ONE ACCORD WITH GOD'S PLAN AND PURPOSE

My husband and I both had the unique privilege of being raised in preacher's homes. I count this as a great honour and privilege and thank God for the subconscious training I received.

When I was going into my teen years, my father became the General Superintendent of the United Pentecostal Church International. This brought about a lot of changes in my parents' lifestyle, but two things I could always count on was regular meals and an annual family holiday. This may seem like trite matters, but it brought about a stability and regularity to the very busy lifestyle we led.

One of the great blessings of my parents' position was the privilege to travel. My first trip to a mission field was to Colombia when I was just a teenager. That trip tremendously impacted me and fed the love I already had for nations beyond my own.

During my years in Bible School, my love for missions work increased greatly. I was privileged to lead the missions club for the school which was a means of promoting missions and world vision amongst the students. I made deep consecrations to the call to missions during Bible School.

I went to Bible College and secular college at the same time. God ordered my steps to get a secular teaching degree which has proved to be an immense help in my ministry.

My husband and I met for a blind date in July, 1976 that had been arranged by Bro. Billy Cole. He was our cupid! On our first date, my husband lost no time in asking me if I would be interested in missionary work. I tried to act real calm and said, "I've thought about it." Inside, my heart started thumping with excitement

wondering if this just might be Mr. Right. Neither of us knew a specific country, but by the time we got married we both knew it was in the direction of Europe.

Eleven months after that first date, we were married and became very involved in the church my husband had assisted Bro. Cole in starting in West Virginia, USA. A year later, he became the pastor of that church, and he also became the youth leader for that state. We loved that church and saw great progress in the work. However, the desire for missions involvement never left us.

Bro. Cole came to visit us one time, and he had just been to Scotland. He stopped by our house and in conversation told us that help was really needed in Scotland. When he said that, it was like a lightbulb went off in our spirits. Something inside of us just knew this was the specific place and call we had been waiting for.

Consequently, my husband made a trip to Scotland in 1980. He visited several places and, very sadly, was in Edinburgh when the decision was made to sell the building the UPC owned right across from Holyrood Palace. The reason was that there was no one available to pastor. It was heartbreaking!

He came home knowing that Scotland was the place but that it wasn't yet the right time. I will share the following, not for sympathy, but to stress the importance of holding onto a call of God.

First let me share that right before we met the missions board, a visiting minister prophesied to us. He had no knowledge of what we had in our hearts. He told us that we would present the church to the Lord that we had pastored in West Virginia, but

the greater work the Lord wanted to do through us was in the direction of Europe.

"He said that if we were waiting for an angel in a SCOTTISH KILT to give us a call, it wouldn't happen but that we needed to obey the call."

We asked him why he said Scottish kilt and he said it just came out. He didn't know why. Obviously, this was a great confirmat to us in regard to the call we already felt.

Then we met the missions board, and their answer was that we should wait. We did not get appointed and were devastated. We had been so sure we were on the right track, and the prophecy had reinforced that fact. (The prophecy was accurate, but the timing was different than we expected.) One book of the Bible I had never really understood was the book of Ecclesiastes. It was during this time that God enlightened that book to me, and I have forever since cherished Ecclesiastes. The rejection was not a waste, and it built fortitude and perseverance into our spirits.

Finally, in 1983 we were appointed and arrived in Scotland in June, 1984 with three-year-old Kyle. God wonderfully directed us to housing and a community hall on the east side of Glasgow which is where the church is still located today. Mary Catherine arrived in 1986.

Pioneering is not an easy task, as many reading this will know firsthand. There were many ups and many downs, but God always saw us through. We began teaching home Bible studies across a 40-mile radius and eventually people started coming to the services.

We had been told by those over us to expect to just be on our own a lot, However, by God's grace we never had



one service in Glasgow with just our family. There was always someone. We would have still persevered if it had just been our family, but we thank God for sending people our way, slowly but surely.

God led us from that first community hall to sharing an Episcopal church to a school and finally to the present wonderful facilities that God miraculously gave us for.

A number of years ago, I felt drawn to focus on two aspects of ministry. Although I have continued to fill many roles, my heartbeat is primarily for prayer and hospitality. These two priorities are areas I continually try to put into future generations. My ministry purpose is to be an encourager to others in any way that I can, whether it be through teaching, friendship, counselling or by endeavouring to be a good example.

So, where are we today?

Now that Scotland is a district on its own, my husband is again a district superintendent. Harvest Bible College is still very much a part of our lives, and we rejoice to see people trained for the harvest. New Life Church in Glasgow continues to be our home church, and we rejoice to see the progress and growth. Prayer ministry is still very much a part of our lives. My husband continues to minister in the Scandinavian countries and helps coordinate Bible School ministry across Europe.



Our roles, title and positions change with time, but we are not retired. We are just re-positioned and continue to find great fulfilment in the ministry God has given us.

We have no greater joy than to see our children and grandchildren walking in Truth, holiness and integrity. What a wonderful surprise from heaven it was when our son and his wife told us they were called to Wales. As our daughter and son-in-law labour in Glasgow, we give God praise continually.

My husband and I greatly desire to finish well! We have made mistakes and gone through a lot of hard times, but by God's grace we are still in the race and intend to "fight the good fight, finish our course and keep the faith!"

What have I learned in a life of ministry?

Here's just a few things:

- *Availability is as important as capability.* (So many times, I have felt inadequate.)
- Your gift will make room for itself. (Proverbs 18.16) *Don't aspire for positions and titles.*
- *Walk through one door and God opens another door.*
- *Perseverance will outlast persecution.*
- Keep focused on Jesus—not people.
- Involve your children in the work of the Lord and at the same time keep balance with your family life.
- Stay connected to the Body of Christ on every level. Don't isolate yourself.
- Continually have a prayer covering by trusted people.
- Never give up!

THE IMPORTANCE OF BEING IN ONE ACCORD

Introduction

The phrase "One Accord" appears multiple times in the book of Acts and is foundational to the unity of the early Church. In Acts 1, Verse 14 (KJV), we read: "These all continued with one accord in prayer and supplication, with the women, and Mary the mother of Jesus, and with his brethren." This unity was not just physical presence but spiritual harmony, a shared purpose and commitment to Christ.

Why is One Accord Important Today?

In a world filled with division, strife, and individualism, the call to live and walk in one accord is more urgent than ever. Jesus prayed in John 17, Verse 21 (KJV): "That they all may be one; as thou, Father, art in me, and I in thee, that they also may be one in us: that the world may believe that thou hast sent me." Our unity is a testimony to the world of Christ's love and truth.

Scriptural Foundation

Acts two, Verse 1 (KJV) says: "And when the day of Pentecost was fully come, they were all with one accord in one place." This unity preceded the outpouring of the Holy Ghost. Unity invites the presence and power of God. Psalm 133, Verse 1 (KJV) declares: "Behold, how good and how pleasant it is for brethren to dwell together in unity!"

Illustrations

Consider a symphony orchestra: each musician plays a different instrument, yet when they follow the same sheet music under one conductor, the result is harmony. Likewise, in the body of Christ, we have different gifts and roles, but when we submit to the leading of the Holy Ghost, we produce a beautiful testimony of God's grace. Another example is a team of rowers in a boat. If everyone rows in a different direction, the boat goes nowhere. But when they row, as a coordinated group, they move forward swiftly. So it is with the Church—unity propels us toward God's mission and helps to create an atmosphere for revival.

What Steps Can We Take To Walk In Unity Today?

Let us lay aside personal agendas, pride, and offenses. Philippians 2, Verse 2 (KJV) exhorts: "Fulfil ye my joy, that ye be likeminded, having the same love, being of one accord, of one mind." This is not uniformity but unity in diversity, centered on Christ. Pray together, serve together, and love one another fervently.

Conclusion

As we, God-willing, launch into 2026, walking in one accord is essential for revival, for effective ministry, and for demonstrating Christ to the world. May we strive daily to maintain the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace (Ephesians 4, Verse 3 KJV). When we do, the world will see Jesus in us, and God's power will flow unhindered.

WINTER SEASON OF MARRIAGE

The Winter season represents the most difficult and emotionally challenging phase of a marriage. It is defined not by external circumstances but by how a couple responds to life's difficulties.

1. Emotional Climate

Winter marriages are marked by:

- Hurt
- Anger
- Disappointment
- Loneliness
- Feelings of rejection

Search-supported insights affirm the same emotional chill—partners experience a deep emotional freeze, where warmth and affection have been replaced by bitterness and resentment.

2. Attitudes in Winter

Common attitudes include:

- Negativity
- Discouragement
- Frustration
- Hopelessness

These attitudes reinforce emotional distance and can harden the heart, creating relational rigidity.

3. Actions Typical of Winter

Couples in the winter season often display:

- Harsh or destructive speech
- Silence and withdrawal
- Lack of negotiation
- In extreme cases: violent acts
- Outside sources confirm that communication at this stage becomes minimal or hostile, and couples may live "separate lives in the same house."

4. Relationship Climate

Winter creates a relational environment that feels:

- Cold
- Detached
- Harsh
- Bitter

There is no sense of togetherness. Conversations often turn into conflicts, or couples withdraw into silence—like two people living in separate igloos.

5. The Positive Side of Winter

Despite its difficulty, Winter can serve an important purpose:

- It may motivate couples to seek help.
- It can become a season where God works to:
 - Affirm faith
 - Grow character
 - Develop patience and perseverance
 - Deepen Christ-like love

6. The Path Out of Winter

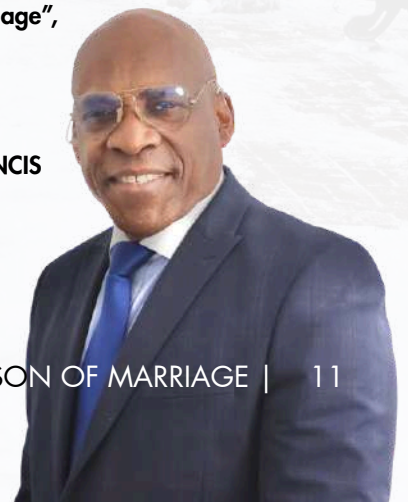
- Proactive effort
- Positive attitudes
- Honest communication
- Willingness to address past failures
- Re-engaging emotionally

Winter does not improve "by nature" on its own—intentional action is required.

CIVIL PARTNERSHIPS AND WHAT GOD HAS NOT JOINED TOGETHER

AN ARTICLE FROM THE CHRISTIAN INSTITUTE

It's 20 years since the first same-sex civil partnerships took place in the UK. The Civil Partnership Act was a landmark moment in our cultural life, paving the way for so much that has happened since.

The Act, passed under Tony Blair's Government, allowed homosexual couples to have their relationships legally recognised. It was a tool used to try to erase the differences between same-sex and opposite-sex relationships in the eyes of the public. Gay rights activists had long been campaigning for this, and it served its purpose as a stepping stone towards their greater goal: introducing same-sex marriage. Society's views were quickly reshaped by the legal recognition of civil partnerships – so much so that, just eight years later, the Coalition Government felt it was on safe ground to usher in the Marriage (Same Sex Couples) Act 2013.

While there was significant opposition to that change, the Government was unaccountable. David Cameron and his ministers decided they wanted to redefine marriage, and they did so. But such actions do not come without consequences. With nothing obvious still to campaign for legislatively, gay rights groups set about promoting radical gender ideology. For years, the UK was in the grip of radical gender ideology, and only recently have many been waking up to its evils.

Going beyond the boundaries God has given in his Word inevitably leads to more and more arbitrary laws, and consequently approval – even celebration – of sinful relationships and behaviour.

'Marriage-lite'

The Bible consistently prohibits any sexual activity outside marriage, including homosexual practice. To equate same-sex relationships to heterosexual marriage, as the Civil Partnership Act did, is a grievous sin for our nation.

When God created Adam and Eve, he gave them marriage

(Genesis 2:18-25), and the Bible clearly teaches that the only context for sexual activity is within lifelong monogamous marriage (1 Corinthians 6:9). Marriage is also the proper context for raising children. Even secular research shows that marriage is head-and-shoulders above other types of human relationships in terms of the benefits it gives both to adults and to children. The role of the State should be to recognise one-man, one-woman marriage, and to promote its benefits. Civil partnerships, even opposite-sex ones (which became available in 2019), completely dismantle the Western legal tradition whereby marriage is accorded special respect and protection. Heterosexual civil partnerships do not fill a gap in British culture. They don't present a more noble arrangement than marriage: they are 'marriage-lite'.

Marriage is God's gift

Civil partnership gives all the legal and financial rights of marriage. But the two differ in key ways.

The commitment level needed to form a civil partnership is far less than marriage. No spoken vows are required, and the parties don't undertake to commit to each other for life – one of the key criteria for a marriage bond. Sadly, marriages in England and Wales can now be severed on a 'no-fault' basis – making marriages no more binding than a mobile phone contract. But this clinical kind of dissolution is baked in to the way civil partnerships work.

The terminology of 'dissolution' does not carry the same force as 'divorce'. Civil partnerships undermine the seriousness and weight that is inherent in marriage. Marriage between a man and a woman ultimately represents Christ and the Church (Ephesians 5:21-33). It is a beautiful picture of the loving commitment that Christ displays to his people.

God has given marriage for the benefit of adults, children and society. We must pray that it is given its rightful place.

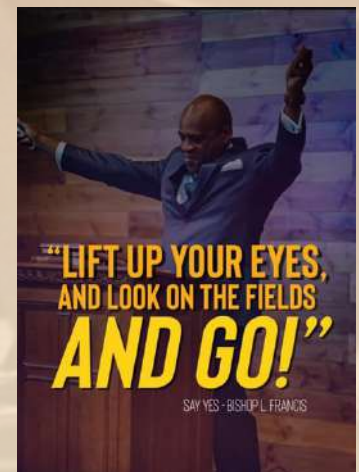
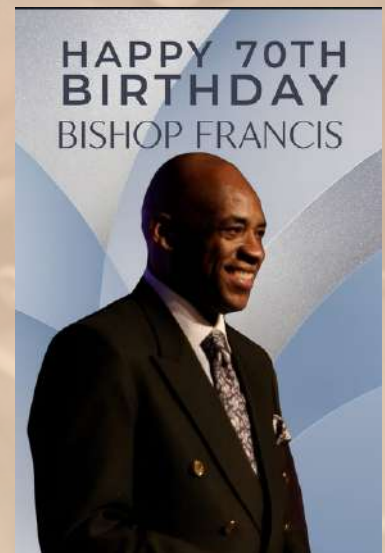

They in turn introduced ladies from their districts to share personal testimonies. There were testimonies, of praise, renewed strength, healing, and miracles. What an awesome God we serve.

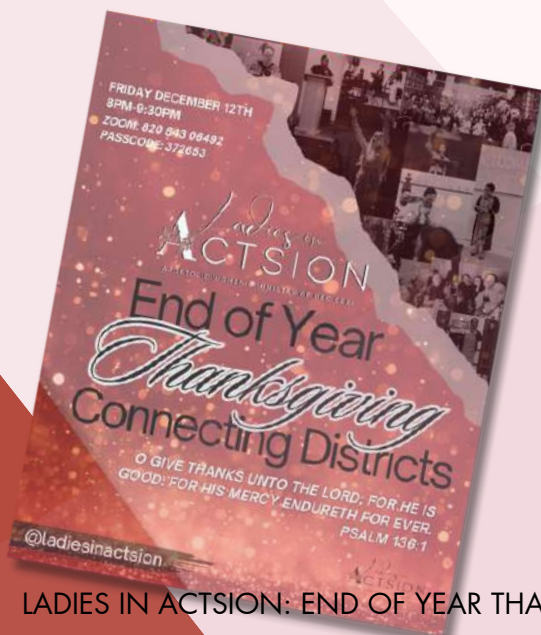

These words resonated in our spirits:

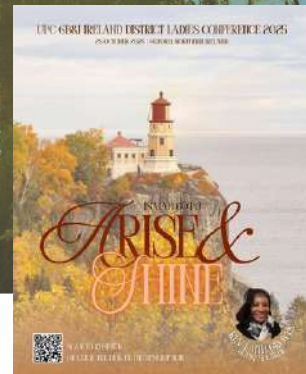
- "We are part of a spiritual house being built up"

2. **Massive Nests:** These magnificent birds construct some of the largest nests globally, with some measuring up to 10 feet in diameter and weighing as much as two tons.
3. **Life-long Mates:** Eagles form lifelong partnerships, often returning to the same nesting territories year after year after being paired.
4. **Exceptional Strength:** Their talons have a grip that is ten times stronger than that of a human, enabling them to lift small deer or calves weighing up to eight pounds.
5. **High Altitude Flight:** Eagles can soar at impressive altitudes, occasionally reaching heights of over 10,000 feet.
6. **Powerful Wingspan:** As large raptors, eagles boast a significant wingspan that allows them to glide and hunt effectively.
7. **Slow to Mature:** Bald eagles take their time to mature; they do not develop their distinctive white head and tail feathers until they are around four to six years old.
8. **Skilled Divers:** Eagles can dive at speeds reaching up to 100 miles per hour, utilizing their speed to catch prey.
9. **Varied Diet:** Although they primarily feed on fish, especially bald eagles, they also consume carrion and hunt waterfowl.
10. **Long Lifespan:** In the wild, eagles can live for 30 years or more.

LONDON & SOUTH DISTRICT MEN'S SEMINAR

GOD MADE MAN

The seminar opened with a powerful call to unity, bringing together men of all ages and backgrounds from across London and the South of England. The opening prayer set the spiritual foundation, asking for boldness to step into God's refining fire and for success in meeting God's criteria for the event.

The session emphasized the biblical principle that "iron sharpens iron". It was noted that for sharpening to occur, there must be proximity and friction; similarly, when Christian men share their journeys, the "sparks of the light of Christ" begin to fly, providing mutual encouragement.

SESSION 1: GOD MADE MAN: TO BE A FRIEND AND SUPPORT

Speaker: Bishop Anthony Banton

Key Takeaway: Fighting as One for Peace

Bishop Banton explored the necessity of Christian brotherhood, challenging the modern trend of isolation among men. He used Proverbs 18:24 to highlight that while many "friends" can lead to harm, a true brother sticks closer than a brother.

Key Pillars of Brotherhood:

- The Power of Connection: Banton urged men to move beyond surface-level interactions and engage in practical fellowship, such as sharing a meal to truly understand one another's lives.
- The Three Barriers to Growth: Using the tribes of Israel as metaphors, he identified three things men must overcome:
 - a. Nephtali (The Struggle): Stop fighting earthly circumstances or each other and focus on spiritual warfare.
 - b. Asher (The Comfort): Avoid being so content with a stable life that you refuse to grow or change.



c. Manasseh (The Past): Let go of hurtful memories and history that put the "brakes" on moving forward.

- Pursuing Peace: True peace was defined not as tranquility, but as completeness and soundness.

Bishop Banton concluded that men must be "knit together as one" to fight against chaos and disorder in their communities.

SESSION 2: GOD MADE MAN: TO BE A PROTECTOR AND PROVIDER

Speaker: Minister Richard Nathan

Key Takeaway: Repairing the Breach in Masculinity

Minister Nathan addressed the societal and economic pressures facing modern men, particularly regarding the definition of a "provider." He noted a "breach" in how masculinity is perceived today, often narrowed down solely to financial status.

Redefining the Provider:

Nathan argued that a "God-made man" provides far more than just a paycheck. He introduced several non-material "pillars" of provision:

- Affirmation: Drawing from God's affirmation of Jesus ("This is my beloved Son"), Nathan stressed that fathers have a spiritual duty to affirm their children's destiny.
- Emotional Stability: A provider must offer a "safe space" for their spouse to be vulnerable without fear of judgment.
- Spiritual Protection: Men are called to be the "midnight intercessors," engaging in spiritual warfare to ensure peace remains in the home.
- Financial Wisdom: While acknowledging economic shifts—including women often out-earning their partners—he advised men not to compete but to be responsible stewards of whatever resources they have.

SESSION 3: GOD MADE MAN: TO BE A PRIEST AND A JUDGE

Speaker: Bishop William Ellis

Key Takeaway: The Authority of the Altar

In the final session, Bishop Ellis focused on the domestic priesthood of man. He defined the "Judge" role not as a judicial one, but as the responsibility to provide wise counsel and direction to the family.

The Priesthood in Action:

- Establishing an Altar: The strength of a man is found at his "altar"—his private time in the Word and prayer.
- The Responsibility of Words: Ellis warned against the "abuse of authority" through negative speech. He explained that a father's negative words can act as a spiritual curse, and urged men to use their priestly authority to cancel past negative declarations and speak life over their children instead.
- Mediating Grace: The priest is a mediator.

Bishop Ellis encouraged men to be the first to seek help from God for their own inadequacies so they can effectively lead others.

Conclusion: A Call to Transformation

The seminar concluded with a powerful time of ministry and altar prayer. The final message was one of hope: no matter the past trauma or current struggle, the transforming power of the grace of God is available to make every man whole, sound, and complete in his calling.

"As for me and my house, we shall serve the Lord."

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What We Believe

1. The Bible - The Bible is the inspired Word of God. - 2 Timothy 3:16, 2 Peter 1:19 - 21

2. God - That God is One. That in Jesus Christ, God was manifest in the flesh; and that in Jesus dwells all the fullness of the Godhead bodily. - Exodus 20:1 - 5, Isaiah 45:5, Matthew 1:21 - 23, Colossians 2:9

3. Salvation/Baptism - We receive salvation by grace through faith in the Lord Jesus Christ. We are partakers of this salvation through obeying the Truth of the Gospel in repentance from sin, baptism in the name of Jesus Christ for the remission of sin, and by receiving the Holy Ghost with the evidence of speaking in other tongues as the spirit gives utterance. We are baptised by this one spirit into the body of Christ. - Mark 16:15-16; Ephesians 2:8, Romans 5:1; 6:1 - 6, Acts 2:38, 2 Corinthians 12:13

4. The Second Coming of Christ - In the personal and imminent return of our Lord Jesus Christ for the Church, and His personal return with His saints in the Second Advent. - Philippians. 3:20 - 21, Revelations 22:20

5. Healing - In divine healing. - James 5:14, 1 Peter 2:24, Isaiah 53:5

6. Sin - That all men are lost outside the scope of the redemptive work of Christ.- Ephesians 2:12, 13; Galatians 2:15 - 16, 5:6; Romans 3:23 - 26; 6:23, Mark 16:16

7. Communion - In observing the Lord's Supper as a memorial of His broken body and the New Testament in His Blood. - 1 Corinthians 11:23 - 26

8. Holiness - All believers must live a holy life. - Hebrews 12:14, 1 Peter 1:13 - 16. Titus 2:11 - 12, 2 Corinthians 7:1

9. Gifts & Ministries - In the nine Gifts of the Spirit being operative in the Church and in the God-given ministries of the Church - 1 Corinthians 12:1 - 11; Ephesians 4:11 - 13

10. Fruit of the Spirit - That every believer is to manifest the fruit of the Spirit in his life. - Galatians 5:22 - 23

11. Tithing - Tithing is God's financial plan for providing for His work. - Malachi 3:10, 1 Corinthians 4:2, 1 Corinthians 16:2
