Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

The 140th celebration was a wonderful day for Grace Lutheran. The time together to worship and celebrate and time for fellowship was just so special and memorable.

We read in Psalm 150: "¹Praise the LORD! Praise God in his sanctuary; praise him in his mighty firmament! ²Praise him for his mighty deeds; praise him according to his surpassing greatness!"

With joy and great delight, we certainly did Praise the Lord on September 17th.

Celebrations are an important part of church anniversaries because it provides younger

people and those new to the congregation a way to learn about the history.

They learn about the important undertakings and accomplishments of the past, and Grace Lutheran has many.

They learn how others have been faced with trials and mistakes, as Grace Lutheran has, to learn from those warning signs, and how they too can overcome setbacks.

They learn about the traditions, morals and values that built the church which gives them a feeling of loyalty for their efforts.

After the people were delivered out from slavery in Egypt, God had Moses declare a special day of remembrance. The day of Passover was to remind the people how the Lord had rescued them from their suffering.

In the New Testament, we are reminded of that night in which Jesus was betrayed, suffered, and died to rescue us from slavery. Those very words spoken are used in the Words of Institution during Holy Communion. Jesus wants us to remember our past, so we can look to our future in our eternal home with trust and joy.

So it is important to remember, and in remembering what God has done for us, to celebrate.

Paul wrote to the Philippians 4 saying, "⁴Rejoice in the Lord always. I will say it again: Rejoice! ⁵Let your gentleness be evident to all. The Lord is near. ⁶Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. ⁷And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus."

Remembering the past is not to repeat the mistakes but to build a better future. We should not live in the past as Paul writes in Philippians 3: "13 Beloved, I do not consider that I have made it my own; but this one thing I do: forgetting what lies behind and straining forward to what lies ahead, 14 I press on toward the goal for the prize of the heavenly call of God in Christ Jesus."

We now press on to the goal, doing the will and work of our Lord as the mission and ministry of Grace Lutheran.

Knowing how the founders and leaders of Grace Lutheran have trusted in God and been innovative and courageous, we are empowered to do the same for the future. Our lives and how people live all around us is changing. The church must adjust right along with it to relate to those changes and the needs of the people today.

We can hold on to our traditions but also find new ways to relate to the needs of our community. Grace Lutheran was instrumental in the past to provide for the church and our neighbor, even to send 50 families to begin a start up congregations, our daughter church LCOOR and starting Luther Hospital.

Grace can continue this blessed tradition, trusting to be the people of God for the needs of our neighbor now and in the future as we remember God's goodness, we recognize God's grace remembering God will be with us as we meet the challenges for the seasons to come.

Minutes of the Grace Lutheran Council Meeting on Thursday, September 13th, 2023

The Grace Lutheran Church Council meeting was held on Thursday August 10th, 2023, at 6pm with Dylan Jordan presiding in Mark Briley's absence. Also present: Adam Wientjes, LeRoy Bullis, Terra Koistinen, Travis Schulz, Lindsey Moeller, Dylan Jordan, Ted Frost, Steve Schlenner, Sherry Jongeling, Ronda Lorenz, Pastor Cheryl Rondeau-Bassett, and Kat Anderson. Absent: Kelly Evjen, Adam Wientjes, Gena Urevig, and Mark Briley.

A motion to approve the agenda was made by Sherry Jongeling and seconded by LeRoy Bullis. Motion carried. Lindsey Moeller motioned to approve the minutes; Rhonda Lorenz seconded. Motion carried.

Items:

Financial Report – Kat Anderson reported the total monthly income to the general fund was \$20,044, the weekly giving average was \$4,009, and the average weekly worship attendance was 80 for the month of June. A motion to accept the financial report and pay the bills was made by Lindsey Moeller and seconded by Rhonda Lorenz. Motion carried.

Pastor's Report — Pastor Cheryl Rondeau-Bassett continues to visit care centers and assisted living homes. She had 4 home visits, 1 funeral, and has started confirmation classes at the end of August. At the time of the meeting Wednesday Night Dinner church had begun and is going well.

Old Business:

- Youth & Family Director- Longer discussion was held on why Mr. Casper is not employed here since it had to be rushed through at the last meeting due to incoming severe weather.
- 140th Celebration (Sept. 16th & 17th 2023) Ribbon cutting Friday, Open House on Saturday, and our large celebration on Sunday. Everything is coming together nicely. The wooden crosses were paid for by an anonymous donor as well as a family member of the Jongelings. They will be a wonderful gift to our congregation.
- Open Council Seats- JoAnn Spartz is joining the council, although she was unable to attend the meeting. Motion to approve JoAnn by Adam Wientjes, seconded by Travis Schulz.

New Business:

- Office Hours-Kat asked that the office hours be changed to 9-5 to accommodate her staying late for committee meetings as well as Wednesday School. Adam Wientjes motioned; Dylan Jordan seconded. Motion carried.
- Church Services-It had been mentioned to Pastor by congregation members that we should have one service year-round. Pastor brought this to the attention of the council. They will look at the numbers of both services over the next month to see if that is something that should be done.
- Pastor's Insurance Plan-Plans need to be selected online the 1st week of October. Kat proposed that it stays the same and we add vision insurance. Adam motioned to approve; Dylan seconded. Motion carried.
- Upcoming budget-Kat let the council know that the first drafts of the budget will be presented at next month's meeting. If there is something they would like increased or decreased, they should keep an eye on it and mention it to Kat to include.
- Haven Center-Haven Center asked for our support. The council is willing to hear from them and what they do before deciding. An informational meeting will be arranged.
- Negotiations & Evaluations A task force is being created to review all church employees on their performance as well as looking at reasonable compensation. The task force should include an executive committee member, a council member, a staff support member, and a member of the congregation at large.

During the forum they will answer questions and share the activities of the department. Everyone is encouraged to come share a cup of coffee and offer their support for our local law enforcement.






