# From the Pastor's Desk ~ The Responsibilities of Deacons

In last month's article, we examined the qualifications of deacons... what the Bible has to say about the character of the deacon. Now we will see what the scriptures teach concerning the responsibilities of deacons - what they do.

#### \*Spotting and meeting practical needs.

In Acts 6, the early church is confronted with a difficult situation. There are widows being neglected in the daily distribution of food. To address the issue, the Apostles instruct the congregation to choose seven godly men to be responsible for meeting this need. Based on this Acts 6 model, throughout church history, deacons have focused on meeting the tangible needs of the local church.

- 1. Deacons are able to spot practical needs and take the initiative to meet them . . . without being asked.
- 2. Deacons are drawn to problems; they walk toward them not around them.
- 3. The best deacons do not just react to present needs, they anticipate the future ones.

#### \*Promoting and protecting the unity of the Church.

The seven were not merely deployed to solve a food problem. Yes, the distribution of food was the occasion, but the deeper issue was a sudden threat to the unity of the newborn church. A natural fault line had developed between the Greek speaking Jews (Hellenists) and the Hebrews. The original deacons were doing much more than food distribution; they were mobilized to guard and protect the unity of the church. A deacon cannot be a turfy, small-minded person who is protective of "their territory." They must be individuals who care about the whole church while addressing needs in a specific area.

Pastor's Desk continued . . .

1. Deacons should be shock-absorbers; those who muffle shockwaves, not reverberate them.

- 2. Deacons have a vision for the overall well-being of the church not just their territory.
- 3. Deacons are peacemakers, eager to maintain the unity of the church.

#### \*Enable the elders to focus on the ministry of the Word.

It is not an accident that Paul, after first addressing pastors in I Timothy 3:1-7, immediately turns his attention to deacons in I Timothey 3: 8-13. The structure of the text suggests that the elders and deacons are working together as a team. The elders shepherding, preaching, providing oversight and the deacons, supporting them and the ministry of the Word as they meet the physical needs of the church.


Notice what Luke records in Acts 6:7, after the church appoints deacons, "And the word of God continued to increase, and the number of disciples multiplied greatly in Jerusalem, and a great many of the priests became obedient to the faith." With the deacons taking care of the tangible needs within the church family, the apostles were able to focus on the ministry of the Word and prayer. Teamwork!

- 1. A church without biblically functioning deacons will eventually lose focus and be distracted from its central mission of making disciples.
- 2. A church without deacons may demonstrate signs of health for a season, but over time its health will suffer.
- 3. Deacons are team players . . . knowing that as they joyfully accomplish their responsibilities, they enable the elders to joyfully focus on the Word and prayer.

Please continue to join us in prayer as we ask God to guide us through this transition toward elders and deacons at Suburban.

# Ambassador Youth Ministry Let's Talk About It: God's Love For Us Will Not Change

Have you ever doubted God's love for you? While we may hesitate to answer that question, all of us can acknowledge that at some point we have. A situation went in a direction we did not want it to, an unforeseen circumstance sideswiped us, or a relationship turned sour and left us heartbroken. After the initial shockwave passed and we got back up on our feet, we turned our sights to God and began to question him.

"God if you really loved me, you would not have let this happen!" "God if you really cared about me, you would have done it this way!" Do you see yourself there? I know I have questioned God in this way before. This sinful doubt is not where any of us want to be. We know that questioning God in this way is wrong, Scripture makes that clear (Ex. 17:1–7). Why then do we question God's love and goodness towards us?

There are a few reasons to keep in mind. First, on this side of eternity we still wrestle with the flesh. Though we are now in Christ, we have yet to be glorified. This means that we are still prone to sin and will be until our Lord returns (Rev. 21:3–4). Second, we have a real enemy whose desire is to lead us to doubt God. Satan does everything he can to place lies about God's love before us, hoping that we will sin by taking the bait (John 8:44). Third, the world we live in advertises a false sense of love and goodness, which can influence our perception of what they are to look like (Rom. 12:2).

When God brings something in our life and we cannot comprehend why he did so, we can be sure that the world, Satan, and the flesh will war against our trust in God's love and goodness. How then do we engage in this kind of battle and come out on the other side confident in God's love rather than doubting it? We rest in the truth that our God is immutable.

#### God is Immutable

To say that God is immutable is to say that God is unchanging. God has always been who he always will be. He is the "I AM" who eternally remains the same (Ex 3:14). This is one of the attributes of God that distinguishes him from creation. We ourselves change and we do so quite often. We adapt to new environments, we experience things for the first time, we grow older, and we fluctuate between our emotions. It is creation that changes, our Creator does not.

James 1:17 teaches us this truth by saying, "Every good gift and every perfect gift is from above, coming down from the Father of lights, with whom there is no variation or shadow due to change." The stars in the sky may fade and alter, but with God there is no variation. Put another way the writer of Hebrews says, "Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and forever" (Heb. 13:8). Always and forever our God is the same.

Since God always remains who he is, his promises are unchanging as well. In other words, the promises of God overflow from his immutable nature and character. What he says he will keep because he does not change. Where mankind goes back on their word, God keeps his. "God is not man, that he should lie, or a son of man, that he should change his mind. Has he said, and will he not do it? Or has he spoken, and will he not fulfill it?" (Nm. 23:19).

What is clear is that God himself and his promises are unchanging. These truths however are not simply theological observations but are anchors which secure us when times of doubt arise. Because we are in Christ, we possess all the promises of God that he has given us (2 Cor. 1:20). One of those promises being that his love for us will never change.

When you are tempted to question God's love and goodness towards you because of difficult circumstances or overwhelming emotions, call to mind these immutable promises that have been given to you from our immutable God.

- God's love for you is immeasurable (Ps. 103:11).
- Because God loves you, none will take you away from him and he will raise you up on the last day (John 6:37–40).
- In love, God saved you from your sin and reconciled you to himself (Rm. 5:8–11).
- Nothing can separate you from the love of God in Christ (Rm. 8:35–39).
- In love, God predestined you to be adopted into his family (Eph. 1:5).
- In love, God made you alive with Christ and seated you with him in the heavenly places (Eph. 2:4).
- In love, Christ gave himself up for you so that you are now accepted before God (Eph. 5:2).
- Because God loves you, he will keep you from falling away (Philip. 1:6, Jude 24).
- In love, God sent his Son to take on the full punishment for your sin so that you are no longer guilty but forgiven (1 John 4:10).
- Because God loves you, he will take away all your pain and replace it with eternal joy (Rev. 21:4).

These are wonderful promises to meditate on when we are tempted to doubt God's love and goodness. There is however one more vital truth that we need to keep in mind which holds all these promises tightly together. It is this, "God is love" (1 John 4:8). God does not merely possess love, but he himself is love. Love is God's very nature.

When we know that God is immutable, then we see something even more beautiful about our Lord. He will always act towards us in love because he is love. God will not act towards us in an unloving way, because he would have to change who he is to do so. This means that when God brings something in our life and we cannot fully understand why, what we can know is that he has done so out of his unchanging love for us.

Difficulties in this life will arise and hardships will abound. During these times is where doubt about God and his ways begin to grow. When this occurs, we do not have to listen to the doubts for we possess a firm foundation that can silence them. Our God is love, he has promised that his love for us will remain, and he will not change who he is or what he has said. May we drink from these waters and find rest for our souls in these truths.

Please keep the Sunday School program in your prayers. Pray that Promotion Sunday, in September, goes smoothly. Laura Tyler








## Vacation Bible School ~ Joseph's Journey 2025

In just 4 days, the kids got to see Joseph in prison where he stayed faithful to God because he knew God would turn his bad situation into good. They were quite surprised to see the next day that Joseph had been made Pharoah's number 2 because God gave him the special ability to interpret dreams. On day three we learned that God gives us forgiveness and that's what Joseph gave to his brothers. Joseph's family coming to Egypt to be with him was the focus of the last day because God gives us a family. Our earthly families may look different but because we have hope and faith in Jesus, we are all one family under God!



Each night we had thirty-two kids fill the sanctuary with their singing and praising the one true God. They saw God in their everyday lives and acknowledged them on our God sightings wall. 

#### Children's Church News

Just for ... Subur During the month of August in Children's Church, we will learn that John the Baptist has been

preparing the way for the Messiah and there are some people who are not happy about his message. Even King Herod liked to hear John preach about Jesus, but he didn't want to hear about Jesus as the "King" of God's

people and how John confronted him about his sin. So, he captured John and locked him in prison. The king's wicked wife had plans of deceit and John ended up being killed. WOW! The BIG TRUTH about this true story is "We need faith to believe Jesus wins- even when it looks like bad guys are winning."

In Mark 6, we will learn about The Happy Meal That Kept on Going. I don't know about you, but sometimes I love a Happy Meal (and the cute prize included)! I'm sure Pastor Todd would love an endless supply of pizza, but not me! This story tells us about how Jesus provided food to a HUGE crowd of people when he only had five small barley loaves and two small fish. Jesus multiplied that small amount to feed at least 5,000 people and they had twelve baskets of bread left! Jesus does supply us with what we need, but he is also the Bread of Life. He says in John 6:35, "I am the bread of life; whoever comes to me shall not hunger, and whoever believes in me shall never thirst." Have you come to him for eternal life?

After this happens, Jesus needed a break because he was exhausted. He needed physical and spiritual rest. He went to a place where he could be alone, where he could pray to his Heavenly Father. When he had been refreshed, he began his journey back by way of the seashore. A terrible storm arose which caused the boat the disciples were in to be tossed. Jesus came walking to them on the water. Yes, that's right. Jesus was walking on the water! This scared the disciples, but Jesus told them not to be afraid. Peter said, "If it's really you, command me to come to you on the water." Peter got out of the boat, and he started to walk on the water, just like Jesus! But suddenly, Peter took his eyes off Jesus and saw the fierce wind and storm and started sinking. He cried out to Jesus to save him. Jesus reached out, grabbed him, and brought him onto the boat. Jesus asked Peter, "why did you doubt: You should have kept believing." What a good lesson for us to learn too: keep on believing – even when you see the big waves. Jesus then caused the storm to cease. The disciples fell at Jesus' feet and confessed, "You really are the Son of God" (Matthew 14:33). BIG TRUTH: Because Jesus is the Son of God, he can save us when we cry out to him.

Jesus loves everyone. He had spent most of his time in the promised land teaching and healing the Jews. He decided he wanted to share his love with people outside the promised land. These people were Gentiles. As he entered this region, a Gentile woman came to him and asked Jesus to help her daughter who was possessed by a demon. After speaking with Jesus, she said, "I may be a Gentile, but I trust you will have mercy on me too." She had faith in who Jesus was and that He could save her daughter. Jesus has come to love and save both Jews and Gentiles. He doesn't save us because of how worthy we are; he saves us when we realize we are low and needy. BIG TRUTH: Jesus saves anyone who believes in him.

Throughout the next few months, we will continue in the Gospel truths of the New Testament. Here we meet - in the flesh - the long-awaited Prophet, Priest, and King. The Biggest Story Curriculum is designed to help children understand God's plan to redeem the world through his Son, Jesus, by leading them through the overarching story of the Bible.

As our children head back to school, let's join in prayer that they will show the love of Jesus to their friends and teachers. wh
