Genesis 3:1-24

1. What is this passage about?

- After summarizing what you have just read, consider asking what comes before this passage, and what happens afterwards.
- What makes this passage significant?
- What truths does this passage establish that affect how we read the rest of Scripture?

2. How does it apply to me?

1. Did God give Adam and Eve freedom of choice? Why? (see 1:26). Do we as men still possess that freedom of choice?
2. What lies or half-truths do you spot in the serpent's initial question to Eve? Do temptations still begin in the form of a question?
3. What is deceptive about the serpent's reply to Eve in 3:4? How does this reply sow seeds of doubt about God's character?
4. Eve perhaps mentally justifies her disobedience in 3:6 before carrying it out. How do we as men do the same?
5. What is the problem with Adam's passivity in 3:6? What does this say about our nature as men?
6. In 3:7 after realizing that they are naked, with their eyes now opened, Adam and Eve attempt to cover up their nakedness with makeshift clothing. After you realize your sin are you ever tempted to try to cover it up?
7. Adam and Eve attempted to hide from God. After realizing that you have sinned do you ever hide from God, by going a few days without praying or avoiding church?
8. Instead of admitting his sin outright, Adam attempts a blame shift in 3:12. Who does Adam ultimately blame? (read it closely!)
9. What are the consequences for Adam and Eve's sin? How does this apply to us now? What does it mean to live in a fallen world?
10. How does God still show compassion for Adam and Eve (3:21)?
