

## 11-16-25 Discussion Questions

What specific things in your life tend to distract you from your primary calling to follow Jesus, and how can you recognize when you've taken your eyes off that goal?

The pastor emphasized that our job is not just to be saved but to follow Christ continuously. How does this shift in perspective change the way you approach your daily walk with God?

Peter told the religious leaders 'we cannot help speaking about what we have seen and heard' regarding Jesus. What would need to change in your life for you to reach that point of being unable to stop talking about Jesus?

The sermon illustrated how easy it is to get busy doing church activities while forgetting Jesus is the primary focus. Are there areas where you've substituted religious activity for genuine relationship with Christ?

When was the last time you thanked God for a difficult circumstance, and what does your answer reveal about your spiritual maturity?

The rich young ruler walked away from Jesus because he wasn't willing to surrender his wealth. What is Jesus asking you to give up that you've been unwilling to surrender?

Peter performed a miracle by telling a crippled man to walk in Jesus' name, stepping out in bold faith. What might God be calling you to do that seems impossible without complete dependence on Him?

The pastor asked if there's anything that gets between you and hearing Christ's voice. What barriers have you erected that prevent you from clearly following Jesus?

If salvation is found in no one else but Jesus, how should that exclusivity shape the urgency with which we share the gospel with those around us?

The early disciples faced threats of death yet refused to stop speaking about Jesus. What fears hold you back from being a bold witness, and how do those fears compare to the persecution they faced?
