From the Pastor's Desk ~ What Do Church Members Do?

We have finally made it! In these last 6 months, we have seen what the Bible has to say about Elders (who they are and what they do), Deacons (who they are and what they do), and church members (who they are and, in this article, what they do). The church is not a man-inspired, man-designed entity. The church has been planned by God from eternity past and created through the work of Christ and his Spirit. Christ is the head of the church; he is our authority and source of life. We exist because of Christ and for the glory of Christ. So, as followers of Christ, what are church members to do?

I. EVER LEARNING ABOUT CHRIST

- *Acts 2:42 "And they devoted themselves to the apostles teaching."
- *II Peter 3:18 "Grow in the grace and knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ."
- *Acts 5:42 "And every day, in the temple and from house to house, they did not cease teaching and preaching that the Christ is Jesus."

Praise God, he has revealed himself to us in his Word. He has revealed that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of the Living God and that there is salvation ONLY in his name. Yes, the love of Christ surpasses knowledge (Ephesians 3:19) but by his grace, through the help of the Holy Spirit, we can grow in the knowledge of Christ. Church members will ever be learning about the person and work of Jesus Christ.

II. EVER - WORSHIPPING CHRIST

- *Revelation 5:11,12 "Then I looked, and I heard around the throne and the living creatures and the elders the voice of many angels, numbering myriads of myriads and thousands of thousands, saying with a loud voice, "Worthy is the Lamb who was slain, to receive power and wealth and wisdom and might and honor and glory and blessing."
- *Romans 12:1 "I appeal to you brothers by the mercies of God, to present your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God, which is your spiritual worship."

Just as the church in heaven gathers to worship the Lamb who was slain, the church on earth gathers weekly to worship Christ through hearing God's Word preached, through singing praises to him and through remembering Christ's sacrifice by partaking of communion. But worship is not confined to church on Sunday. We are to worship Christ 24/7 as we daily offer every area of our lives in loving devotion and obedience to him..

III. EVER CARING AND SERVING LIKE CHRIST

- *John 13:34 "A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another: just as I have loved you, you also are to love one another."
- *Hebrews 3:13 "But exhort one another every day, as long as it is called "today," that none of you may be hardened by the deceitfulness of sin."
- *I Peter 4:10 "As each has received a gift, use it to serve one another, as good stewards of God's varied grace."

Jesus Christ came because He loved us, and He calls us to love one another with that same quality of love. Jesus came, not to be served but to serve and then he calls us to serve one another; to have his "servant's mind" that focuses on the needs of others. Today it seems that the consumer mindset of "what can you do for me" has infiltrated the church. May the loving and serving heart of Christ grow in us!

IV. EVER SHARING CHRIST

- *Matthew 28:18-20 "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age."
- *I Peter 2:9 "But you are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, a people for his own possession, that you may proclaim the excellencies of him who called you out of darkness into his marvelous light."

Christ left heaven and came to earth. He came to us. He walked among us. He engaged the people of Israel with the good news that he is the Savior. He pursued the woman at the well, he engaged her with the gospel. He saved her. He called Zacchaeus down from the tree, invited himself to his home and saved Zacchaeus from his sin. Christ calls us to go, to engage, to proclaim the excellencies of him who redeemed us by his blood. God the Holy Spirit will empower us to share the gospel with boldness (Acts 4:31).

There is certainly more to say concerning what church members are to do, but these are the areas consistently emphasized through the New Testament... ever learning about Christ, ever worshipping Christ, ever caring and serving like Christ, and ever sharing Christ! And as we continue to practice these, God has promised that he will ever-conform us into the image of Christ (Romans 8:29).







Children's Church News



Throughout the Gospels, we read about people coming to Jesus – a leper, large crowds, a paralyzed man – just to name a few. Parents brought their children to Jesus hoping he would give them a special blessing. As we all know, children bring a different dynamic to any situation. This did not bother Jesus AT ALL! But it did bother the disciples. When Jesus saw the response of the disciples, Scripture says, "he was indignant." (Mark 10:14) Indignant means angry, upset, or furious.

Why was Jesus upset? There were two reasons: (1) Jesus welcomed children to be part of his kingdom, and (2) everyone (even adults) needs to be like a child to be part of the kingdom. Mark 10:14-15 says, "Let the children come to me . . . for to such belongs the kingdom of God. Truly, I say to you, whoever does not receive the kingdom of God like a child shall not enter it." Jesus did not mean everyone should act like selfish, spoiled children crying for candy at the supermarket. Rather, he meant that we should come to Jesus knowing that we are small, helpless, weak (like a newborn baby), and in need of him. The gospel is for everyone in the world. When we do come to him, he will take us in his arms and bless us. wh
