Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

"How good and pleasant it is when God's people live together in unity!" Psalm 133:1

The ELCA National Youth Gathering will be held next July in New Orleans for thousands of young people across the US. The Youth Gathering has been listed as "A Life Changing Faith Formation Event" of the ELCA over the years. A number of our youth will be going. Registration is due as I write so I don't have the total number yet.

What does it mean to be the church together for young high school students?

As youngsters, they come to Wednesday and Sunday school with others who attend. They develop friendships and get to know one another in a new way.

They attend worship services with their families to noticing others and fulfilling their requirements for confirmation ushering and as an acolyte.

But how do they understand what it is to be church together?

For that matter – what is it to be the community of believers and why is it important?

Galatians 6:2 tells us: "Bear one another's burdens, and in this way you will fulfill the law of Christ."

As adults, we know how important that is when we lose a loved one, or devastation hits and takes everything we have. The church comes around us to support, comfort, and encourage us in our time of need. Hopefully young people do not have those experiences.

Hebrews 10 says: "²⁴And let us consider how to provoke one another to love and good deeds, ²⁵not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day approaching."

Meeting together is a way to encourage each other, and young people love to chat about all that is happening in their lives on youth group nights. For them, so much has happened from experiencing shutdowns from a pandemic, the ultra-competitive pressure of achieving, the increased rate of anxiety and threats of terrorism and violence, to hearing about the invasion of Ukraine and now the war in Israel. It's hard to be provoked to love when you are living in a world of fear, anxiety and mixed messages over social media.

Hebrews understood what therapist today use to help teens during trying times: talk therapy. According to a 2021 article *What is Teen Counseling?* in Family Therapy by Kathryn Rudling, LCSW, it explains how talking helps teens "understand and express their feelings, identify and solve problems and develop healthy coping mechanisms."

Adults who have long conversations over beverages with friends or family members know they feel better once they vent or get something off their chest. It is the encouragement we naturally need and the reason God created community for His people.

At the Youth Gathering, our youth will experience many things, meet new people, and create life-long friendships. There will be discussions and thought-provoking speakers. They will be made aware of the differences and similarities we find in the people of the world through daily themes of action, awareness, and advocacy that they can then talk about.

"Action projects could be painting something, cleaning up a park or performing other physical work. Advocacy projects could be neighborhood organizing, community building or working with global partners such as ELCA World Hunger. Awareness projects could be diving into New Orleans culture and learning how food, history and music tie into the community." (ELCA materials.)

It will be a long bus trip there and several days of activities where they will meet together, eat together, and worship together, as the early church made a habit of. (Acts 2: 46-47)

This trip will require a lot of support for the youth, their families, and the adult leaders who go, emotionally as well as financially. The first fund raiser will be held on Sunday, November 5th with a Breakfast brunch from 9 to 11 am. I hope you will plan to attend and offer that encouragement in whatever way you are able for as Paul writes to the Romans:

⁶May the God of steadfastness and encouragement grant you to live in harmony with one another, in accordance with Christ Jesus, ⁶so that together you may with one voice glorify the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ." (15)

Let us pray the experience of the National Youth Gathering will be a good and pleasant time of learning about how God's people live together in unity, loving one another and living for Christ in community.

Minutes of the Grace Lutheran Council Meeting on Thursday October 12, 2023

The Grace Lutheran Church Council meeting was held on Thursday October 12th, 2023, at 6pm with Mark Briley presiding. Also present: Adam Wientjes, Dylan Jordan, LeRoy Bullis, Terra Koistinen, Travis Schulz, Lindsey Moeller, Ted Frost, Steve Schlenner, Kelly Evjen, Ronda Lorenz, Pastor Cheryl Rondeau-Bassett, and Kat Anderson. Absent: Sherry Jongeling, JoAnn Spartz

A motion to approve the agenda was made by Adam Wientjes and seconded by Dylan Jordan. Motion carried. Adam Wientjes motioned to approve the minutes; Rhonda Lorenz seconded. Motion carried.

Items:

Financial Report – Kat Anderson reported the total monthly income to the general fund was \$22,499, the weekly giving average was \$4,300, and the average weekly worship attendance was 76 for the month of September. A motion to accept the financial report and pay the bills was made by Adam Wientjes and seconded by Kelley Evjen. Motion carried.

Pastor's Report —Pastor Cheryl Rondeau-Bassett continues to visit care centers and assisted living homes. She had 2 home visits, 1 Baptism, 1 funeral, and continues to teach confirmation and do the opening for Wednesday and Sunday School.

Old Business:

Open Council Seats-There is still an open council seat. We also need to start thinking of those whose term ends in January to fill their seats.

Upcoming Budget- The 1st Draft of the budget was presented. Kat Anderson instructed the council to take it home and look it over and to come back with any recommendations before the next meeting in November.

Negotiations/Evaluations – The task force met and came up with numbers for the increase for salary. An increase to Kat Anderson's salary was motioned by Dylan Jordan and seconded by Lindsey Moeller. Increase to Pastor Cheryl's compensation package was motioned by Steve Schlenner and seconded by Rhonda Lorenz.

New Business:

Volunteer Appreciation – A note of appreciation was signed by members of the council

Church Services-We will stay at 2 services in the Winter. For Christmas eve there will be no morning service but a 4pm & 6pm Candlelight service. Christmas day there will be a 10am service. New Year's Eve will also have 1 10am service.

150th Fund-There is money left over from the 140th Grant that was received from the Foundation. The Foundation would like us to invest it for the next celebration rather than return the money. Dylan Jordan motioned that Kat Anderson is to open an investment account in the church's name for the 150th Anniversary. Terra Koistinen seconded. Motion carried.

Committee Reports:

Education, Youth, & Family – The Christmas program has been picked out to be performed on December 10th at 2pm with a reception to follow. Pastor Cheryl gave an update on the ELCA Youth Gathering in New Orleans. Lindsey is going to come talk to the kids this week as that is where she attended the Youth Gathering when she was in youth group.

Foundation-Foundation would like Grace Lutheran to invest the leftover funds from the 140th for the 150th.

Entertainment is featured throughout the day. Bake Sales items will be available in the morning. Egg Rolls must be ordered ahead by calling the office.






