Mexico Mission Trip Report - Casas por Cristo

We had 18 individuals join us on our trip to Acuna, Mexico to build a house this year. Four people joined us from Kansas and they were a blessing to our group. The team was so well-balanced. We had several people experienced in construction, four fluent Spanish speakers, and some were new to the whole experience, but quickly learned and got busy doing what needed to be done. We were able to complete the house in less than three days. Our own Dominic Esparza who is interning with Casas por Cristo was an excellent leader. It was a different experience than what we have had in Juarez. We were not in town, but out in the country. The family we built for, the Raul Cassio HDZ family, has 8 dairy cows that they milk twice daily and deliver the milk to their customers. They make around \$130 a week. They are a couple

raising their granddaughter and have been living with relatives for a few years while they bought their land (it took them 3 years) and waited another 2 years for their house to be built. The house is a real blessing to this family, but more importantly, we were able to show them the love of Christ with our hands and voices. It was wonderful so many were able to converse with Nancy. She also helped in various ways working alongside us. Please keep praying for this family to come to a saving faith in Jesus. Thank you for your prayers and financial support for this mission trip.
