Dear Families,

We are so thankful you have a copy of the Geyer Catechism. As parents, we are mandated by the Lord to disciple our children (Deuteronomy 6:4-9). In the *Truth and Grace Memory Book* Volume 1, Tom Ascol writes, "Teaching their children the Word of God is at the forefront of responsibilities for Christian parents. God specifically calls Christian parents to raise their children 'in the discipline and instruction of the Lord' (Ephesians 6:4). You cannot be passive and fulfill this responsibility to 'bring them up' in the proper way. Prayer, discipline, godly example, and consistent, continuous, clear instruction are required" (pg. 13). The discipleship of our children cannot be subcontracted out to the church. We must be instructing our children from the Word of God at home.

An effective strategy to help us disciple our children at home is catechisms. The word *catechize* simply means to teach. Donald Whitney writes in *Family Worship*, "catechizing is a question-and-answer approach to teaching biblical doctrine" (pg. 48). There are trusted catechisms that have been utilized in church history.



If you have catechized your children, the Geyer Catechism will be very basic. Why? Because the purpose of the Geyer Catechism is to provide parents with a starting place. It is an introductory catechism. For example, there are catechisms that contain over 100 questions, answers of varying lengths, and several Bible verses. The Geyer Catechism consists of only 30 questions, short answers, and a few Bible verses that introduce the fundamentals of the faith. It is designed to be completed over the period of one month. This means that you will be doing one question per day for the month. It is like a catechism with training wheels!

When you complete the Geyer Catechism, there are many options for you to consider going forward. The Geyer Catechism could be repeated for reinforcement. You could, however, graduate your children to another catechism. A Catechism for Boys and Girls is an excellent resource to consider implementing into your home. It is much more substantial in content, which will take your family to the next levels of learning. There are also recommended family devotional guides/booklets available for your review in the Family Resource Hub.



Here are some principles to help you catechize your children. These practical steps also apply to other areas of family discipleship:

Scriptural: The resources in your home must be grounded in the Word of God. A good catechism helps you provide solid biblical instruction.

Scheduled: You must prioritize time in the Word of God as a family. It will not happen by accident. Choose a time that works best for your family (after dinner, before bed, etc.). The reality is that you will miss days. When you miss days, the key is picking up right where you left off. This will create consistency which establishes a rhythm of discipleship in your home.

Structured: It is important to have a plan without being too rigid. This could include prayer, singing, Bible reading, and, of course, catechisms. As it has been referenced, catechisms include questions, answers, and Bible verses. You can begin by asking your children a question. Lead and guide them to get the right answer. Repeat the question. Grab your Bibles and look up the verse(s). Display the question of the day somewhere visible in the house. Choose a few verses from the catechism to memorize. There is so much that you can do! As you progress through the catechism, return to the previous days and ask the questions again.



Simple: The simpler your format, the better. There is no need to overcomplicate this. You do not need to be a pastor, a scholar, or a professor. You just need a desire to lead your family in the Lord.

Short: The length of family devotionals will vary depending upon the age of your children. There are times that will be shorter, others longer, and many somewhere in the middle. Regardless, do not try to fill a specific slot of time. Think quality of time, not the quantity of it.

Share: Share the participation of this time with your children. For example, allow your children to ask you the catechism questions, read Scripture, or pray.

Special: If you finish the Geyer Catechism with your children, do something special at the end of the month. Take your children to the park or for ice cream. This will be a motivator for your children. Of course, do not place the focus on it being a reward for doing "spiritual things." It is really more of a time to celebrate something special your family has completed together. Plus, your children will enjoy the time with you more than the swings or the sundae!

Psalm 78:4 says, "We will not hide them from their children, but tell to the coming generation the glorious deeds of the Lord, and His might, and the wonders that He has done." May the Lord bless you as you seek to proclaim His Word to the next generation through your children.



Question: Where can you learn to know God?

Answer: Only in the Bible.

Answer: Fully man and fully God.
