UNIT 10 | SESSION 5

DAVID PLAYED FOR SAUL

1 SAMUEL 16

MAIN POINT / CHRIST CONNECTION: Jesus was a humble king. David knew God chose him to be the next king, but he still served King Saul. Jesus, the King of everything, came into the world as a servant. He gave His life and rose again so sinners can have forgiveness and be happy forever.

CATECHISM QUESTION: Q) Did our Lord Jesus Christ ever sin? A) No. He was holy, blameless, and undefiled. (Hb 7:26; Lk 23:47; I-lb 4:15; 1 Pet 2:22; 1 Jn 3:5)

MEMORY VERSE of the Month: PSALM 103:19 - "The Lord has established his throne in the heavens, and his kingdom rules over all." (ESV)

Preparation

Lesson Context

This Unit (4 weeks): In foolishness, God's people begged for a king like the nations around them. Though Israel rejected God as their king, God mercifully warned them and gave them the king they desired—King Saul. However, despite Saul's regal appearance, his foolish disobedience led to God's rejection of him as king. Instead, God replaced him with a man after His own heart to rule His people.

Prep Room | 8:50 a.m.

Fellowship & Play Time | 9:00-9:15 am

One volunteer should greet children and families at the door.

FELLOWSHIP TIME

Allow children time to engage with one another and play. Use this time to get to know your students and hear about their week. What was a good part/hard part or "yay duck"/"yuck duck" of their week?

FREE PLAY & COLORING

For free time before the lesson, ask children to come to the tables and give them the option to play or color (paper and crayons in Activity Box). Use this time to ask them questions about their week and get to know them.

TRANSITION: Give children a warning before you ask them to come to a circle

SAY "Everyone, in 5 minutes we are going to pick up our toys and gather in a circle!"

Sing the clean up song and ask children to come find a seat in the circle.

Activity | 9:15 am

REVIEW CLASSROOM RULES

Post the Rules Poster (in Activity Box) somewhere in the room.

INTRODUCE THE LESSON - MUSICAL STATUES

Invite kids to spread out around the room. Begin playing music on your phone or the Spotify app on the TV. When the music begins, invite kids to dance, walk, or act silly. Challenge kids to freeze like a statue and make a sad face when the music stops. Kids who do not freeze and make a sad face are out for the next round.

After the game, show children a video of what a lyre likely sounded and looked like: the "a song of times" video is on your classroom playlist on YouTube.

SAY Music can be such fun! When we hear music, we may want to dance, sing, or enjoy its beautiful song. Sometimes when we are sad or discouraged, music can help us feel better. Today, we will learn how King Saul became very upset by an evil spirit. But when David played music for Saul, he would feel much better. Let's learn how David served Saul.

Lesson | 9:20 am

As the children gather in a circle on the floor, let them know your expectations - that you would like them to sit quietly, keep their hands to themselves, listen to the story, etc.

1. Open the Bible & Pray

Open to 1 SAMUEL 16 in your Bible. Reverently display the open Bible.

SAY Today we are going to be in the book of **1 Samuel.** Let's listen to this true story from the Bible.

Pray quickly for your time in the Word of God.

2. Tell the Bible Story

Use the visuals (in Activity Box) if you'd like to help children follow along with the story.

DAVID PLAYED FOR SAUL

Saul was the king of Israel, but something sad happened to him. God's Spirit left Saul, and an evil spirit made him feel very bad. Saul's helpers wanted him to feel better, so they had an idea.

They said, "Let's find someone who can play music really well. When the bad spirit bothers you, the music can make you happy again!" Saul thought it was a good idea, so he told them to find a good musician.

One of the helpers said, "I know a young man named David. He's from Bethlehem, and he is very good at playing a small harp. He's brave and handsome. It seems like God is always with him!"

Saul's servants told David to come play music for him. When David played, Saul felt much better.

Saul liked David so much that he asked David to stay and help him all the time. And whenever the bad spirit came, David's music made Saul feel better.

CHRIST CONNECTION: David knew God chose him to be the next king, but he still served King Saul. Jesus, the King of everything, came into the world as a servant. He gave His life and rose again so sinners can have forgiveness and be happy forever. **Jesus was a humble king.**

3. Review the Bible Story

- What did Saul's helpers think would make him feel better? (listening to music)
- Do you remember what instrument David played? (the harp/lyre)
- Like David, Jesus served others even though he was going to be the king of the whole world! Can you recall ways that Jesus served others in the Bible?

4. Catechism Question

SAY Today we will review our new catechism question for the month:

Q) Did our Lord Jesus Christ ever sin?

A) No. He was holy, blameless, and undefiled.

Jesus was the only perfect human who ever lived. Because he was perfect and holy, Jesus could have rightly demanded that others serve him. Instead, Jesus led by example and was a humble servant to others. In humility he washed feet, touched those who were sick, was mocked and was killed on the cross for our sins.

Let's also remember our previous catechism question:

- Q) What is sin?
 - A) Sin is going our own way instead of God's way. .
- Q) What is righteousness?
 - A) It is God's goodness.
- Q) Did our Lord Jesus Christ ever sin?
 - A) No. He was holy, blameless, and undefiled.

5. Pray

Memory Verse | 9:30 am

Open your Bible to **PSALM 103:19** and lead the kids to repeat the verse several times, using hand motions if you'd like:

"The LORD has established his throne in the heavens, and his kingdom rules over all."
- PSALM 103:19

SAY: By dying on the cross and rising again, Jesus became the king of the whole world! Yet, even though he rules all things, Jesus is humble and servant-hearted.

CREATE MOTIONS OR SONG

Create motions and/or a jingle for the words of the verse. Invite children to follow along with the motions.

PLAY THE MUSIC VIDEO

Have the children repeat the verse with you several times. Then play the memory verse music video from the YouTube app on the Roku TV (YouTube account should be <u>Fellowship Kids</u> (switch accounts on the top of the left sidebar if not) > go to <u>Library</u> on the left side bar > Choose <u>Playlists</u> on the top > choose your classroom).

After the activity, invite children to sit at the tables to complete their activity pages.

Extra Activity | 9:40 am

CHOOSE HAPPY OR SAD

Gather children, and call out things that make people happy and sad. Possible options could be going to the park, eating ice cream, visiting family, falling down on your bike, losing a favorite toy, eating broccoli, making a fun craft, going to sleep, and so forth. Allow children to respond to each situation with a thumbs-up sign for something that makes them happy, and a thumbs-down sign for something that makes them sad. Retell the Bible story.

SAY Was Saul happy or sad? Yes, Saul was sad. What did David do to make Saul happy? David played his harp to make Saul happy

Dismissal | 9:45 am

As parents arrive,
