinnamon

1 teaspoon salt

3 cups quick oats

Mix well in bowl.

Add to the topping ingredients:

1 cup melted butter (note: I add melted butter slowly to get the consistency I want.)

Bake at 375 degrees for 30-40 minutes.



ABW Bible Book of the Month Leviticus

The book of **Leviticus**, the third book of the Bible, serves as a guide for Israel to live in covenant relationship with a holy God. It continues the story after Exodus, where God's presence filled the tabernacle, and explains how His people can draw near to Him while remaining holy.

Leviticus begins with instructions for various sacrifices (burnt, grain, fellowship, sin, and guilt offerings), showing how atonement and thanksgiving are expressed (chapters 1–7).

It then describes the consecration of Aaron and his sons as priests (8–10), highlighting the seriousness of approaching God in the proper way.

Laws of ritual purity (11-15) distinguish between clean and unclean foods, conditions, and practices, marking Israel as set apart.

At the center of the book stands the **Day of Atonement** (chapter 16), a yearly ceremony in which the high priest enters the Holy of Holies to atone for the sins of the whole nation.

The second half, often called the **Holiness Code** (chapters 17–26), provides moral, social, and religious laws that cover worship, justice, sexuality, festivals, and care for the poor.

The final chapter (27) outlines vows and dedications to the Lord.

The central theme is God's holiness: because God is holy, His people must also live holy lives in every aspect of worship and conduct. Leviticus emphasizes atonement through sacrifice, obedience to God's commands, and the call to be distinct from the surrounding nations.

Kihomi Ngwemi & Nzunga Mabudiga Dominican Republic September 2025

Greetings! Many of you have been wondering about the whereabout of Nzunga and Kihomi. Thank you for your concern, prayers and support. We do not take your love for us and our ministries for granted. We have always appreciated every gesture you pause for us.

We are still in mission serving Almighty God in Haiti and the Dominican Republic. Beside spending time in different doctor's offices, Kihomi went to the Democratic Republic of Congo to visit her aged mother who had a stroke that has left her completely paralyzed on the left side. The day Kihomi arrived to greet the mother, it was the day she was going to exit this world. Thanks to Kihomi's quick thinking and action, the mother is still alive and doing relatively well for her situation and age. What was going to kill my mother-in-law? Malaria and dehydration. Kihomi's visit to the Congo was like a visiting nurse. She spent time visiting and praying for the sicks and shuts in.

While Kihomi was in Congo, I went to Haiti and spent almost three weeks working at the eye clinic. I was impressed by how the staff carry themselves at work. It seems that everybody has mastered the lesson learned from watching THE ANTS in Proverbs 6:6. No need to tell them what to do. At 6:00 a.m. people were lining up at the door to wait for when doors officially opened. The building is run down and there is no way to use it for medical purposes. It is built two feet from the ocean bay, salty air hit it hard. The roofs need to be replaced. It is the only eye clinic that doesn't turn anyone away. Due to poor health care and unrelenting sun, children get cataracts at an early age. Please pray that we can find a way to restore the building.
