Minutes of the Grace Lutheran Council Meeting on Thursday December 14, 2023

The Grace Lutheran Church Council meeting was held on Thursday December 14, 2023, at 6pm with Mark Briley presiding. Also present: Killy Evjen, Ted Frost, Sherry Jongeling, Gena Urevig, LeRoy Bullis, Rhonda Lorenz, Dylan Jordan, Lindsey Moeller, Travis Schulz, and Terra Koistinen. Absent: Pastor Cheryl Rondeau-Bassett, Kat Anderson, Adam Wientjes, and Steve Schlenner. Opening by Mark Briley, and roll call by Dylan Jordan. A motion to approve the agenda was made by Terra Koistinenand seconded by Rhonda Lorenz. Motion carried. Dylan Jordan motioned to approve the minutes from November, and Travis Schulz seconded. Motion carried.

Items:

Financial Report – Dylan Jordan read a report given by Kat Anderson The total monthly income to the general fund was \$17,405, the weekly giving average was \$4,351. The average weekly worship attendance for Sunday was 95, and Wednesday was 29. A motion to accept the financial report and pay the bills was made by Kelly Evjen and seconded by Travis Schulz. Motion carried.

A discussion was had about how to more securely handle the transfer of money after church services. Kat suggested putting a drop safe in the Sacristy; and provided different options to look at and discuss. A motion to purchase a drop safe for \$219.99 plus tax was made by Dylan Jordan, seconded by Kelly Evjen. Motion carried.

Pastor's Report – Mark Briley went over the report provided by Pastor Cheryl Rondeau-Bassett continues to visit care centers and assisted living homes. and continues to teach confirmation and do the opening for Wednesday and Sunday School. There are also a lot of Christmas services. including Christmas Eve services at 4 and 6 PM and a 10 AM service on Christmas Day.

Old Business:

- 1. Open Council Seats-There are still open council seats. JoAnn Spartz resigned from the council. We also need to start thinking of those whose term ends in January to fill their seats. Please feel free to contact Grace if you are interested, or know someone who would be.
- 2. Upcoming Budget- The council agreed upon the presented budget last month, but insurance informed us of rate increases. A motion was made by Dylan Jordan and seconded by Travis Schulz to table it till January when we get the final numbers. motion carried.

New Business:

- 1. Head Usher/Ushering Duties We are looking for a head usher to take responsibility for contacting and scheduling ushers, backup ushers, communion assistants, and readers. We also need more adults to volunteer to be with the youth that are ushering to help them.
- 2. Annual Meeting-- A motion to have one service on January 21st, 2024 at 10:30 AM with the annual meeting after. Then a potluck to follow was made by Dylan Jordan, seconded by Rhonda Lorenz. Motion carried.
- 3. Committee Reports--- A reminder that committee reports are due by the end of the day Monday, January 8th, 2024.
- 4. Staff support-- A motion to make the business administrator to report to the executive committee on daily duties and job tasks was made by Travis Schultz and seconded by Kelly Evjen. Motioned carried. A motion to update the business administrators' job description was made by Dylan Jordan, and seconded by Sherry Jongeling.
- 5. Choir/Multipurpose Room Funds-- We still need funding to finish the flooring in the Multipurpose room. After discussion of different options. A motion was made to wait for more donations to come in, and re-visit it in a month or 2 by Dylan Jordan, seconded by Travis Schulz. Motion passed.
- 5. Executive Session: A motion to go into the executive session to discuss Church personnel was made by Lindsey Moeller and seconded by Travis Schulz. Motion carried. A motion to leave the executive session was made by Dylan Jordan and seconded by Mark Briley.

Committee Reports:

Education, Youth, & Family – Dylan reported that the Christmas program went well. We would like to give a special thank you to Kat Anderson for going above and beyond to organize it all and direct the program. Also, youth activities are now on break till the new year.

Foundation- The first quarter meeting will be in March, more details soon.

Fellowship & Outreach – Chilli cook-off January 20th. \$5 entry fee. Some volunteers are working on a Valentine's day dinner for February 10th. more details to come.

Finance & Stewardship – RaiseRight has an app to purchase SCRIP. Individuals and families can purchase SCRIP and have instant access digitally on their phones. Ask Kat for more information. Also working on a Car Show, and coffee bar.

Preschool – Going well. They joined the church kiddos at the Christmas program.

Property – Concrete in multipurpose room is poured!! Now we are discussing flooring, details listed above.

Safety – Dylan Jordan and Adam Wientjes are working on organizing various safety training for staff and teachers, updating background checks, and installing safety equipment we have had for Sunday school rooms.

Worship & Music- All is well.

Lindsey Moeller motioned to adjourn the meeting; Rhonda Lorenz seconded the motion.

Also present: Pastor Cheryl Rondeau-Bassett, Kat Anderson. Absent: Ted Frost, Gena Urevig, LeRoy Bullis, and Steve Schlenner. Opening by Pastor Cheryl Rondeau-Bassett and roll call by Dylan Jordan. A motion to approve the agenda was made by Rhonda Lorenz and seconded by Dylan Jordan. Motion carried. Lindsey Groon motioned to approve the minutes from December, and Travis Schulz seconded. Motion carried.

Items:

Financial Report – The total monthly income to the general fund was \$40,252 thanks to Year End Giving and some generous gifts, the weekly giving average was \$8,050. The average weekly worship attendance for Sunday was 82, and Wednesday was 13. A motion to accept the financial report and pay the bills was made by Dylan Jordan and seconded by Adam Wientjes. Motion carried.

Pastor's Report – Pastor performed 3 funerals, had 3 special services, as well as continued to visit care centers and nursing homes. Pastor reported on Olena, the newest refugee from Ukraine. Pastor is working on youth fundraisers as well as preparing for the upcoming Lenten season.

Old Business:

- 1. Open Council Seats-At the time of the meeting the nominees lined up were Kelly Evjen and Adam Wientjes returning, and new candidates were Nicole Hoppe, Paul Henrichs, and Denise Biller.
- 2. Upcoming Budget- Dylan Jordan motioned to present the budget to the congregation at the Annual Meeting on January 21st, 2024. Rhonda Lorenz seconded the motion. Motion carried.

New Business:

- 1. Tri-Fold Pamphlets Tri-fold Pamphlets were created for committees through instruction from Sherry Jongeling. The question was where to print and who was responsible for payment. Adam Wientjes proposed that we print at a professional printer and it will come out of the advertisement budget. Dylan Jordan seconded the motion. Motion carried.
- 2. Annual Meeting Agenda Kat Anderson asked if there were any additions to the agenda. The council would like an area to "Meet the nominees" so that the members of the congregation can see who they are voting for. Kat said she will try to make that happen within the timeline.
- 3. Northern Prairie Arts Council The NPAC would like to use our commercial kitchen to host some baking classes occasionally throughout the year. They had mentioned giving a donation towards utility usage when a class is hosted here. Adam Wientjes motioned to approve the use of the kitchen for hosting classes through NPAC. Seconded by Travis Schulz. Motion carried.

Committee Reports:

Education, Youth, & Family – Youth Fun Night on Jan 19th. Kids are singing on Jan 21st.

Foundation- They had their annual meeting in January. Foundation grant request forms are available in the church office and are due, also at the office, on February 15th.

Fellowship & Outreach - Chili cook-off January 20th. \$5 entry fee. Celebration of Love Dinner for February 10th.

Finance & Stewardship – Planning the Car Show for 2nd Weekend in June. Looking into doing a stewardship presentation.

Mission – Meeting in January. Reminder to put your pennies in the can when you walking to service on Sundays!

Memorial – End of year meeting. Looking into new advent wreaths. Printing tri-fold pamphlets.

Preschool – T-shirt fundraiser is wrapping.

Property – Working on lighting in multi-purpose room.

Safety – Looking into background checks and CPR training for staff, volunteers, and people of the community.

Staff Support – Updating Kat's job description and recommended we start looking to fill the open positions in the office. Staff support asked the executive committee to consider giving Kat additional pay for performing many of the duties of Youth Director since it did require additional hours outside the scope of her job description of Business Administrator. Executive committee said they would consider the proposal and asked for specific numbers.

Worship & Music- Kids sing on January 21st.

Information items:

Questions were brought up about the Ukraine fund as Pastor Cheryl was giving her Pastor's Report. Pastor Cheryl had told council that Olena was here but didn't say if she was our responsibility or not. Pastor Cheryl explained that Jennifer and Tyler Moos filled out an application for Olena after her original application for Olean was not responded to. The approval of the application happened while Pastor Cheryl was on vacation and Olena bought her own plane ticket. She lived with Mr. & Mrs. Moos as soon as she got to the U.S. At some point Olena decided that she wanted to live in Watertown. When Mr. & Mrs. Moos filled out the application, they had Grace Lutheran Church's Refugee Fund as proof of support. Kelly Evjen asked Pastor Cheryl how many applications are in for Grace to support. Pastor Cheryl said she did not know off the top of her head but said "a few". She said that couple from Grace filled out an application on someone that was already applied for in attempt to speed up the process. Question: What if there are 10 applications in, and approved, and we cannot support them? Pastor Cheryl responded that we would be either telling them no if they were approved, or contacting Freedom's Haven. The council also asked what happens if the account reaches zero. Pastor Cheryl again said that we could contact Freedom's Haven, or do fundraisers to increase the balance. She noted that other churches in the area have donated to this fund and it is not Grace Lutheran Church members only. When asked how long we were financially responsible for the people we sponsor, Pastor Cheryl said they are on probation for two years. Additionally, members of the council requested that Pastor Cheryl seek approval from the council before any more applications are submitted.

Before adjournment Adam Wientjes asked if the church could send flowers to Jessica Fischer's funeral. Her husband is a police officer and he asked if we could show support since we do other things for officers as well. Adam made a motion to spend \$50 on flowers. Terra Koistinen seconded. Motion carried.

Rhonda Lorenz motioned to adjourn the meeting; Adam Wientjes seconded the motion. The meeting was adjourned with the Lord's Prayer.





Community Lenten Services Start February 21st


