### What Will Heaven Be Like?



Everyone has questions about what heaven will be like. Gary Larson, one of the funniest cartoonists ever, addressed the question in one of his *FAR SIDE* cartoons. He had a man sitting on a cloud with a halo on his head and angel wings doing nothing and no one else in sight. His expression is like that of Tom Hanks when he was marooned on an island in the movie, *CASTAWAY*, with all the time in the world and nothing to do. The caption said, "... Wish I'd brought a magazine."

Over the years I've been asked all kinds of questions about Heaven. Like, "Will there be coffee in heaven?" "Will heaven be one long, boring worship service?" "Will my dog be in heaven?" "Will there be golf in heaven?" Yes, there will be golf in heaven. I'm not sure about the others. (Just kidding.)

The Bible gives a number of indications what heaven will be like. For example, when John was given a glimpse of heaven here's what he wrote:

"After this I saw a vast crowd, too great to count, from every nation and tribe and people and language, standing in front of the throne and before the Lamb. They were clothed in white robes and held palm branches in their hands. And they were shouting with a great roar 'Salvation comes from our God who sits on the throne and from the Lamb!" (Revelation 7:9-10, NLT)

Heaven won't be one long worship service. But at this one, men and women from every culture and corner on earth, every nation, language, background, ethnicity, and tribe are all dressed alike in white robes, doing one thing: praising **GOD** and **JESUS** for our salvation!

Revelation 21:4 tells us there won't be any more tears or crying, death or dying, pain or suffering "because the old order of things have passed away."

Jonathan Edwards said, "Even the very best of men, are, on earth, imperfect. But it is not so in heaven. There shall be no pollution or deformity or offensive defect of any kind, seen in any person or thing; but every one shall be perfectly pure, and perfectly lovely in heaven."

Wouldn't it be great if there was some way, somehow, some place where we could experience a little of that here ... now? Jesus suggested there is. When He taught His disciples to pray, He told them to pray like this, "Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name. Your kingdom come, your will be done, **ON EARTH AS IT IS IN HEAVEN** ..." (Matthew 6:9-10). In other words, pray for God's will to be done ON EARTH as it is IN HEAVEN.

But where would that be?



If there's one place where people ought to see heaven on earth, if there's one place where you ought to be able to find people praying for and living out God's will on earth as it is in heaven, it should be the church. The church should also be a place where you see people from every background, age and stage of life, race, class and ethnicity imaginable.




Think about that for a moment and you'll start wishing you could experience that. Here's the good news: you can. Attend a local church and get actively involved.

### That You May Believe: A Journey Through John's Gospel


The Gospel of John is a bold and beautiful invitation to know Jesus—not just to know about Him, but to believe in Him and have life in His name. Unlike the other Gospel writers, John's purpose is explicitly clear: "These are written so that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that by believing you may have life in his name" (John 20:31).

In this series, "That You May Believe," we will journey through key moments in John's Gospel—signs, conversations, miracles, and declarations—that reveal who Jesus truly is. From the Word made flesh, to the Good Shepherd, to the Resurrection and the Life, John leads us again and again to the heart of faith: trusting in Jesus as Savior and Lord.

Whether you've walked with Jesus for years or are just beginning to ask questions about Him, this series is for you. As we open the pages of John's Gospel, our prayer is that each of us would come face to face with the living Christ—and that we would believe. And in believing, that we would find life. True life. Eternal life.

Let's open our hearts and minds to the One who came so that we may believe.





### **Establish Your Heart**

### Read James 5:7-8 (ESV)

Be patient, therefore, brothers, until the coming of the Lord. See how the farmer waits for the precious fruit of the earth, being patient about it, until it receives the early and the late rains. You also, be patient. Establish your hearts, for the coming of the Lord is at hand.

### Reflect

What are you looking forward to the most about the coming of the Lord?

Have you ever wondered what is taking so long? Why hasn't Jesus come back yet? We look around and we see the signs. Jesus said, "...you will hear of wars and rumors of wars...For nation will rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom, and there will be famines and earthquakes in various places" (Matthew 24:6-7). We watch the news on any given day and we see those things happening and we wonder, is it today? Is it tomorrow? We long for Jesus' return. The suffering on earth is immense. It is hard to witness and agonizing to experience and endure.

That is why I find James' words in today's verses so encouraging. James had just called out the wealthy wicked for their evil deeds. He assured them that the Commander of the armies of heaven took notice, and that swift judgment was coming upon them. Now, he turns back to address and exhort his fellow believers. "Be patient, therefore, brothers, until the coming of the Lord."

I don't know about you, but patience is not a strength of mine. It is hard to wait for anything, but it is especially hard to wait when there is suffering involved. The longer we suffer the more prone we are to doubt and question. Is it ever going to happen? That is why James urged the believers to "establish your hearts." In other words, settle the matter in your heart and be steadfast. The Lord is coming back. And while none of us know the day or the hour (Matthew 24:36), His return is imminent. He could come at any moment! That should strengthen our resolve and shore up our faith.

I also find it easier to be patient when I know that there is a good reason for the delay. James used the analogy of a farmer waiting until his crops received the rains needed to be ripe for the harvest to show that there is a purpose to God's timing. Jesus is not just sitting around waiting for nothing.

The apostle Peter explained, "The Lord is not slow to fulfill his promise as some count slowness, but is patient toward you, not wishing that any should perish, but that all should reach repentance" (2 Peter 3:9). What we perceive as His delay is really His incredible patience with us. Wise farmers don't pull up their produce before it is ready to be harvested. Like farmers, we should patiently wait until the harvest is ready.


Friends, I know this life is hard. It isn't easy to wait patiently for Jesus' return. But don't get discouraged. Keep looking forward to His coming. Establish your hearts on this truth: He is coming. And soon. Every day is one day closer.


### Respond

Lord, I confess that some days it is hard to wait for Your return. There is so much suffering in this world. But I know that You have a purpose in Your delay and that Your timing is perfect. Strengthen my heart to continue to wait patiently for You no matter what I face in the future. Amen.

### Reveal

When someone shares their frustration with the brokenness of the world, listen well, then offer to pray with them—asking God to give both of you patience and hope as you wait for His perfect timing.

Nominations are **due no later than November 2, 2025**. They can be mailed in to the office or brought in and put in the nomination box located on the table in the lobby. The election of board members will take place on **December 14, 2025**. Election ballots will be available on that day in the lobby and in the bulletins. We ask that you attend worship that day to turn in your ballots.

The Annual Congregational Meeting will then take place following worship services on Sunday, **January 4, 2026**. We highly encourage you to attend the Annual Congregational Meeting. If you have something you want to address at that meeting, please contact the office to be placed on the agenda.

### Elders: (3 year term)

Qualifications -To be elected a man must be a member of the congregation for at least one year and meet the qualifications in the New Testament including those in 1 Timothy 3:2-7 and Titus 1:6-9.

The duties will be to serve the needs of the congregation as outlined in the New Testament. The duties will also be to serve as a voting member of the board, serve on the nominations committee, serve on the pulpit committee, and serve on the board of education. The term will be subject to continued qualification for the office and run for three calendar years.

# Deacons: (1 year term)

Qualifications - To be elected a man must be a member of the congregation for at least one year and meet the qualifications in the New Testament including those in 1 Timothy 3:8-12.

The duties will be to serve the needs of the congregation as outlined in the New Testament. The duties will also be to serve as a voting member of the board and assist in carrying out the decisions of the board. The term will be subject to continued qualification for the office and run for one calendar year.

# Trustee: (3 year term)

Qualifications - To be elected the candidate must be an active and faithful member of the congregation for at least one year. The duties will be to act under the direction of the board and assume the responsibilities required by law.

# Membership Defined:

A member is anyone who has accepted Jesus Christ as his/her personal savior and who has been immersed in baptism for the remission of sins or those who have transferred his/her membership from another recognized (restoration movement) church.

A Voting Member: One who is at least 16 years of age.






