How does Paul's commitment to 'declare the whole will of God' challenge our approach to sharing our faith? In what ways might we be tempted to present a partial or watered-down version of the gospel?

The sermon mentions the concept of 'earnestly seeking God'. What does this look like in practical terms, and how might it differ from casual or intermittent spiritual practices?

How does the image of building blocks relate to spiritual growth? What 'blocks' have been foundational in your own faith journey?

The pastor discusses the idea of being 'worldly Christians'. How do we balance being 'in the world but not of it', especially in today's culture?

What does it mean to be part of the 'bride of Christ', and how should this identity shape our daily lives and decisions?

The sermon touches on the concept of God rewarding those who seek Him. How does this idea sit with you, and how might it motivate or challenge your faith?

How do you interpret Jesus' strong words about 'hating' family in Luke 14? What might this mean in the context of discipleship?

The pastor mentions the narrow and broad ways from Jesus' teachings. How do you see this playing out in modern Christianity?

What does it mean to 'build with care' on the foundation of Christ, as mentioned in 1 Corinthians 3? How might this apply to different areas of life?

How does the idea of our works being tested by fire (1 Corinthians 3:13-15) impact your perspective on your actions and priorities?
