

# Let's Face It

## Materials

- ☐ Let's Face It design charts (next page)
- ☐ Dice, one for each pair of students
- ☐ Blank printer paper for each student
- ☐ Pencils or markers

## Instructions

*Print and cut apart one design chart for every pair of students. Divide students into pairs and give each pair a design chart and a die to share. Pass out pencils/markers and blank printer paper to each student. Have students draw lines or fold to divide their paper into quarters so they can draw up to four separate faces, depending on time.*

*Have pairs of students take turns rolling their die. Beginning in the first column (head shapes), they will match the die number on the chart and copy the corresponding shape onto their paper. Partners may decide if they will both use the same die number so their faces will turn out alike or if they will each roll for themselves for a different outcome. Have students continue rolling the die and drawing the corresponding shapes in each column to reveal brand-new faces.*

*They may choose to roll four times in a row for each column to complete four different faces simultaneously or complete one face at a time, working their way across the columns four times.*

## Suggested Discussion





































It was fun to draw new faces. If you didn't like the old one, you just drew a new one. In our lesson today, Paul talked about replacing the old with the new.

- ?** But did he mean for us to just look happy instead of sad by replacing a frown with a smile? What did he mean? *Allow discussion.*

Paul was writing about something deeper—a process of becoming more like Jesus called sanctification. It's more than changing our faces by putting off a frown and putting on a smile. He was telling Christians that they must change the way they think and the way they do things by taking off the old, sinful habits and putting on the new, righteous actions and attitudes. We can only do this with the help of the Holy Spirit. He dwells in us and sanctifies us by helping us think on the things above and make choices that please God.
