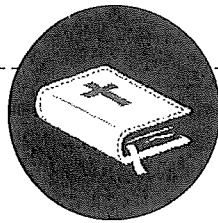

Prepare to Share

Scriptural Background

Prepare to teach by preparing your heart. Read the key passages for this lesson along with this background.

The serpent in the garden of Eden asked Eve, “Did God actually say, ‘You shall not eat of any tree in the garden?’” (Genesis 3:1). Just as Satan cast doubt on God’s Word in the very beginning, the Word of God has been questioned, denied, changed, added to, and misinterpreted throughout history.

We are called to search the Scriptures to discover the truth—to be Bereans (Acts 17:10–11). Our confidence and trust must be in God’s Word as our final

authority. The Word of God makes it clear that Scripture is what should be guiding us. Deuteronomy provides several warnings against adding to or taking from the Word of God (Deuteronomy 4:2, 12:32), as well as a test for false prophets who presume to speak in God’s name (Deuteronomy 18:20–22).

A similar warning, given in Galatians 1:6–9, says that those who preach a false gospel will be accursed. Finally, in the Bible’s final chapter (Revelation 22:18–19), we are given God’s assurance that it is complete and that it must not be changed in any way.

Historical/Apologetics Background

Tolerance—it’s a word we often hear in this culture. The attitude today is to be open-minded, accept everyone, be careful not to offend anyone, and accept all religions as equally true. If it works for you—it works! This is not an accurate understanding of tolerance, but a twisted view that comes from the post-modern mindset where people can construct their own truth. Real tolerance involves understanding the positions of others, knowing why you disagree, living alongside them, and confronting their false ideas with biblical truth.

As Christians, we are called to follow the example of Jesus Christ, who was not tolerant of false religions but stood on the truth of God’s Word (John 3:34, 14:6, 17:3).

Is the Bible the only Word of God? Be assured, God’s Word needs no proof. God begins with the presumption that he exists (Genesis 1:1) and follows up with many texts that authenticate his Word (Proverbs 30:5; Psalm 119:160; John 17:17). He does, however, warn us against succumbing to empty deceit, traditions of men, and the principles of the world that are not of Christ (Colossians 2:8).

We need to be very aware that there are many false teachings in the world today. And only God’s Word provides us with the information needed to discern them from the truth. The Bible is the only Word of God. With this in mind, let’s take a look at how some false religions blatantly deny the truth of God and the work of Jesus Christ.

The one true Word is the Bible. Believers who have gone before us have demonstrated how much the Bible meant to them. They sacrificed much to share the Word because they knew it to be the only Word of God. Consider John Wycliffe, who suffered persecution in England for translating the Scriptures into common English from the Latin translations. John Huss was burned at the stake for upholding the authority of the Word of God against the compromises

in the church. Other examples include Martin Luther and William Tyndale, who both faced persecution for defending and translating the Word of God.

These are but a few of the saints who have gone before us to preserve, protect, and provide the Word of God to the people. The Word of God cannot be changed, and around the world people are still giving up their lives to honor its integrity.

where should we look? One of you will help me with that. We're going to play Bible Pass Around. I want everyone to count with me up to the number _____. K-1st Lesson

Introduction

Turn to the Lesson 7 Flip Chart. Remember, we said that God's Word is complete!

- ? What are the two big parts of the Bible called? *Old and New Testaments.*

Yes! The Bible has two big parts. The older part that was written before Jesus was born is called the Old Testament. And the newer part that was written after Jesus was born is called the New Testament. They are both important parts of the Bible. The Old Testament and the New Testament work together to tell us all we need to know about God.

- ? Is all of God's Word true? *Yes.*

Yes, the whole Bible is true—the Old Testament and the New Testament.

- ? Will God's Word ever change? *No.*

No, God's Word will not change. God has already finished it just the way he wants it.

So we've learned that God's Word is complete; it is all true, and it will not change. That means we can trust the whole thing.

- ? *Show the completed puzzle you used in Lesson 7.* Well, today I brought back my puzzle. Is it complete? *Yes!*

Yes. It is complete. That means all the pieces are there where they should be.

We talked about how God's Word is complete, like this puzzle—there are no missing pieces. God's Word has everything in it that God wants us to know about him.

- ? *Take a piece out of the puzzle.* But what if someone took just one verse out of the Bible like I took one piece from the puzzle? What would be wrong with that? *Allow answers.*

God says his Word is already complete. We can't take even one verse out! After all, if we took things out of God's Word, we would be missing something God wants us to know, right?

- ? *Put a piece from another puzzle in the empty spot and leave it there. Okay. But what if people added their own ideas to God's Word? Like I'm adding my own piece to this puzzle. Would there be anything wrong with that? Allow answers.*

Yes! If someone tried to add to God's Word, it wouldn't be right. Just like this puzzle piece doesn't belong here—it doesn't fit, and it's different than the rest of the puzzle. God's Word is already finished and complete. Nothing should be added, and nothing should be taken away.

Don't Change God's Word

- ? This is very important. God thinks it's important, too. He warns us not to change his Word. Let's read about that. Who has the Bible? Bring it up, please. *Have the student bring up the Bible and open it to the sticky note.*

Deuteronomy 4:2

Listen to Deuteronomy 4:2. *Read the verse.*

- ? What did God say we should never do to his Word? He said two things in this verse. *Add to God's Word or take from it.*

God doesn't want anyone to add anything new to his Word or take any words away from it because it is already finished.

- ? What did God say he DOES want us to do? Listen again. *Reread the verse emphasizing "keep the commandments of the LORD your God."*
- ? God wants us to keep his commands. He wants us to obey him. And what book tells us all we need to know so we can obey God? *Hold up Bible. The Bible.*

That's right. But if people try to change the Bible, then we won't know what God's commands are, will we? So God says that no one should ever add any words or take anything away from God's Word, or they will be punished.

Proverbs 30:6

Find Proverbs and show the children. This next verse from Proverbs is also a warning from God. See if you can tell me what God is warning us about. Read Proverbs 30:6 emphasizing "Do not add to his words."

- ? What did this verse say we shouldn't do? *Add to God's words.*

That's right. This verse says that anyone who adds to God's Word is a liar and will be punished. That's serious, isn't it? God doesn't want anybody changing his Word—ever.

False Teachers Try to Change God's Word

But guess what? Sometimes people do what God said not to do. They make up their own ideas and add them to the Bible. And some people take things out of the Bible because they don't like what it says.

God tells us in his Word that these people who try to change the Bible are false teachers, which means they are lying about what God says. They say things that are not true about God, Jesus, and the Bible.

Let's play a true or false game. I am going to say some things you might have heard, and I want you to tell me if they are true or false. (Remember, false means they are not true.) So if the sentence is true, I want you to jump to your feet and say "true!" If it is false, I want you to stay in your seat and make an "x" by crossing your arms and say, "false!"

? Let's practice. Show me now, what will you do if it's true? *Students jump up and yell "true!"*

? Great! And what if it's false? *Students sit and make an "x" and yell "false!"*

? I think you're ready. Here's the first one: God created the heavens and the earth. Is that true or false? *True!*

Yes! That is true. God tells us in his Word that he created everything in just six days!

? How about this: the Bible does not tell us ALL God wants us to know about him; it only tells us a LITTLE bit. *False!*

Right! The Bible tells us ALL we need to know about God.

? What if I say the Bible has mistakes in it? Is that true or false? *False!*

Definitely false! The Bible is always true, with no mistakes.

? Here's the next one: Jesus is God's only Son. True or false? *True!*

Yes! And the Bible says Jesus is the only way to God and heaven.

? Okay. Is this true or false? God's Word is complete. *True!*

? What about this? All people love God. Is that true or false? *False!*

Not all people love God. And some people say they love God, but they don't really know who God is!

? Okay. Good job! So, how can we know what is true or false? How do we find out about God? *Hold up your Bible. By reading the Bible.*

That's right! God has given us his complete Word, the Bible, so we can know the truth and know God better from what we learn in here!

Turn to the Lesson Flip Chart. We can't add anything to God's Word. It looks like this guy has taped his own words over parts of the Bible. And then he cut out parts he didn't like. But we can't do that!

Refer to the puzzle. It's like trying to add pieces that don't belong to a puzzle or like saying the puzzle is complete when it's missing a piece.

- ? What do we need to have for a puzzle to be truly complete? *Allow discussion.*

We have to have all the right pieces in all the right places. *Take out the wrong piece and add the correct piece to complete the puzzle.*

Refer to the Flip Chart. And it's the same with God's Word. We can't take parts out, or there would be pieces missing, and we can't add in our own ideas, or there would be extra parts that don't belong.

God already put every piece in its place where it's supposed to be in his Word. God's Word and the good news about Jesus that we find in his Word can't be changed!

- ? Right. There's a piece missing. But what if someone took just one verse out of the Bible? What would be wrong with that? *Allow answers.*

We can't take even one verse out of God's Word. If we took things out of God's Word, we would be missing something God wants us to know, right?

- ? *Put a piece from another puzzle in the empty spot.* Okay. How about if I put in a piece from a different puzzle? Will that work? *Allow discussion.*

That wouldn't work right, would it? That piece doesn't belong with this puzzle. It doesn't fit.

- ? Now think about this: what if people added their own ideas to God's Word the way I added a different piece to the puzzle? Would there be anything wrong with that? *Allow answers.*

Yes! If someone tried to add to God's Word, it wouldn't be right just like this puzzle piece doesn't belong here. Nothing should be added to God's Word, and nothing should be taken away. *Leave the wrong piece in the puzzle.*

Don't Change God's Word

This is very important for us to remember. God thinks it's important, too. He warns us not to change his Word.

Deuteronomy 4:2

- ? Who has the Bible? Bring it up, please. *Have the student bring the Bible and open it to the sticky note. Read the first half of Deuteronomy 4:2: "You shall not add to the word which I command you, nor take from it."*
- ? What did God say we should never do to his Word? There are two things in that verse. *Add to God's Word or take from it.*

Right. God doesn't want anyone to add anything to his Word or take anything away from it. The Bible is already the way God wants it.

False Teachers Try to Change God's Word

But guess what? Sometimes people disobey what God says. They make up their own ideas and add them to the Bible. And some people take things out of the Bible because they don't like what it says.

God tells us that these people who try to change the Bible are called false teachers. False means something that is not true. And false teachers lie about what God says.

Refer to the wrong piece in your puzzle. Remember the puzzle? It won't be right if I add pieces that don't belong.

Take out the wrong piece. And it won't be complete if there's still a piece missing.

Add the correct piece. We have to have all the right pieces in all the right places for our puzzle to be complete.

Refer to the Flip Chart. It's the same with God's Word. We can't take parts out, or there would be pieces missing. And we can't add our own ideas, or there would be extra parts that don't belong. Many people try to change the Bible, but God doesn't like that. God already put every piece in his Word where it's supposed to be. God's Word and the good news about Jesus that we find in his Word can't be changed!
