- 1. Conclusions: The Biblical Implications of Isaiah's Messag? The Servant and His Rival?
 - a. Humanity ...
 - i. ...was create in the *şélem* ("image") of God (Gen. 1:26-27)
 - ii. ...rebelled and made their gods pésel in their own image (1 Kings 14:9)
 - iii. ...became as blind and deaf as the idols (*pésel*) they had crafted (Isaiah 44:18-19)
 - b. Jesus is ...
 - i. ..."the **image** of the invisible God" (Colossians 1:15)
 - ii. ..."the exact representation" of God's being (Hebrews 1:3)
 - iii. ...the one who repairs the **image** in us, making us new creations (2 Corinthians 5:17)
 - iv. ...the one to whose **image** we are being conformed (Romans 8:29), and the **new self** into which we are being transformed (Colossians 3:9-10)
 - v. In Christ we are restored to our God-ordained role as the image-bearers of the Almighty.
