She has a Master's degree in Primary Education, Lecturer of Pedagogy and Methods of Primary Education and been a Primary School Teacher for 12 years. A meet and greet is planned for Sunday morning January 7th at 9:30 am during coffee. We invite everyone to come out to meet Olena and welcome her to our community.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

We are once again at that special time of year. That time to make a New Year's resolution. We know that means we start the year out with a firm decision to do or not to do something as defined by the dictionary.

Some make a resolution to go to the gym more. Others resolve to go on a diet (that one I make most often). And many resolutions are made to improve their diet, quit smoking, spend more time with family or in meditation, cut down on drinking, spend less time on social me-

dia, volunteer more and a list of other things. Once in a while, someone may make a resolution to attend church more. I like that one.

Resolutions are not new. Scripture holds some resolutions for us, especially in Proverbs on how to live a wise life.

- ¹³ Joyful is the person who finds wisdom, the one who gains understanding.
- ¹⁴ For wisdom is more profitable than silver, and her wages are better than gold.
- ¹⁵ Wisdom is more precious than rubies; nothing you desire can compare with her.
- ¹⁶ She offers you long life in her right hand, and riches and honor in her left.
- ¹⁷ She will guide you down delightful paths; all her ways are satisfying.
- ¹⁸ Wisdom is a tree of life to those who embrace her; happy are those who hold her tightly. (Proverbs 3) and from 19 we read: "²⁰ Get all the advice and instruction you can, so you will be wise the rest of your life."

Why is it so hard to keep New Year's Resolutions? According to MUIH.edu (Maryland University Integrative Health) "our brains are programmed to seek pleasure and avoid pain." making it difficult to change for many reasons. We aren't really sold on the reason we should change or we have become so used to immediate gratification that we give up when we don't find immediate or nearly immediate results.

Dr. Melissa Ming Foynes, PhD explains in an article, "Why New Year's Resolutions Are So Easy to Fail," resolutions fail because of how our brain works. She explains that willpower take more mental work than actions "that are automatic".

The article goes on to explain how connecting small steps to something you do daily can help you achieve an automatic action that reprograms your brain to seek a new behavior. For example, if your resolution is to read the Bible every day, connect it to something you do every day, such as having your morning coffee.

Timothy writes of resolve, "¹⁶ All Scripture is inspired by God and is useful to teach us what is true and to make us realize what is wrong in our lives. It corrects us when we are wrong and teaches us to do what is right. ¹⁷ God uses it to prepare and equip his people to do every good work." (2Ti 3)

We can't read all scripture in one setting, and we don't generally understand everything the first time we read it. Scripture is the living word of God and speaks to us in different ways at different times according to our needs. That requires us to read it over time and continually to let it speak to us. In other words, it takes work, as does changing our behavior as 2 Timothy 2: 15 writes: "Work hard so you can present yourself to God and receive his approval. Be a good worker, one who does not need to be ashamed and who correctly explains the word of truth."

It is the same for making a resolution to attend worship, to volunteer, or to give more financially to the church, it takes work to make the change. But it can be done by taking little steps such as setting a goal to attend one Sunday a month and then increasing it to two and so on. Or volunteering on one committee or one activity and then finding other ways to offer your time. Perhaps you have given the same amount each week for several years and so by giving a small increase once a month to start you could increase your giving over time.

Putting God and the church first in your life takes work and determination, but we are told in Matthew 6: 33 "Seek the Kingdom of God above all else, and live righteously, and he will give you everything you need."

It is difficult to change, especially in this world where self-satisfaction has such a high priority as warned of in Act 20: 28 telling you "So guard yourselves and God's people. Feed and shepherd God's flock-- his church, purchased with his own blood-- over which the Holy Spirit has appointed you as elders." And by Proverbs 16:25 "There is a path before each person that seems right, but it ends in death."

So you must "12Commit yourself to instruction; listen carefully to words of knowledge." (Proverbs 23) to not only help you with the work of making resolutions of change for the good of your soul, but to help you be more successful to wrestle against the evil forces of this world and the struggles of the flesh, as scripture tells us.

May your New Year be prosperous and filled with hope and love of God to fill your hearts.

Rental Property:

It was decided to not pay for the repairs out of the Capital Improvement Funds. Becky Knadle is working on the insurance. It was requested to ask Citi Wide to see if we are at market rent.

Church Update:

The Christmas program and bake sale are planned in December. The floor in the choir room has been filled in and they need to get new carpeting installed.


Annual Report and Board Election.

Grace Lutheran Church Foundation Report January 28, 2024

The purpose of the Foundation is to receive gifts, bequests, and memorials; while expending only the earnings and the interest on these investments. These expenditures are for educational, charitable and religious work within the activities of Grace Lutheran Church, as well as other outside deserving organizations, who have made application for assistance.

2023 was a very good year as far as investment returns were concerned. The amount of money available for distribution from 2023 earnings will be slightly lower from 2022. Since its inception in 1968, the Foundation has distributed over \$1,600,000.00 dollars to worthy causes on behave of Grace Lutheran Church. A list of grant recipients for 2023 is available upon request. Applications for grants for 2024 are available in the Church office or from a member of the Foundation Board. Grant requests need to be submitted by February 15, 2024. Grant requests will be reviewed at the March meeting of the Foundation Board.

Foundation properties continue to receive some needed repairs and updates this past year. The Foundation will continue to look at upgrading the properties to maintain their value and make them more inviting for renters. Throughout 2023 the occupancy rate of the units has been high. Management of the rental property is contracted to Citi-Wide Property Management, Inc.

The nominating committee has recommended Joy Nelson and Larry Picht to fulfill new 3-year terms on the Foundation Board. Other Board members who continue to serve in good standing are Will Morlock, Bonnie Oletzke, Rich Dunn, and Becky Knadle; Lindsey Goon and Gena Urvig(Church Council) and Geri Mohror (GLCW representative).

The Board sincerely appreciates the generosity of all donors to the Grace Lutheran Church Foundation. We need to remember all gifts to the Foundation are added to the Foundation asset base, and as the Foundation grows, so does our ability to further the work and mission of Grace Lutheran Church. Thank you all for your support.
