What is in a Name?

Saints at St. Paul.

Isaiah 9:6 states. "For to us a child is born, to us a son is given; and the government shall be upon his shoulder, and his name shall be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace." "The name of Jesus is above all names," Philippians 2:9. So what is in a

name?

My brother's name is Michael, and he served for 20 years in the USAF as a Physician Assistant. In one tour he served in RAF Menwith Hill, England. When people heard his last name (Shipman), they would invariably ask, "Are you related to Harold Shipman." When he first heard the question, he didn't know who Harold Shipman was, but after a quick internet search he found out that Harold was a prolific serial killer. After a brief time, and this question being asked of him almost daily, he started to say, "Do you mean Uncle Harold?" This comment was meant to inspire

laughter, but it usually in-

spired fear. When vour name is spoken, what

> does it inspire? Laughter, fear or respect? What is in

a name?

Thomas Paine was a founding father, inventor and a philosopher. He stated, "Reputation is

what men and women think of us: character is what God and angels know of us." If there is a large disconnect in this understanding from reputation to character, I ask that you pray for God to inspire your life and the name you bear. Al Kirchoff said that his name was a burden, and that he felt he needed to live up to expectations. I celebrate his comment because there are people who cannot see the importance of their name and

live a life without integrity.

honest, fair, and faithful. He served on various boards in central Wisconsin, and he lived his life knowing he made a difference. In his final years of life, a fencing company took advantage of his medical condition and erected a fence that was much dif-

> ferent than that which was advertised. His son spoke with him about the shoddy workmanship and the lies in advertising. His son told

him to stop payment on the check. Marvin stated, "Please don't take that action for it is my name and my reputation that are on the line when I signed that document to erect that fence. They have to live with their shame."

When the name, "St. Paul Ev. Lutheran Church," is spoken in our community, what do people hear? Do you speak our name at all? I have been approached by so many people with words of thanks and praise about all we are accomplishing and few people with negativity and anger.

Adam's Advice Hub (AHH)

People of St. Paul, Do you have a difficult time hearing people or

shows? Did you know your iPhone can help you hear more clearly in group settings-

especially when there's no microphone or sound system in place? Live Listen is a built-in feature on iPhones that will

allow you to use your phone as a



remote microphone, sending sound directly to your AirPods, select Beats earbuds, or Made for iPhone (MFi) hearing aids. It can be incredibly

helpful during meetings, Bible studies, or even worship settings where the speaker is a bit hard to hear.

Here's how to turn it on:

Make sure your earbuds or hearing aids are connected via Bluetooth.

Go to Settings > Control Center. Scroll down and tap the green plus (+) next to "Hearing" to add it to your Control Center.


Open Control Center (swipe down from the top-right corner of the screen). Tap the ear icon and select Live Listen.

You can now place your phone closer to the speaker, and it will pick up the audio and transmit it to your

earbuds-letting you listen from across the room (within Bluetooth range). Different earbud models vary in how far they can stay connected.

As our devices continue to evolve, they offer more tools for accessibility, communication,
