Grace Lutheran Church to Celebrate 140th Anniversary

A special worship service will be held on Sunday, September 17th, at 10:30 am to celebration our 140th anniversary. Bishop Constanze Hagmaier of the South Dakota ELCA Synod will give a special anniversary message during the service. The chorus and bell choirs of Lutheran Church of Our Redeemer and Grace Lutheran's will combine for this special anniversary service and offer Glory of God.


LCOOR is the daughter church of Grace Lutheran as on Nov 6, 1960, the congregation was bursting at the seams. At the time, a Godspeed Service was held for 212 members, who were released to establish a daughter church. Approximately 50 families from Grace Lutheran took on the responsibility for a start-up ministry launching what became Lutheran Church of Our Redeemer on the north side of Watertown. Pastor's Dan and Laura of LCOOR will join Grace's Pastor Cheryl during this special service and assist with Holy Communion

Other activities will be held for the anniversary. All are welcome for coffee and fellowship at 9 am on Sunday morning. Following the service, a dinner will be held at noon in Fellowship Hall for \$5.00 in advance and \$6.00 at the door.

Leading up to the special event, the Watertown Chamber of Commerce will hold a ribbon cutting at 10 am on Friday, September 15. An open house will be held on Saturday, September 16, from 2 to 4 pm in Fellowship Hall for all those who would like to stop and visit. Letters of invitation have been sent out to past Pastors of Grace and employees, but these events are open to everyone.

The first meeting to organize a Lutheran Church in Watertown was held on Sept. 19, 1883. On Dec. 22, 1883, the First Scandinavian Evangelical Lutheran Church was organized in a room over the Merchants Bank of Watertown. The dedication of the first church building, a 30 x 40 ft structure with no basement, was held on Sept. 26, 1886. In 1917 plans began for a new church building. On Aug 1, 1920, the cornerstone of the present sanctuary was laid, and the name changed to Grace Lutheran Church the following May.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ.

Minutes of the Grace Lutheran Council Meeting on Thursday August 10th, 2023

The Grace Lutheran Church Council meeting was held on Thursday August 10th, 2023 at 6pm with Dylan Jordan presiding in Mark Briley's absence. Also present was LeRoy Bullis, Gena Urevig, Terra Koistinen, Travis Schulz, Lindsey Moeller, Dylan Jordan, Ted Frost, Steve Schlenner, Sherry Jongeling, Ronda Lorenz, Pastor Cheryl Rondeau-Bassett, and Kat Anderson. Absent were Kelly Evjen, Adam Wientjes, and Mark Briley. A guest tonight was Maia Brooks, the new preschool teacher.

A motion to approve the agenda was made by Lindsey Moeller and seconded by Rhonda Lorenz. Motion carried. Steve Schlenner motioned to approve the minutes; Ted Frost seconded. Motion carried.

Items:

Financial Report – Kat Anderson reported the total monthly income to the general fund was \$29,013, the weekly giving average was \$5,803, and the average weekly worship attendance was 77 for the month of June. A motion to accept the financial report and pay the bills was made by Dylan Jordan and seconded by Sherry Jongeling. Motion carried. Kat brough up that the Radio Checking was getting low due decreased special event sponsors. A motion to transfer from the Radio Fund to the Radio Checking was made by Dylan Jordan and seconded by Rhonda Lorenz. Motion carried.

Pastor's Report –Pastor Cheryl Rondeau-Bassett continues to visit care centers and assisted living homes. She had 3 home visits, 2 funerals, a committal service, a healing prayer service, started a new Bible study series, as well as VBS facilitation and committee meetings. Acolyte and usher training will be on August 30th. She noted that we will be taking Labor Day weekend off and there will be a video sermon provided by the Synod. Wednesday school/ Wednesday Worship will include a meal this year starting at 5:30, worship at 6, which will also be the opening for Wednesday school.

Old Business:

Ukraine Refuge Sponsorship – Igor had car troubles; a grant was put in to help with repair cost. Igor is paying the remainder of the bill on his own.

140th Celebration (Sept. 16th & 17th 2023) – Marcia Jelsma turned in the church history which we are very grateful for her hard work. Quilt squares are starting to get turned in but we need more.

New Business:

Youth & Family Director – Josh Casper no longer works for Grace.

Sunday School/Wednesday School plan – Pastor and Kat will get the materials ready for the Christian Education classes and work with the teachers. The theme this year is "What a Friend We Have in Jesus". The Education committee met in late July to discuss plans including Dinner Church on Wednesdays. The committee is hoping that we will see more congressional involvement with the education of our Youth since they are so important to us and the life of the church.

Finance & Stewardship – The new credit card reader for the Fruit program has arrived. SCRIP is doing very well.

ANNIVERSARY (continued from pg)

The present brick building was dedicated on July 10, 1921.

Over the years, Grace Lutheran has been community minded in mission and outreach. In 1909, the idea of Luther Hospital was developed with the opening of what was later renamed Memorial Hospital which merged with St Anne's Hospital and later became Prairie Lakes Hospital.

The rich heritage of Grace Lutheran included radio broadcast beginning on Dec 1, 1935, which reached its 2500th consecutive regular broadcast over KWAT on their Centennial Celebration of 100 years of Grace on September 18th, 1983, and continues to this day. The first drive-in service was held on June 19, 1955, at "Melody Theater" and later East Park Drive-in. Church additions for an education wing, new narthex and fellowship hall were built over the years as well as remodeling the sanctuary in 1975.

Over the years, they have supported missionary overseas and sponsored refugee families: two family from Viet Nam in 1978, a Polish family in 1990 and currently are sponsoring two families from Ukraine.

Four sons of Grace Lutheran have become pastors and 15 pastors have been ordained at Grace.

The public is invited to attend this time of celebration as we rededicate our mission and ministry to our Lord and Savior for the next 140 years.

God's Work Our Hands Wednesday September 27th

GLCW (Glace Lutheran Church Women) collects materials for kits for World Relief each year and are then put together on God's Work Our Hands day. School kits

FOUR 70-sheet notebooks of wide- or college-ruled paper, approximately 8" x 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ "; no loose leaf paper; ONE 30 centimeter ruler, or a ruler with centimeters on one side and inches on the other; ONE pencil sharpener

ONE pair of blunt scissors (safety scissors with embedded steel blades work well); FIVE unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers; secure together with a rubber band; FIVE black or blue ballpoint pens (no gel ink); secure together with a rubber band; ONE box of 16 or 24 crayons; ONE 2 ½" eraser (NOTE: The book bags have been purchased.)



Baby Care Kits



TWO lightweight cotton t-shirts (no Onesies ®); TWO long- or short-sleeved gowns or sleepers (without feet); TWO receiving blankets, medium-weight cotton or flannel, or crocheted or knitted with lightweight yarn, between 36" and 52" square; FOUR cloth diapers, flat fold preferred; ONE jacket, sweater or sweatshirt with a hood, or include a baby cap; TWO pairs of socks; ONE hand towel, dark color recommended; TWO or three bath-size bars of gentle soap equaling 8 to 9 oz., any brand, in original wrapping; no mini or hotel size bars; TWO diaper pins or large safety pins

Personal Care Kits

ONE light-weight bath-size towel (between 20" x 40" and 52" x 27"), dark color recommended; TWO or three bath-size bars of soap equaling 8 to 9 oz., any brand, in original wrapping; ONE adult-size toothbrush in its original packaging*; ONE sturdy comb, remove packaging; ONE metal nail clippers (attached file optional), remove packaging

On Wednesday, September 27th at 6:30 pm, volunteers are encouraged to join together in the basement to put the kits together. The process includes working in one of the lines for either school, baby care, or personal care where all the materials are laid out and each person goes down the line to pick up the items for one kit. The work is not hard and with many people, goes quickly. God's Work will be done through the many volunteer hands of His people.



On October 1st, these kits will be loaded in trucks that pick up the kits from the many congregations in the area. The truck is schedule to be at Grace between 1:30 and 2 pm. Your help will be needed on that day as well. Watch more details on the time for loading and plan to help as you are able.






The first lefse workshops are September 11th & 12th at 8 a.m.
