

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

"Tis the Season!"

The phrase comes from a Christmas song you may remember, *Deck the Hall*, and can be seen often at this time of the year. "Tis the Season" for Black Friday sales, Small Business Saturday, and Cyber Monday savings. These all come on the heals of Thanksgiving and seem to take away from the concept of giving Thanks.

For our Thanksgiving service, and for Wednesday and Sunday school, each person received a small note card to write what they were thankful for, inviting them to hang the note on the rail in the hallway next to Fellowship Hall. (pictured below) I invite you to stop by and read those that have been hung up and take a note card to add your thanks to

those hanging there.

The main theme appears to be thanks for family and friends. It's true when we think about Thanksgiving and Christmas, we most often think about how good it is to be together with our families. Paul understood this saying, "I do not cease to give thanks for you, remembering you in my prayers." (Ephesians 1: 16) and "We give thanks to God always for you, constantly mentioning you in our prayers," (1 Thessalonians 1:2)

We of course are thankful for many things, but family and friends are truly important in our lives. There are of course all the traditional needs a family provides such as food, clothing, and shelter, but research tells us there is an important social connection that family provides, a sense of belonging and acceptance, especially in difficult times.

Children learn about family from the experience they have growing up. After basic needs are met, they realize that social connection through the support and encouragement they receive to overcome difficulties, face new challenges, and obtain various skills to have a successful life.

All things the church family does for one another.

God knew we needed people as we read in Genesis 2: "<sup>18</sup>Then the LORD God said, "It is not good that the man should be alone; I will make him a helper fit for him." Our need to belong and have a relationship is in our make-up. The church plants the seed, but our church family is there to help that seed grow through faith-based relationship and a sense of belonging as a child of God.



Our church family is where we receive the support and encouragement to grow in Christ through faith formation at all ages and to teach us the importance of being responsible to love and care for one another.

The early church wrote of this in Acts 2: "<sup>46</sup>And day by day, attending the temple together and breaking bread in their homes, they received their food with glad and generous hearts, <sup>47</sup>praising God and having favor with all the people. And the Lord added to their number day by day those who were being saved."

At this time of year, and always, be thankful for your family, including your church family. Like building school spirit and closely tied support of your college team, it builds a sense of community and encourages each other through a positive environment.

Paul writes to the Romans, "11 For I long to see you, that I may impart to you some spiritual gift to

strengthen you-- 12 that is, that we may be mutually encouraged by each other's faith, both yours and mine."

As you join together as family for the holidays, be Thankful for the gift God has giving to you in that baby in a manger. And remember... "Tis the Season" to be thankful for your family, including your church family, as we come to celebrate and give thanks for greatest gift of all.

"Let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts, to which indeed you were called in one body. And be thankful." (Colossians 3: 15)

The Grace Lutheran Church Council meeting was held on Thursday November 9, 2023, at 6pm with Mark Briley presiding. Also present: Adam Wientjes, Dylan Jordan, LeRoy Bullis, Terra Koistinen, Travis Schulz, Sherry Jongeling, Ted Frost, Ronda Lorenz, Pastor Cheryl Rondeau-Bassett, and Kat Anderson. Absent: JoAnn Spartz Lindsey Moeller, Kelly Evjen, Gena Urvig, and Steve Schlenner

A motion to approve the agenda was made by Rhonda Lorenz and seconded by LeRoy Bullis. Motion carried. Sherry Jongeling motioned to approve the minutes with a revision to last month: Gena was not listed; Dylan Jordan seconded. Motion carried.

#### Items:

**Financial Report** – Kat Anderson reported the total monthly income to the general fund was \$20,500.90, the weekly giving average was \$4,090, and the average weekly worship attendance was 82 for the month of October. A motion to accept the financial report and pay the bills was made by Dylan Jordan and seconded by Travis Schulz. Motion carried.

**Pastor's Report** –Pastor Cheryl Rondeau-Bassett continues to visit care centers and assisted living homes. She had 2 home visits, 1 Baptism, 1 funeral, 2 committal ceremonies, 1 wedding, and continues to teach confirmation and do the opening for Wednesday and Sunday School.

#### **Old Business:**

Open Council Seats-There is still an open council seat. We also need to start thinking of those whose term ends in January to fill their seats.

Upcoming Budget- The council agreed upon the presented budget. Rhonda Lorenze made a motion to accept this version of the budget and present it to the congregation for vote at the annual meeting. Seconded by Adam Wientjes. Motion carried.

#### **New Business:**

- 1. Head Usher/Ushering Duties We are looking for a head usher to take responsibility for contacting and scheduling ushers, backup ushers, communion assistants, and readers. We also need more adults to volunteer to be with the youth that are ushering to help them.
- 2. Youth Gathering Funds- The GLC Youth Group is going to New Orleans with the ELCA Youth Gathering in July 2024. They have had one fundraiser so far but need to raise more funds. The goal is to raise all the money so that families do not have to pay out of pocket for their kids to experience this wonderful opportunity.

Foundation- Foundation Sunday on November 12.

**Fellowship & Outreach** – Trunk or Treat on Oct. 29<sup>th</sup> went well. Ran out of candy and quit early. Planning on participating in the lighted parade and a chili cookoff in January.

**Finance & Stewardship** – RaiseRight has an app to purchase SCRIP. Individuals and families can purchase SCRIP and have instant access digitally on their phone. Ask Kat for more information.

**Preschool** – Going well. They will join the church kiddos at the Christmas program.

**Property** – LeRoy called Mack Concrete to make sure we are still on their list, they are looking at the 2<sup>nd</sup> week of December.

**Safety** – An accident on the property has been reported.

Worship & Music- All is well.

Dylan Jordan motioned to adjourn the meeting; Rhonda Lorenz seconded the motion.

The meeting was adjourned with the Lord's Prayer.






