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Category	Admin Assistant	Hybrid: Communications & Admin Coordinator
Core Focus	Internal support & clerical tasks	Internal support + external communications/media oversight
Administrative Tasks	Schedules meetings, manages correspondence, prepares bulletins, tracks supplies, basic recordkeeping	Same duties plus coordinating office calendar across digital platforms, ensuring branded consistency in print/digital outputs
Communications	Occasional emails, bulletin inserts	Lead for all messaging: weekly newsletter, app updates, website, social media, event promotion, Sunday slides/video announcements
Technology	Office equipment (copier, phones, printers)	Tech booth familiarity: sound board, livestream, presentation software; able to step in to run production when needed
Volunteer Coordination	Minimal (maybe greeters or office helpers)	Trains/schedules tech volunteers, supports comms volunteers (photography, social posting, etc.)
Skill Profile	Organization, clerical, Microsoft Office, detail-oriented	Expanded skill set: admin foundation + digital media, AV/livestream proficiency, branding/design awareness, communications strategy
Visibility	Behind the scenes	Forward-facing: responsible for quality and clarity of church's public presence
Impact on Worship	Provides support before/after services	Guarantees continuity of worship presentation (comms + tech) when coverage gaps appear
Typical Pay Band (church/nonprofit, 2025)	\$32k–\$40k	\$42k–\$55k (depending on scope/size/region)
Career Trajectory	Office Manager, Exec Assistant, HR Support	Comms Manager, Media Coordinator, eventually Director of Comms/Media
