#### **Eyes to See**

People of God at Saint Paul,

We read in the book of

Mark 10:48-50 about a blind man named Bartimaeus shouting out to Jesus. This person of God

wants to see the world differently and his voice carries his request above those who tell him to be silent. Jesus stood still and said, 'Call him here.' And they called the blind man, saying to him, "Take heart; get up, he is calling you." There is blindness and ignorance all around and Jesus is calling you to take heart.

Close your eyes... and see the darkness. Pause for a moment and see the darkness and consider how important your ability to see is in this life. When a survey asked, "What is the most important of the five senses?" 77% of people said their sight. How many people do you know that can see but have no vision? Or have a heart and have no compassion?

My great grandfather was blind, and my father spoke of how he was his grandfather's seeing eye time. It was the first time boy. My great grandfather's he saw the boy, now 6-7 blindness was the result of cataracts that slowly took time. It was the first time he saw the boy, now 6-7 years old, who had been companion for years, which who had been companion for years, which which

away his vision. My father led his grandfather around to the places he needed to go on the farm. This experience/

expression wasn't derogatory... it was necessary. My father and his grandfather became inseparable because they depended on each other. My father led him to the outhouse, and to his chair, to the closet to get clothes and on a walk for exercise. My father heard stories, jokes, silence and the warmth of a loving hand that appreciated the gift of family. When surgery became available in rural central Wis-

rural central Wisconsin, my great grandfather was tentative and yet he went forward with the procedure to remove

the cataract. The doctor scheduled one to be removed and a later date to remove the second. When the first cataract was removed, my greatgrandfather was able to see for the first time in a long

time. It was the first time years old, who had been his companion for years, who had led him around and kept him from harm. The boy who he depended on for his life was no longer needed in that capacity because his eye was truly open to the world, its colors, and beauty. Their connection was never really severed because of the life, the stories, the laughter and the insights they shared. The doctor scheduled the next operation and my grandfather said with vision, "One eye is enough, and I am blessed to be able to see God's creation again."

When vision is taken away...it is a blessing when it is restored. In October we gathered in the presence of God and had our Annu-

> al Meeting, and we set our sights on the future we desire. Let us take heart, cast away

blindness and ignorance, so our desire will be that everyone will know and understand the hope proclaimed in welcome/belonging. So, they too may take heart and give thanks when they journey into this sacred

Have you ever noticed how certain not mean the most popular post or

posts online seem designed to make you angry or worried? That is not an accident. It is part of how the modern digital world works.



Social media platforms and news

sites use algorithms (computer programs that decide what you see first) to keep your attention as long as possible. These algorithms study what makes people click, comment, or share. And studies show that engagement is highest when content sparks strong emotions, especially anger or fear.

The result? Posts that stir outrage or anxiety often surface to the top of our feeds, while calm, thoughtful voices are buried below. This does

influencer is the most truthful one, it just means they have mastered the art of getting reactions.

Think about how news programs become the mostwatched in our country. Its popularity does not automatically mean it provides the most balanced or accurate

reporting. The same principle ap-


plies to the internet: popularity is not proof of truth.

As Christians, we are called to be discerning. Scripture tells us to be "quick to listen, slow to speak, and slow to become angry" (James

1:19). When we feel our negative emotions growing by what we see online, that is the perfect time to pause, pray, and seek truth before reacting or sharing. The digital world re-

wards outrage, but God calls us to peace. patience, and wisdom. Let us be people who resist being swept along by the algorithm and instead stav rooted in Christ, who
