Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Spring. Where is it?

We wait and wait. Now that the snow if finally melted it would be nice to be outside but the breeze that blows often feels like it's coming off an iceberg.

Our refugee family is experiencing waiting due to corrections that had to be made on their immigration form. There is not a correction document to file, you just must start over and that takes time. Waiting is very difficult. But they have been in difficult situations before, as most of you have been.

It must have been very difficult for the disciples to wait during those three days after Jesus died on the cross wondering what was next before His resurrection. When Jesus returned to "open their eyes" and give them the gift of the Holy Spirit, they found themselves once again waiting, as they watched Him ascend into heaven. It took them a little time to gather their thoughts and move forward even as they watched Him vanish.

¹⁰ While he was going and they were gazing up toward heaven, suddenly two men in white robes stood by them. ¹¹ They said, "Men of Galilee, why do you stand looking up toward heaven? This Jesus, who has been taken up from you into heaven, will come in the same way as you saw him go into heaven." (Acts 1)

Of course, filled with the Holy Spirit they were like most enthusiastic pastors just coming out of seminary with their newly called placements eager to proclaim the gospel with great joy and excitement to save the world: ²⁰ And they went out and proclaimed the good news everywhere, while the Lord worked with them and confirmed the message by the signs that accompanied it. (Mark 16)

Waiting is difficult. But at times it is beneficial, especially for our faith. It helps us appreciate the things we wait for and obtain and to realize true value of an object waited for or an opportunity desired.

Waiting strengthen our trust in God. Psalm 27 tells us, "14 Wait for the LORD; be strong, and let your heart take courage; wait for the LORD!"

To wait means you believe God hears you and has your best interest at heart, "For surely I know the plans I have for you, says the LORD, plans for your welfare and not for harm, to give you a future with hope. (Jeremiah 29:11)

Waiting provides time to refocus your thoughts and reevaluate your need considering God's will which ask you to serve others by putting their needs above your own.

Our society has made it difficult to wait with internet and cell phones that give immediate answers and fast turn around to receive a desired object before you have time to determine if there is a better solution or more important purpose for your interest.

Pre-telephone times, when people wrote letters and waited for a response, created a cultural advantage for learning to wait in society.

Waiting is beneficial as God may even have something better planned for you as in the song, "Unanswered prayers," by Garth Brooks.

God uses waiting to change you from being impatient, anxious or self-centered, to become humble, thankful, and opens your eyes to the blessings you have already been given, freeing your heart from fears.

It comes as a blessing of faith.

The disciples had to wait for the Holy Spirit to come upon them on the first Pentecost day. When they did, they were filled with faith and trust to proclaim the risen Christ and do His will.

When we wait for God to answer, our faith is strengthened, and we are filled with faith and trust to do God's will, even when that will is not what we hoped for or comes as an unanswered prayer.

Waiting, learning to trust in God and His perfect timing give you a sense of peace. "²⁶But the Advocate, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you everything, and remind you of all that I have said to you. ²⁷ Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled, and do not let them be afraid." (John 14)

It is a peace that comes over you, beyond human understanding and pushes the anxiety and fear away. So today, wait upon the Lord, and you will receive His blessing.

Minutes of the Grace Lutheran Council Meeting on Thursday April 13th, 2023

The Grace Lutheran Church Council meeting was held on Thursday April 13th, 2023 at 6pm with Mark Briley Presiding. Also present was LeRoy Bullis, Terra Koistinen, Travis Schulz, Lindsey Moeller, Dylan Jordan, Steve Schlenner, Sherry Jongeling, Marian Raml, Ted Frost, Ronda Lorenz, Pastor Cheryl Rondeau-Bassett, and Kat Anderson. Absent were Kelly Evjen, Adam Wientjes, Kayla Mohling, Gena Urevig. The meeting began with scripture and prayer by Pastor Cheryl.

A motion to approve the agenda was made by Marian Raml and seconded by Rhonda Lorenz. Motion carried. A motion to approve the minutes for the March 9th, 2023 meeting was made by Dylan Jordan and seconded by Lindsey Moeller. Motion carried.

Items:

Financial Report – Kat Anderson reported the total monthly income to the general fund was \$20,525.10, the weekly giving average was \$5,131, and the average weekly worship attendance was 85 for the month of March. A motion to accept the financial report and pay the bills was made by Sherry Jongeling and seconded by Steve Schlenner. Motion carried.

Pastor's Report –Pastor Cheryl Rondeau-Bassett continues to visit care centers and assisted living homes. The community lent lunches went well during March. First communion classes were held and 3 children received 1st communion on Maunday Thursday. There were 2 services on Good Friday and 3 on Easter including one in Spanish. Pastor Cheryl got the okay from council to move to one service May 28-September 3rd.

Old Business:

Ukraine Refuge Sponsorship – The family is going to arrive April 30th and the young single man is going to arrive April 27th. We can start moving things into the apartment on the 24th at Noon. Helpers are being sought to help move in.

140th Celebration (Sept. 16th & 17th 2023) – Meeting on April 23 between services

Constitution Update – Mark Briley is going to check with Crystal and Pastor Eric to make sure we are good to go with the next steps, which would be a congregational meeting.

Utilization of Choir/Multipurpose Room – With the approval of the congregation, through the survey, the council motions to approve moving forward with the choir room repurposing with partial funds from the Foundation Capital Improvement grant and partial funds through designated donations. Motion made by LeRoy Bullis, Seconded by Travis Schulz. Passed with a vote. The council also wants to form a group of parents to have input on a possible need for a nursery again and where it should be.

New Business:

New Hire – Josh Casper is starting on Monday April 17th as a full time Youth and Family Director. He comes with a robust background and everyone is excited for him to start.

Worker's Compensation – informed the council that worker's compensation is being utilized due to an injury. Snow Clearing Contract – The contract with Stadheim is up. Kat Anderson presented the council with a new contract with a 3 year term from them. The rates are remaining the same. Motion made by Dylan Jordan and seconded by Travis Schulz to keep Stadheim. Motion carried.

Committee Reports:

Education, Youth, & Family – Next meeting will be set up once Josh Casper is settled. Preschool and Sunday School are singing on May 7th. Last day of Sunday School is May 7th.

The Mission Committee has chosen Joy Ranch as the Mission of the Month for May

May's Mission of the Month is Joy Ranch of South Dakota is both a non-profit organization and an actual 126 acre ranch located a few miles outside of Watertown,

South Dakota on Lake Lyle. It is home to over 20 horses, a flock of ducks, generations of cats, a donkey named Eeyore and two goats. Founded in 1989 by Joy Nelson, the organization's core mission is to help challenged individuals get a chance to meaningfully connect with horses. Typical recipients of this program include everyone from foster children to those with life-altering conditions, disabilities or diseases. Joy Ranch of South Dakota hosts numerous kids camps through out the summer. Activities



include pontoon rides, swimming in Lake Lyle, horse drawn wagon rides, trail riding, playing basketball, out-door games on Main Street, popcorn and movies, smores' around the campfire and lots more.

Foundation – One more meeting in May. Last meeting they approved the Capital Improvement projects for the church as well as a few others.

Fellowship & Outreach – Marian Raml updated that Law Enforcement Luncheon will be held on May 11th and invitations will go out to Watertown and surrounding counties on April 25th.

Finance & Stewardship – Looking into card readers to have at the church and one to send with for Fruit & Nut sales when they are at vendor shows. QR codes have now been added to the bulletin that brings the person who scans it to glcwtn.org/give for online donations. They can choose from a dropdown list and designate a fund to give to including general, youth, memorial, radio & flower, and refugee sponsorship. The Finance committee also would like to move back to counting money on Sundays after church. Kat has instructions written and will train whoever volunteers to do it. Two people should count the money together before Kat does, as this is a standard practice in most churches. There was also discussion of passing the offering plate again and doing training with the confirmation class for it.

Mission – In April they are collecting baby care supplies or monetary donations for the purchase of those things. May's mission of the month is Joy Ranch.

Memorial - Meet every other month-no update.

Preschool – Graduation is set for May 30th with a fundraising meal to follow. Preschoolers will sing on May 7th.

Property – Projects on the horizon – Original Narthex ceiling replacement, parking lot resurfacing, balcony railing solution, choir room repurposing. The Capital Improvement Grant funds will be disbursed among the projects. There will be additional fundraising efforts as needed. The committee is going to look for parking lot contractors. The leak in the Narthex was fixed right away by the roofing company and they will pay for the ceiling to be repainted.

Executive – Hired Josh Casper as new Youth & Family Director. Approved Kat Anderson to be paid a stipend for retirement on the May 15th pay date as it marks 6 months in the role.

Safety – Security cameras have started being installed at entrances of the church.

Steve Schlenner motioned to adjourn the meeting, Lindsey Moeller seconded the motion.

The meeting was adjourned with the Lord's Prayer.

- f. A motion was made by Joy Nelson to grant \$1,000 to Watertown Transit, seconded by Becky Knadle, motion passed.





Ihor Pavlovich Tokarev, his wife Lyubov, and children Ramir and Davyd, ages 7 and 10, have been approved to travel to the US but corrections had to be made to their I 134a applications which has delay their departure from Poland. We are working on new arrangements for travel and we hope they will be handled soon and the family will arrive in Watertown.

Many have volunteered household furnishing for the Tokarev family. Their apartment has been furnish and ready for them. Additional donations can still be made to purchase items they may need when they arrive. If you can donate gift cards, or perhaps purchase script through Grace for HyVee, County Fair, or Walmart, that would be very much appreciated.

Any who our like to providing rides for the first couple of weeks is also needed and appreciated. The family will need to make applications at the social security office, school, and work to start out. Lee Gable has volunteered to be a translator when needed.
