

October 2023 CONNECTING POINT

PASS THE SALT



I have a nasty habit. It may not be all that nasty, but it isn't all that healthy either. And I am guessing I am not the only one. The habit? Salting my food before I even taste it. I know how Angela cooks, so I am generally safe salting things first at home. It is when we eat out this salting habit can get me in trouble, which it has done on more than one occasion!

Paul urged his Colossian readers to be "salty" in their interactions with those outside the Christian community. He instructed them to "be wise in the way you act toward outsiders, making the most of every opportunity" (Col. **4:5)**. As the saying goes, you never get a second chance to make a first impression. So, our conversations should "always be full of grace, seasoned with salt" (Col. **4:6)**, adding a taste of God's favor whenever possible.

Paul used an image well-known in the ancient world, to let your conversations be "seasoned with salt." D. A. Carson writes, "This [phrase] meant 'witty' in pagan usage but here Paul suggests language that is not dull or flat but well chosen, based on the wisdom of Christ." Given the casual way words are used in our culture, both spoken and in social media, a conversation seasoned with salt can prove to be quite challenging.


In Paul's time salt was used as a preservative to keep food from spoiling. "This would mean the believer's speech is to be free from corruption, wholesome in content" (Anders). Like me, you have probably been in far too many conversations serving as breeding grounds for corruption and discontent. Solomon wrote "the tongue has the power of life and death, and those who love it will eat its fruit" (Proverbs 18:21). Well-chosen words are words well-salted for life.

Salt, as in our day, was also used as an additive to give food flavor. "If this meaning lies behind Paul's figure, then the believer's speech is to be interesting, tactful, and add to the appeal and value of the conversation" (Anders). Solomon put it this way, "The tongue of the righteous is choice silver, but the heart of the wicked is of little value" (Pro. 10:19). Well-salted words are those that communicate worth and value, pointing to the Giver of life.

Another use of salt in the ancient world was as an antiseptic. You may be familiar with the phrase "pouring salt into an open wound." That was literally done in Paul's day to try to kill and to draw infection out of a wound. If you have experienced even something as simple as a bead of sweat dripping into a wound, you know the sting it creates! We are called to "speak the truth in love" (Eph. **4:15)**, knowing well-salted words will sting, even while promoting healing.

Jesus said we are the "salt of the earth" (cf. Matt. 5:13). One way of acting like it is by ensuring our conversations are grace-filled, and heavily "seasoned with salt." Unlike food which can be over-salted, I am not sure our words can be. As you are in conversation with those who don't know Jesus, and even with those who do, remember: "Pleasant words are a honeycomb, sweet to the soul and healing to the bones" (Pro. 16:24).

Now pass the salt! Blessings,





The Thirst Quencher

Read John 4:10-15 (ESV)

Jesus answered her, "If you knew the gift of God, and who it is that is saying to you, 'Give me a drink,' you would have asked him, and he would have given you living water."

The woman said to him, "Sir, you have nothing to draw water with, and the well is deep. Where do you get that living water? Are you greater than our father Jacob? He gave us the well and drank from it himself, as did his sons and his livestock." Jesus said to her, "Everyone who drinks of this water will be thirsty again, but whoever drinks of the water that I will give him will never be thirsty again. The water that I will give him will become in him a spring of water welling up to eternal life." The woman said to him, "Sir, give me this water, so that I will not be thirsty or have to come here to draw water."

Reflect

What do you seek when you are spiritually thirsty? Does it actually quench your thirst?

When we are thirsty, we tend to seek out everything except the best thing for us to drink—water. The drinks we love tend to be carbonated or caffeinated and sugar-laden (sometimes all three). Water is a necessary component of the bodies God made us and that water has to be replenished every day in order for us to function and be healthy. But when it comes to quenching our thirst, many of us would rather drink something just a little more exciting than plain old water. So, the beverage choices we make are not always the healthiest.

But we do this spiritually as well. So many people are thirsty for God. Peace with God is what our souls need, but we tend to seek out everything except what is best for us spiritually. We try to quench our thirst for God with relationships, entertainment, busyness, work, alcohol, drugs, pornography, food addictions... The list goes on and on.

In the above passage, Jesus continued His conversation with a woman He met at Jacob's well. He had already broken tradition and spoke to a woman by asking her for a drink of water. What's worse, she was an immoral and unclean woman! But today we see that Jesus offered her something even better than a physical thirst quencher. He offered her something that would quench her spiritual longings for all eternity.

Jesus offered her living water. He said that if anyone drinks the water He offers, they will never thirst again. We can tell she doesn't quite understand because she accepted His offer thinking she wouldn't have to be thirsty or come back to the well ever again. But that is not what Jesus meant.

In verse 13 Jesus said, "The water that I will give him will become in him a spring of water welling up to eternal life." Jesus meant that everyone who accepts Him as the Messiah will receive the indwelling Holy Spirit and the deepest desires of their soul will be met. They will be made right with God and made brand new. Their sins will be cleansed and forgiven. Their relationship with God will be restored. They will experience everlasting life forever with Him. They will never again long for God because a spring of living water (the Holy Spirit) lives inside them! They will never again be apart from Him!

Let's not fail to grasp the eternal significance of what Jesus said. Let's stop choosing temporary, worldly, and often very unhealthy things in an effort to quench our spiritual thirst. Our souls aren't longing for religion. They aren't longing for sex. They aren't yearning for fame, fortune, and worldly success. Social media, TV, and other forms of entertainment won't fill us up. Sports will ultimately disappoint. We have a thirst that only Jesus can quench. And when we accept His offer of living water, we'll never be thirsty again!

Pray

Lord, forgive me for trying to quench my spiritual thirst on my own apart from You. But "as a deer pants for flowing streams, so pants my soul for you, O God. My soul thirsts for God, for the living God" (Psalm 42:1-2). Thank You for Your living water, Your Holy Spirit that lives in me. In You, I will thirst no more. Amen.


Troop 107 Selling Greenery

There will be an order sheet on the church lobby table if you are interested. The boys will also be setting up a table and taking orders at various businesses in Cherokee as well.




